New York State Scholastic Track in this 1970 edition has several features and photographs designed to add depth to its comprehensive statistical compilations.

Among the features is a special review of the decade, which traces some of the developments that marked the structure and performances of scholastic track during the sixties.

The statistics that dominated the '66 and '68 editions have not been reduced at all, despite the addition of much feature material. There are all-time performers lists, 50 deep outdoors and 20 deep indoors. The '69 outdoor lists--which considered all marks made during the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1968 and August 31, 1969--extend 20 deep. Indoors, the top 10 are listed.

Also included are national and state class marks--the best outdoor performances made by athletes while competing as freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors. Such athletes are considered to be juniors, for example, until the 1st of September prior to their senior year.

There are national, state and league records, indoors and outdoors.

Furthermore, for purposes of maximum completeness, no performances have been excluded because of type of meet, form of competition or placing in an event. In cases in which anemometers were not in use during sprints, hurdles and horizontal jumps, decisions concerning wind velocity were made on the basis of reliable reports by seasoned correspondents.

Some performances were tailored to abide by international rules. All marks recorded in races of more than one mile were rounded off to the nearest fifth slower than the actual clocking (a 9:32.3 two-mile becomes 9:32.4). All fractions in distances over 100 feet--which pertain specifically to the discus, javelin and hammer--were eliminated. All other field performances, with fractions in eighths, were reduced to the nearest quarter below the actual mark. An exception is made when there is a conversion from meters to feet; in this case the eighths remained, as in the State indoor high jump record of 6-11 1/8.

On all of the listings the athlete's school is followed by its location. If there is no location listed, then the names of the school and location are identical.

Located below some of the records and performers lists are additions and changes. This was caused by late receipt of pertinent information that could not be placed among statistics that were already prepared for printing.

Often used are the following abbreviations: n--non-winning performance; h--heat; m--meters; *--junior; **--sophomore; ***--freshman.

New York State Scholastic Track is immensely grateful for the voluntary assistance of scores of sports writers and editors, photographers, coaches, track officials, athletes and track nuts who comprise the unofficial "staff" of this publication. Without their aid this 1970 edition could not have been published.

Consistent champions dominate season

NYSST/1969 Review

Consistency with quality is sought by many and attained by few. On the scholastic track level it is not unique, but certainly not commonplace--except during 1969.

A diary of the past season would read like a series of unbeaten streaks as New York's leading athletes handled the competitive grind with drill-like efficiency. Week and week, in all sectors of the state, meets were marked by victorious "favorites" toting home awards to their already crowded trophy cases. Moreover, their performances--and performances in general--were characterized by the usual improvements; however, the record-breaking that had marked previous years subsided substantially.

The short sprints were paced by a squat senior from Baldwin and a slender junior from Mt. Vernon. Don Christianson and Bill Collins, both of whom ran undefeated in their respective Long Island and Westchester areas--until they raced each other--for the bulk of the season. At the State Meet in Schenectady Collins defeated Christianson by inches. Both were timed in 9.9. This victory, together with Bill's class record-equaling 9.6, placed Collins as New York's top sprinter.

Seventeen runner bested 10 flat in the 100, average for this sometimes mediocre sprinting area.


Collins' 21.7 220t, one tenth swifter than Christianson, boosted his status. Don Brown, junior from Christian Brothers in Syracuse, topped the straight 220 with a 21.4, nipping Larry Brown of Boys(Brooklyn), who did 21.5 on a dirt surface after a 21.2h(same track) that was marred by a no smoke decision.

Some excellent wind-aided sprint times were posted. Junior Chris Schlauch (Carey, Franklin Squ) clocked 9.5 and Christianson had a pair of 9.6s in addition to a very questionable 9.5--one timer in a dual meet. Bernie Hrubala (Oceanside) ran a windy 21.0 in the 220s.

A weak 440 was given encouragement by soph Jim Redd(Hamilton, Elmsford), who may be thrust into national ranking before graduation. A 48.1 in his Sectional led the nation's sophs and he won the State quarter-mile with ease in 48.4. Only two others broke 49.0 and only 16--there were 20 in '67 and 18 in '68--bettered 50.0.

A pair of sub-1:50 times added lustre to an outstanding collective 880 effort. Marcel Philippe's (Christi, Astoria) 1:49.4 broke the state mark, and unbeaten Brian McElroy(Massapequa) won the Golden West 880 in 1:49.8, defeating Philippe in the process. This victory came one week after winning his second straight state title and two weeks after capturing his county race in 1:49.9, as Kansas coach Bob Timmons looked on. Four others ran below 1:54 to support an event that has always lofted New Yorkers into prominence.

McElroy led the milers with a 4:12.6 triumph in the Penn Relays. Dan Sulpulski(Dansville) did 4:13.3 to win the Eddy Memorial mile and new junior class champ, Denis Fikes(Rice, NYC), was third best with 4:13.8. Nine runners bettered 4:20 as compared with 15 in '68.

In the two-mile Fikes' 9:13.0 shared the lead with Tom Shiland(Cambridge), victor in the NY Relays, Eddy Memorial Games and Sectionals. He was beaten by fast-rising Paul Broderick(Sewanaka, Floral Pk) in the State Meet. The Texas Christian-bound senior clocked 9:18.0, won the LIAC mile in 4:14.0, and came back to defeat Fikes(who dropped out after 6 laps) in the Easterns two-mile to cap a brilliant season, blemished only by an early loss to Fikes in the Loucks meet in White Plains.

Hurdlers saw little excitement except for some inspiring 180 efforts. In the lows junior Fred Singleton(Mt. Vernon) thrice defeated soph recordholder Dave Herman(Shaker, Latham), whose 19.1 led the nation's sophs. Following with 19.2 was another junior, Kevin Bligh(Herricks, New Hyde Pk). Pat Keane (Chaminade, Mineola), CHSAA champion and the state's finest all-around hurdler, paced the 120 highs with 14.2h and 330 intermediates with 39.9. He also ran the lows in 19.4.

The weight events were extremely weak. Joe Zelezniak(Mt. Pleasant, Schenec), a junior who did 61-1½ in the shot and 170-2 in the discus, led a host of lower classmen who offer promise for 1970. He also won the state and Easterns titles.

Zach Gillon(Peekskill) did it all in the triple jump: undefeated, national champion, interscholastic recordholder. His 50-10(50-11¼w) captured the Golden West to cap, an incredible campaign that saw him gobble up every title and record listed. Penn Relays, Loucks, Sectionals, State, Golden West(10th in the AAU, 50-1)--these were some of his conquests. For additional exercise he long jumped 23-8½ to rank fourth behind State champ and soph phenom Greg Flippen(Riverhead), 24-4¼. Sandwiched in between were Fred Samara(Ft. Hamilton, Bklyn), 24-3 and Roger MacDonald(Clinton, Bronx), 23-11½(24-4¼w).

For two years Samara won almost every long jump he entered and at graduation claimed some 14 double victories in the long jump and pole vault. In the latter event his 14-3/4 NY Relays victory earned him third behind State recordholder Charles Best(St. Paul's, Garden City), 14-6, and Ron DeBenedetti, Guilderland, 14-2½.

A pair of 6-6 leapers--junior Brian Bozzone(Nazareth, Bklyn) and latecomer Marc Cooper(Hempstead)--topped a group of 23 high jumpers who did 6-3 or better. Samara registered a 6734n decathlon performance in the Jersey AAU, and in the process clocked 10.5 to set a state mark for 100 meters.

The relays were marked by tremendous depth. Boys of Brooklyn paced the 440, 880 and mile with national ranking clockings of 41.6(state mark), 1:26.8 and 3:16.6n. Mt. Vernon provided strong support with 1:28.5 and 3:18.7h, the latter time third behind the 3:17.0h by Fordham(Bronx) at the Penn Relays. It was all Power(NYC) in a stretch of undefeated two-mile relays, topped by its 7:40.8 at Penn, third best ever. Freeport's 18:03.6 threatened the state four-mile mark while Massapequa and Rice led the sprint and distance medleys, respectively, with 3:28.8 and 10:16.2.

Sprinters reversed the trend of recent years and took a back seat to middle and longer distance runners in an indoor season that saw McElroy and Philippe post excellent clockings. Boys won five of seven major titles, beaten twice by St. Joseph's(Montvale, N.J.).

Gillon, McElroy leading athletes

It was a fitting tribute to state track that its two leading athletes defeated the nation's best in the annual Golden West Invitational in Sacramento, Calif. After establishing personal bests in preparation for the Western trip, Zach Gillon of Peekskill and Brian McElroy of Massapequa entered the star-studded competition with growing confidence. And when it was over they had proven themselves as the best in the land.

Gillon triple jumped 50-10 to triumph by 3½ inches and better the NY State mark he set a week earlier. He also had a windy 50-11¼. The following week he leaped 50 feet for the third time--50-1--to finish tenth in the National AAU meet in Miami.

McElroy, a lanky 19-year-old who has been doing great things since his freshman year, streaked 1:49.8 to defeat the 880 field by 10 yards. (Marcel Philippe, Mater Christi, Astoria, N.Y., was fourth in 1:52.8.)

After jumping 48-3 as a junior and winning the State and Eastern titles, Gillon prompted his Section 1 followers to have nothing but optimism for him. He didn't disappoint them.

The Peekskill star began his senior year with a dual meet best of 47-7½ and won the Penn Relays competition in a windy 49-10½. Gillon captured the Section 1 "B" with a relaxed 47-4, then reaffirmed his national calibre by winning the colorful Loucks Games in 48-10-3/4. His 47-2½ and 47-10 took the Coaches & Officials and Sectional relays, respectively, and the runways were set for a June rally.

The Section 1 meet brought him a personal best of 48-11½ before a State victory of 50-5½, which gave Zach the national leadership and ranked him among

all leading American triple jumpers.

McElroy entered his junior year with some prominence and much promise. His 2:00.0n and 1:54.7 880's in his first two seasons indicated that Nassau County had an unusual runner. All Mac did was take the Penn Relays mile in 4:15.3, the County 880 in 1:51.1(the fastest junior time in the nation) and the State 880 in 1:51.9 before an enthudiastic crowd in Port Jeffersop.

And he wasn't finished!

Last winter he marched to a 1:12.6 indoor 600, 2:12.6 1000 and 4:17 mile. Brian repeated his Penn mile triumph, this time in 4:12.6, and continued to a 1:49.9 in his County and another State title before his triumph in the Golden West.

Although equally outstanding in their specialties, Gillon and McElroy differ in personality.

Like many trackmen, Gillon is not very much aware of existing records, the relative merits of his opposition or the greatness of his own efforts. Oftentimes, fans and reporters have questioned him with statistics, leaving Gillon woefully puzzled. He is probably better off. There are scores of examples of athletes who are psyched out because they know too much about their competition. Gillon, who also long jumped 23-8 $\frac{1}{2}$, merely executes his event beautifully.

McElroy, on the other hand, can quote the records, detail his opponents and explain what his capabilities are at any given moment. He is cognizant but not cocky. When he established a goal, he reached it. The Long Island ace was shooting for an indoor flat-floor 600 mark, and he got it. Setting his sights on the same record for the 1000, Brian was forced to run by himself and finished two-tenths shy of the mark.

In the outdoor County meet he aspired for a sub-1:50 880. He ran 1:49.9, hitting the 220 splits at perfect fractions, certainly a tribute to careful planning and conditioning under the tutelege of coach Bill O'Sullivan.

After the Golden West McElroy ran 1:50.8 in a semi-final race in the Miami Nationals. He is bound for Kansas.

The junior class Athlete of the Year is Denis Fikes(Rice, NYC), who has been knocking off class marks since his freshman year. Last spring he ran 4:13.8 for the mile and 9:13.0 for two miles. He also won seven of eight cross-country titles during the fall.

The soph award goes to Greg Flippen(Riverhead) by a narrow margin over Jim Redd(Hamilton, Elmsford) and Dave Herman(Shaker, Latham). Flippen's 24-4 $\frac{1}{4}$ for the State long jump title led the nation's sophs. He also triple jumped 46-4 $\frac{1}{4}$. The freshman class was headed by Dave Jackson(Sayville) who ran 9:32 to finish third in the State Qualifying two-mile.

Boys High sprints to top

"Boys High Mambo, Ole, Ole"
--The Fans

The chant is rhythmic, it is loud, it is persistent, it is Boys High. From Philadelphia to Schenectady, and points in between, the grandstands rock with sprinters' soul as the Kangaroos dash around the track in pursuit of finishing lines and fancy times. There is a tradition at The High in Brooklyn's Bedford-Styvesant section. It is speed afoot, and the littered streets and antiquated playgrounds that flank Marcy Ave. are a breeding farm for fast runners who are guided and polished at Boys High.

So it has been for the last six decades and so it was again in 1969. In one of its greatest years Boys is Team-of-the-Year for 1969 in a narrow decision over Mt. Vernon, which missed in its bid for a third consecutive No. 1 ranking.

Indoors, Boys competed in seven major meets and won five of them, beaten twice by St. Joseph's(Montvale, NJ). Trevor Mathews' 32.5(300) and 50.2n(440) ranked him second to Taft's Jerry Monroe. Larry Brown's 10.1n 100 led the state, and Dewey Hickman's picture perfect hurdling earned him four victories and a 7.4 60 time, best in the state. Charles Mandley ran a 2:18.9n 1000 and 4:26.5 mile. Boys strength, as always, was boosted by the relays, which it depended upon for late points in tight team races. The 880 and mile foursomes, beaten rarely, achieved state bests of 1:32.0 and 3:25.5.

The outdoor forecast was excellent. But a number of injuries--among them Mathews, Hickman, Brown, Larry Hinds and Gary Gordon--caused the Kangaroos to abandon some goals and finish up in June without the records they seemed destined to attain.

Nevertheless, Boys exploded(before many of the injuries) during April--Relay Month. Coach Doug Terry used 16 different runners to capture an unprecedented four titles at the Brandeis Relays and added three more victories at Queens-Iona. Then came Penn and a 41.6 440 woven to perfection by perfect baton passing...and a 3:16.6n mile time while losing to Abington(Pa) by inches. More gold at the NY Relays with triumphs in the 440 and 880. The 880 time of 1:26.8, one of the nation's best, was made by Boys' top sprint combination of Hinds, Gordon, Brown and Mathews.

Boys took team championships in the PSAL and Easterns, edging Mt. Vernon in the latter.

Individually, Brown was the PSAL Bklyn. 220s champ with 21.5(21.2h, no smoke) and also ran 9.7w and 21.2r and 22.0t. When healthy Mathews ran 20.8r, then 49.6(440) with a bandaged thigh. Mandley did a 1:56.2n 880 and 4:24.0 mile. There were dozens of superb 220 and 440 legs, many posted by second-line runners who combined for times under 1:30 and 3:20 in the 880 and mile relays.

Boys was relatively weak in the field events except for an indoor 6-3 high jumper who fizzled outdoors. Horizontal jumping talent is obviously available but Terry was apprehensive of placing too much of a burden on his young crop of dashmen.

Sophs score in title meets

When sophomores win with ease in championship meets, either the upperclassmen are lagging or the youngsters are sensational. The latter was true in New York last spring.

Greg Flippen(Riverhead), Jim Redd(Hamilton,Elmsford) and Mike Sands(Bay,Bklyn) were the victors who, with near winner Dave Herman (Shaker, Latham) led a talented group of sophs who excelled in several events.

Flippen, '68 State long jump champ as a freshman, leaped 24-4½(seen at right) at Linton HS in Schenectady to repeat his win and crush Bob Beamon's(Jamaica) soph standard of 23-5. He also led the state. Jim

Redd did the same in the 440. He took the State title in 48.4, three-tenths slower than the class mark he set earlier in the season. In the same meet Herman glided the 180 lows in 19.1, only to be nipped by junior Fred Singleton (Mt. Vernon), who did 19.0.

Sands won a slow 100 on a slow Downing Stadium track. (Bill Gaines a 9.3 sprinter, ran 9.8 on the track to win the '67 Easterns.) His time was 10.2.

The backgrounds of this bright young quartet go much deeper.

Flippen was undefeated in his county and also triple jumped 46-4½. He did 24-0 to win the LIAC Games, his final competition of the season.

For the first time in recent memory a soph led the state in the 440. Redd's 48.1 in his sectional brought him the honor and a clocking equaled by only one other soph in the nation. Jim also did 22.5t to take the 220 in the Section 1 "C" meet.

After a steady diet of leadoff mile relay legs,

Sands burst into the limelight with a 21.6 220s to take second in the Brooklyn PSAL meet. Although also sprinting 10.0 in a dual 100, his real potential lies in the 440 where he seems to be holding back his early speed.

Herman, the frosh recordholder, entered the State Meet last spring undefeated, his season highlighted by victories in the Schenectady Invitational(19.6), Eddy Memorial Games(19.6) and Section 2(19.4).

Singleton was his only nemesis in the States and Easterns.

There were many other sophs who in most any year would be the top performers in their class.

Among them were Ken McBryde(Mt.Vernon), 46-5½ triple jump; Tom O'Neill(Wantagh), 4-22.5 mile; Harold Williams(Newtown,Elm), 22.1 220s; Bruce Gronveltd(LaSalle,NYC), 6-4 high jump; Jerome Hannon(Memorial,Levittown), 138-2 for the 4-6 college discus, and Bill Wallace(Boys) 48.5 440 relay leg.

Progress marks the 60's

NYSST/Decade Review

In the late fifties, when America and Russia began their race for space, scholastic trackmen everywhere began their own race for expansion and development, hitherto moving at a slow pace. Gaining competence and confidence, the unofficial "movement" blossomed in the sixties with the structure and strength of prep track becoming more mature with each spectacular year.

New Yorkers were no exception. A program that had existed in its pioneer stages prior to World War II and had picked up momentum in the early fifties was being revised to meet the needs of a more sophisticated fraternity of athletes and coaches.

Suddenly there were distance runners--lots of them--running races of two mile and up. And there were hurdlers, some running the intermediates. There were pole vaulters pole vaulting and sprinters by the bunches running 220 yards on a turn and learning about the 440. Everyone wanted to run relay races. A few even discovered the decathlon.

New and huge track meets were established by the dozens, not only in the industrial centers but in the tiny hamlets that dot the forests and farmland of rural New York. Thousands of athletes competed in cross-country, indoor and outdoor events, causing performances to improve with startling rapidity. Some wanted additional competition and traveled to neighboring state; a few took advantage of invitations to compete in California, the West Indies, Europe and South America.

An awareness of quality became more apparent as coaches and athletes labeled certain records--some local, some national--as their goals. Aspirations of victory together with record performances were being realized by many and college track scholarships became plentiful, inducing even more youngsters to flock to the running track.


Coaching attitudes changed and training became tougher. It was common for distance runners to carry 100-mile-per-week loads; some ran twice a day. Many others is all events indured a rigid grind that served to improve the general quality of all performances.

Track's enormous growth caused almost all of the pre-sixties records to fall. The only survivors in the state outdoor category were made in 1958--the 20.7 220s by John Fernandez(Dubois, NYC) and the 65-10½ shot put by Henry Korn(Stepinac, White Plains). Sprint clocking usually take years to improve because there is so little room for improvement. Nevertheless, a pair of runners clocked legal 9.5s and hundreds ran under 10 flat. The 220 turn became a standard event, leaving only three pre-sixties marks among the top 40. Quarter-milers took much of the spotlight and reached their zenith in '66 when Julio Meade(Jackson, Cambria Hts) led the nation in 46.8 and drew three other New Yorkers under 48.

The middle and longer distances saw the 1:50 half-mile snapped with 1:55 the top 50 cutoff; the 4:20 mile became easy prey, and two-mile marks were swallowed up like hot dogs at Coney Island.

Hurdlers were king in '64 when rival recordholders Ken Donovan(Sayville) and Don Castronovo(Oceanside) ran 13.8 and 18.1 in the highs and lows, respectively. In that year three others ran 14.2 or better and another three bettered 19. The intermediates were part of many meets. Joe Kurzrok ran to a national 330 record of 37.3 in '67.

Al Oerter's(Sewanaka,Floral Pk) discus mark finally fell in '67 as Ken Dietz(Rye Neck,Mamaroneck) tossed the 3-9 platter 186-1. Gary Gubner(Clinton,-Bronx), among others made a futile bid to pass Korn in the shot. Not a single triple jumper before '62 remains among the top 50 in an event in which New York is perhaps the finest state. Bob Beamop(Jamaica) led long jumpers with abilities that had just begun to be tapped. Glass poles enabled 14 feet to become a reality for vaulters and Bill McClellon(Clinton,Bronx) took up the high jump(see p. 36).

Relay records were crushed in a host of excitement. Top teams met in early-season carnivals and at year-end meets designed to obtain national recognition for NY foursomes. The greatest relay achievement was made by White Plains' Carl Reed, Dave Jackson, Larry James and Otis Hill, who combined in '66 for national 880 and mile marks. Every other mark has been substantially reduced with Boys now claiming two marks and a share of a third. The latter mark came in a classic '66 race in which Jackson(Cambria Hts) defeated Boys in a two-mile relay that saw both teams clock a national record of 7:35.6. All eight runners ran lifetime bests.

White Plains' incredible '66 team(See P.36), with champions in almost every event, remains the state's greatest squad ever and one of the greatest nationally of all time.

The New York City area remained the hotbed of indoor track. The well-organized multi-meet program, begun in the mid-fifties, continued to produce record performances on the 60-year-old splintered oval at the 102nd Engineers-Armory. (There is some competition at The Garden.) Tight competition brought capacity crowds to its feet, particularly during blazing sprint relay races.



Indoor programs are being developed and expanded in many areas to provide a backbone to the outdoor season.

Cross-country is now being conducted throughout the state and Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx remained the most congested--and the most grueling--2½-mile course. Each fall thousands of schoolboys travel the winding hilly trails.

Ten years ago 13 minutes seemed impossible. Now it is commonplace. The course record was lowered to 12:23.2 by a kid from Jersey named Liquori. Dave Pottetti(Fox Lane,Bedford) holds the state mark of 12:27.

There are no real "barriers" in scholastic track and field. There are only defeated minds--which make defeated bodies. The sixties were blessed with strength of mind and body, and there is little more that can be hoped for in the seventies.

McClellon, White Plains standouts

NYSST/Athlete, Team of Decade

Bill McClellon was a winner. From his incredible victory as a novice high jumper to his final triumph as a senior, all he did was win. He won indoors and outdoors. He won in dual meets and invitationals. He won against schoolboys and Olympians. He won in New York, Buffalo, Philadelphia, Englewood, Schenectady, London and Sao Paulo.

The Clinton (Bronx) star, Athlete of the Decade, competed in 42 major interscholastic meets as a schoolboy. He won 42 times. He suffered defeat in his greatest performance--his first 7-foot jump for third place in the '65 AAU meet. The mark shattered the prep record and erased a "barrier" that had stymied the progress of scholastic high jumpers. Bill was a junior.

In December of 1963, McClellon, unknown to everyone but his coach, Charlie Scher, leaped 6-7 to win the novice event in the Loughlin indoor games. (The open event was won in 6-5½.) He continued to improve and reached 6-9½ outdoors that year. Bill capped his junior year with the Eastern schoolboy title, third in the AAU and a victory--7 feet again--over John Thomas, his boyhood idol, in a summer meet in Buffalo.

His senior year was a letdown. A series of mental and physical ailments caused McClellon to do no better than 6-7½. Nevertheless, he went undefeated. Twice he was tied indoors.

McClellon, born in Abendeen, South Carolina, was often seen almost taking over the entire high jump competition. He would sweep debris from the runway, keep the foam pits in place and offer encouragement and instruction to his opponents.

White Plains, which set two national relay records in '66, is Team-of-the-Decade. The Tigers clocked 1:25.4 and 3:12.7 for 880 and mile marks, the first of which still stands. However, they were also remarkable in talent and depth that they are remembered for other accomplishments almost as devastating.


Coach Ed Kehe had three 47-foot triple jumpers--Larry James, Charles Sasser and Robert Thomas. Two 1:56 half-milers, two 9:40 two-milers, a 4:19 miler, a trio of hurdlers under 20 (lows) and a 60-foot shot putter--these were some of the little things that supported the brilliant cast of sprinters.

The record splits were: Reed--21.3, 49.8; James--21.5, 47.4; Hill--20.8, 47.5; Jackson--21.8, 48.0.

In every respect they were an all-star team with all-star coach who guided his squad on step at a time, taking each goal with professional maturity. White Plains demoralized its dual meet opponents, including Boys and Jackson and scored 58 points--far more than any other team and more than almost every section (comprised of many teams)--to pace Section 1 to the state title.

NYSST/X-C, '68 season

Denis Fikes of Rice(NYC) and Gary Conner of Niskayuna(Schenectady) shared the honors in the '68 cross-country season.

Fikes won six of seven major races on the hilly 2.5-mile course at Van Cortlandt Park, the Bronx, and defeated Conner in an early season upstate meet. Conner came back to defeat Fikes in the St. John's meet, clocking 12 minutes 36.6 seconds, the season's fastest time at the Park. Fikes, Eastern and CHSAA champion, had a best of 12:40.

Conner also won the Class A race in the NYSPHAA title meet for the second year in a row in record time. He clocked 12:20.2 on the Kings Park(LI) 2.5-mile course, breaking by 31.1 seconds the course mark held by Brentwood's Hector Ortiz.

Chuck McMullen of Spencerport won the B race in 13:01 and Paul Ingrassia of Wheatley(Old Westbury) won C in 12:49, also under the old mark.

Gree-Arcadia(Section 5), Lowville(Section 3) and Wheatley(Section 8) won team championships in the A, B and C divisions, respectively, with 174, 199 and 116 points.

Richie Shay of Stony Brook, the Ivy Prep champ, ran 12:39 for the second fastest Van Cortlandt performance. Marty Walsh of New Dorp(Staten Is) was the PSAL winner.



Team of the Year to Mt. Vernon for the 2nd straight year. Dave Rider's well-balanced team was paced by outstanding sprinters who ran 1:26.5 and 3:15.7 for the 880 and mile relays.

A 4:10.3 mile by Hector Ortiz(Brentwood), State champ, which led 15 miles under 4:20.

Returning stars boost '70 report

NYSST/1970 Preview

The 1970 scouting report indicates that New Yorkers are headed for outstanding performances that will be sprinkled throughout the entire state.

Quite unbelievably, the '69 leaders in 10 of 15 standard events are returning, accompanied by scores of others who have already planted their marks on the record books. Even if only token improvements are made, the new decade should mark the beginning of much development of teen-age track and field talent.

Bill Collins(Mt. Vernon), state champion, paces the returning sprinters with 9.6 and 21.7t times and should threaten the state 100 record of 9.5. Chris Schlauch(Carey, Franklin Squ), 9.5w, 22.2t, replaces Don Christianson(Baldwin) as Nassau leader and may rival Collins for state 100 honors. In the straight 220 Don Brown(CBA, Syracuse), 21.4, tops five returnees including a pair of sophs(in '69) from the PSAL--Mike Sands(Bay, Bklyn), 21.6, and Harold Williams(Newtown, Elmhurst), 22.1n.

Jim Redd(Hamilton, Elmsford), who ran 440 yards in 48.1 is back--for two more years. Tailing him is a pair of Nassau runners, Larry Jason(Freeport), 49.1, and Bill Rennie(Sewanaka, Floral Pk), 49.2n, whose strides followed Jason around the County last season. Lafayette of Brooklyn's James Primus, PSAL champ at 49.5, rounds out an impressive quartet.

Marcel Philippe(Christi, Astoria) and Brian McElroy(Massapequa) are collegians now, but in their shadows in '69 were at least three potential 1:50 half-milers--Kevin Reilly(Pt. Washington), 1:53.7n; Billy Paul(Oceanside), 1:53.9, and Larry Cimato(New Dorp, Staten Is), 1:54.1n, the Easterns victor.

Denis Fikes(Rice, NYC), 4:13.8 and 9:13.0, multi-class recordholder, begins his final year with a four-minute mile and nine-minute two-mile as his objectives. Marty Walsh(New Dorp, Staten Is), 4:19.1 and 9:21.0n, might press him in both events.

With no returning 120 hurdles men known, the hurdles might appear weak. However, the three top 180 lows performers are back, leaving the door open for sub-19.0 clockings. They are Fred Singleton(Mt. Vernon), Dave Herman(Shaker, Latham) and Kevin Bligh(Herrick's, New Hyde Pk) and the times are 19.0, 19.1n and 19.2, respectively.


New York's recent deficiencies in the weight events will end in 1970. Discus and shot leader Joe Zelezniak(Mt. Pleasant, Schenectady), 170-2 and 61-1 $\frac{1}{2}$, paces several returning strongmen.

Horizontal jumpers should continue to post quality marks as a pair of 46-foot soph(in '69) triple jumpers--Ken McBryde(Mt. Vernon) and Greg Flippen(Riverhead)--return. Flippen's specialty, of course, is long jumping--24-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ --which gained him the state and soph class titles.

In any events loom weak they would have to be the pole vault and high jump. Only three vaulters, led by John Vette(Oceanside), 13-6, are back. High Jump leader Brian Bozzone(Nazareth, Bklyn), consistently at 6-6, is now a senior.

Not to be forgotten in any forecast are those yet-to-be-discovered athletes whose rapidly improving talents will thrust them into the spotlight.

Merge best into new meet

NYSST/Editorial

Every spring, when the track pipeline becomes clogged with matchups, those with calculating minds are left with their mouths open and their thoughts lined with "what might have been." They fantasize about a meet that would include the leading performers from all of the track associations in New York State.

At present, the various leagues--NYSPHSAA, PSAL, CHSAA, among others--conduct its own championship meets but rarely face each other, except perhaps in an April relay carnival. Each league is bottled up in its own dual and divisional competition and is pressed for time during a tight schedule, oftentimes made more hectic by adverse weather.

New York State Scholastic Track is calling for an outdoor meet--a true State Meet--that would pit the best from Montauk to Buffalo. The meet would be handled in the following manner:

1) Who would compete? There would be eight competitors in each of 14 standard events (no relays). The eight would be comprised of the first three finishers from the NYSPHSAA meet, the first two from each of the PSAL and CHSAA meets, and one to be chosen from all other leagues such as the Ivy Prep and the various parochial divisions located in Albany, Syracuse, Rochester, Buffalo and other large cities. (Each event would have one race--no heats--including sprints and hurdles.)

2) When and Where would the meet be held? The meet would replace the present "Easterns" at Downing Stadium (which has a new all-weather track), and, hopefully, would retain the directors and officials who have conducted the Easterns so professionally and efficiently throughout the years. Because of various conflicts the Easterns, usually run the week after the NYSPHSAA meet, has been reduced in reality to a New York City meet with a few competitors from neighboring Nassau and Westchester.

3) What would the meet be called? Although this is of secondary importance, the suggestion here is the "New York State High School Track Classic".

One drawback to the meet's proposed date is the conflicting Golden West Invitational in Sacramento, Calif., which draws the nation's top high school seniors. Usually, five or six seniors from New York make the trip west. This would leave a gap in the proposed meet--but only a small one. (Conceivably, the meet could be held on a weekday night preceeding the proposed date to avoid the conflict.)

"What might have been" could really be if action is taken early in 1970 to make the meet a reality. The CHSAA and PSAL of N.Y.C., which conducts the Easterns must inform the NYSPHSAA of its goals and, together with other track groups, make a coordinated effort to name a definite site and date; obtain sanctions; construct rules, regulations and requirements; assign officials, and do the many other tasks that are part of conducting a major track meet.
