

**FOREWORD:** The publication of the 1975 edition of the New York State Scholastic Track Yearbook comes at an important period in the growth of high school track and field in this state. Three significant developments of the past year will have an even greater influence on the coming year. First, there was the formation of the Federation of NY State HS Athletic Associations, which embraced--finally--all school leagues. This formation has led to the second development, NY's first true state championship competition. It will be in cross-country(see p.38). Third, girls' track is spreading country(see pp.22-23). The ripples will widen this season(see pp.22-23).

The Yearbook is paralleling that growth. There are more pages and more photos and (slightly) more ads than last year. The Outdoor Top 40 has become the Outdoor Top 50; next year 60 or 75 is the goal. This edition also has maintained the format to which it changed last year, the 8 1/2" x 11" mat with better readability and more "open" design. For the first time there is a special girls section, which will be much larger next time around.

Printing and mailing costs have continued to increase, but the purchase price of the Yearbook--and its advertising rates--have remained the same.

Many records were set last spring. But the most important was the one set by Mother Nature. The weather was great, at least in the NY City area. A rare condition for this area. Let's hope for two in a row.

This edition almost did not even get off the ground. Returning from the Junior AAU in Gainesville, I was not to find my luggage, which included many of my files which I took along for reference and some work. The suitcase finally turned up a day later--at the wrong airport. I almost had a real summer vacation.

It was supposed to be Belger and Smith, but it turned out to be Smith and Belger, with no discredit to the latter. Both youngsters led the state--and nation--in their respective events, and when all was said and done, the Auburn track and field team, stacked up the outstanding track and field stars among U.S. schoolboys for 1974.

Both youngsters led the state—and the nation—in their respective events, and when all the races were over Willie Smith, now an Auburn freshman, stacked up the outstanding track and field athlete among U.S. schoolboys for 1974.

There was, of course, much more to rave about in NY during the spring of '74. The distance events grew even deeper than expected. High jumpers were flopping to greater heights. The pole vault extended its winter renaissance. It was another bountiful year for the two-mile relay.

At least equal to Belger in achievement was the versatile Mike Hagon, last season's Curt Alitz. Hagon wasn't even listed in the 73 Yearbook, although his outdoor performances hardly were surprising after superb X-C and indoor campaigns.

Five state records were broken and class marks were erased for 13 categories in 10 events. As a geographic area, Long Island had the most from any angle. Six LI teams made the Top Ten (see all-star page); 26 LI athletes (or 40%) were among the 66 (3-team) all-star selections; and LI athletes had the best marks in 12 of the 22 standard outdoor events.

There were administrative changes. The 330 intermediates officially replaced the 180 lows. The mile walk is being seen--and, alas, taken seriously--in more meets. Hundreds of girls asserted themselves throughout the state as an expanding program finally enabled widespread female participation (see girls' section).

Most importantly, a statewide athletic association that, for the first time includes all schools in the state, has been created. It is the Federation of NY State High School Athletic Associations, and it brings under one umbrella all school leagues. It is the nations second largest (to California Interscholastic Federation) such group with more than 900 schools. The president of the Federation's first Board of Directors is William F. Deme of the Private Schools Association.

In the following event-by-event rundown, the 74 season is thoroughly analyzed and the 75 season is prematurely forecast:

**SPRINTS:** It was not as last year's annual bemoaned, "It's an ordinary year for sprinters." On the contrary, it was extraordinary, and the killer of the starting blocks set was the quiet, low-key, fireballing figure of Uniondale's Willie Smith. After indoor marks of 22.0 and 31.0, Smith seemed headed for big things. Even ardent followers didn't predict THAT big, and Smith himself, in a pre-season interview, called 22.0 and 21.0 "goals. Well, the 9.5 came quickly enough, in Smith's words, "effort and on the spanking-new white Plains track in the Ducks Game. He made it two-for-two the next week in the Hartford(Conn) Inv with a record-tying 20.6(20.9 in the heats). Wind-readings were legal. Willie took off with mere 9.8 and 21.0 wins in the South Shore League and then got a piece of another nat'l record with a lap of 9.7 in the Nassau County(Section 8) championship.

June was good to the championships, except for that mysterious 220 loss in the East. He left some serious marks. Back in June a few days hence, Smith won some national races in 9.6 and 21.4 (six races), the LIAC 100 in 1:28 and put it all together in California's Golden State wind-aided triumphs of 10.2 and 20.7 for win the meet's 200m and 400m. He was the first Nyer ever to hit metric 10.5(3rd) and 20.7(1st). He got him spots in the 400R and 200R in the US-USC. He got him spots at Penn. Tex. Smith ran a brilliant race in junior dual in the US quartet was disqualified. And in his final individual effort, Smith took second to Cal Poly's clancey Howard(as he did in the Gainesville qualifier).

Other sprinters gathered attention, especially in the 100 where four more did 9.6 or better; peculiarly, only 25 (as opposed to 35 in "weak" '73) runners had legal marks reported under 10 flat.

millbrook's Neil Green, Nyack's Jim Pugh and Lafayette's Gerry Russell had 9.6's, while Smith pulled Hempstead's Robert Gregory to a 9.5 in that race. Green was unbeaten till the State and Russell took the BSAL 100 and 220 crowns. The 220 was especially hot in New York City, and in the Queens Borough meet alone, 8th place was 22.2. The race's winner was Albert Stream's Manny Rosenberg was forced to trail Smith and his 21.6 is the 3rd fastest ever by a 100 runner. Edison's Fred Dugard, who set two national indoor 100 yard records, lost most of the outdoor season to a muscle pull. If he stays healthy this year, he could lead the state in both dashes as a junior. He could

**QUARTER-MILE** This event had potential, especially if Smith, Belger and Oceanside's Gary Schmidt would have all run the 440—as rumored—in the LIAC meet. Three sub-48's would have been produced—but who would have won? Schmidt was the model of the state dual-meet 48.5. The one he blew was the 48.6 and a 2nd to New Rochelle's Gerry Poellnitz, 48.7. If Dugard switches to the quarter, he may be best here too. Three Long Islanders returned at 49.4 or faster. Uptate frosh recordholder Al Johnson (Mt. Pleasant), 50.1 in '73, improved only to 49.8 in '74 but still looms as a 47pt junior for the upcoming season.

HALEBELER, in a few years a detached look back at Mark Belger's stats at Mephram might yield the conclusion that his senior year was a disappointment. After all, as a junior he ran three races of 1:50.5, or faster, tied the U.S. junior record and broke the world age-16 standard. As a senior he was not to even run 1:50.5. But here is a classic case in which you have to read between the numbers. First, he did post three top three finishes. Second, he was a colt, won at the Gidea Gold, was the fastest U.S. scholboy, won at the Gidea Gold, was unbeaten save losses to two world-class milers, was physically capable in June of at least threatening the national record of 1:48.5 that seemed his destiny,

listen, when you run 1:50.8 in May 11 before your real buildup--as Mark did to beat the superb Loucks field--there's much more to come. And there was, victory-wise. Next week it was the Eddy meet with a 1:50.6 that needed less wind and more competition. Then, on successive weekends, the South Shore, County and State titles in 1:52.5, 1:52.2 and 1:51.3. A few days later his local season ended with a 1:52 LIAC triumph. He was ready for Gainesville, where he had placed 7th in 1:50.3 as a junior. There, he ran a worst-looking 1:49.9 metric half you'll ever see, and took second behind Ohio State frosh sensation Tom Byers. To make the U.S. Junior team and a trip to the Russian meet in Austin. Had he not gotten boxed in, shoved around and forced to run wide--rare for the usually shrewd Belger--the 1:48pt might have surfaced. His GWest time was 1:50.4. He ended up with a runnerup 1:50.7 (to a 3:58 miler) at the Russian meet. Those last two races also were in meters, giving Belger a 9-race average of 1:51.4. Some disappointment! (He is now at Villanova.)

The state's second fastest 880 time was the Loucks runnerup effort of 1:52.94 by Suffern's Mike Hager in his only invitation to 880 in the spring. The Loucks race had five under 1:53 (4 Nkers), and this spring the half-mile may even be hotter. The Long Islanders return with fast times and lots of competitive experience. Regina's Ron Stafford won the NY Relays and had a 1:52.7 best (and another 1:52.8); Trinity's Rich Degan won the CHSAA title and had a pair of 1:52.8's; and Uniondale's Chris Hennessey, Al Krauser's runner-in-waiting, was the state runnerup with a 1:55.26. Five others came back under 1:56, including Washington soph Ramon Severino (1:55.1), coached by George Wisniewski, once a talented soph himself.

FILE Wilers went on a rampage last spring, surpassing even the spring before when Matt Centowitz led the state to its greatest miling depth ever. The '74 Top-50 list went only to 4123.2 and a record 25 runners broke 4:20. Altogether, 74 ran 4:25 or faster. Class marks were shattered in two of the four divisions. The hero of the whole pack was Mike Hagon, who claimed a NYSFHSAA record with a 4:07.8 triumph that ranked among the fastest in the nation. In that race six athletes broke 4:15, including three Juniors, two of whom--Don Falge (Baldwinsville) and George Vogel (No Salem)--bettered the 4:15.5 junior standard. Their marks were well below the 4:11.5, senior pecking, and they'll probably clash both indoors and outdoors in several meets this year.

After Hagon opened his season with a rainy 4:13.3 in the Nanuet Relays, he was cast as a serious national threat. He lost shortly thereafter in the NY Relays. A week later his Penn 2M win—with a 4:16.6 4th. Hagon closed his regular season with a 3:51.6 3rd in the Golden West 1500. He had a shot at victory until he was knocked, and then stumbled, on the final lap. That time still is equivalent to under a 4:10 mile.

A Hagon-Mark Belger matchup was only a "what if ...?" in June as the former opted for the 2M in the Easterns. Mark took the mile there in 4:12.2 and also won his only other solo effort (NY Relays) in 4:13.3. Gene McCarthy of All Hallows trailed Belger in both of those races (4:14.9, 4:13.3) and added a 4:13.1 victory in the CHS National. And this whole rose picture would have even been rosier if St. Peter's Paul Buttermark, the Eastern indoor champ, had not been sidelined for virtually the entire season with a leg injury.

**Two-Mile:** The all-time list received quite a revision as the leading six two-milers cracked the prolific 11. Recent distance efforts have been so prolific that Denis Fikes' former state mark of 9:03 in 1970 is the oldest Top Ten mark left. The best race of the year--in any event--was the Loucks 2M. A fast track, good weather and fast pace. John Evans (Grines), Gary McCarrory and Mark Ogden(Molloy) together with Gary McCarrory (Molloy) gaining gradually. All four were bunched off the final turn as McCarrory pulled away to a 9:04.8 triumph. Evans, Ogden and Penroy finished in that order and broke 9:08. Mike Hagon, the Penn victor at 9/02.2 and Eastern champ at 9/13.6, was a snoot for the 55 neighborhood had he encountered a hot race in June. Brian Hull (Southwestern) was third to Hagon at Penn(9/06.4), then ran unbeaten through the States(9/22.4 in broiling heat) and placed 5th in the Golden West 5000M in 14:46.4(his 3M time must have been around 14/15).

McCarthy won the GHS title in 9:11.8 with Ogden and Conroy in second and third. Evans won his first mile in 4:40.5. The 1000-meter race is the only one of distance progress is seen in the PSAL 28, usually a pedestrian race that might bring the first medalist under 10 minutes. Last year's first was won by Edison's Jon Williams in 9:37.6th was 9:43--and in 1990, all six runners were under 10 minutes. In all a record 13 runners broke 9:20 and the Top 50 list was a low 9:36.0. And 18 of those 50--36%--return this year; three were under 9:20.

**WALKER:** Ft. Washington junior Jim Murchie is one of the finest teenage walkers in the country. He stayed with the HS program through April when he was twice lower over his state mile record. Then, he switched to the AAU events and won the Met 2M title and walked some strong 10-kilo races including a runnerup in the Nat'l Juniors, which got him into the Russian dual, where he took third to the Soviets. Records fell in the class categories and with Murchie--and many others back this year--there should be more walk events and mile clockings well under 8 minutes should be commonplace.

**HURDLES:** It was a good year for the 120 highs, but the event seemed to lack spirit. Anyway, Flairledge's Jim Kappel had a pair of 13.9's and won the State title over Mt. Vernon's Cory Addison, consistent in the low 14's with a best of 14 flat. South Shore's Charles Smith won the PSAL crown and Trinity's Mike Nieminski took the Catholic Schools gold, although the fastest in that league was Mike Murphy, a junior from St. John's. Mephams' John Kowalsky broke the soph class record.

record. The 330 intermediates generated more excitement, possibly because it was for the first time a standard event on the State program. Unbeaten Gary Schmidt was the best with a 38 flat time and a host of major titles (when he wasn't in the 440 and MR). But he really found his marks in the longer 400M hurdles in the AAU Junior and Golden West meets. In the Jr heats he grinded a 51.8 shocker, but placed 7th in the final the following day. No fluke, though, that 51.8. He took the Golden West in 51.9 the next week, securing an admirable place among all-time prep intermediate hurdlers. Schmidt's teammate, Mitch Levitan, had a 38.1 in winning the States, and there were several fine doubles, including Addison (38.3), Kappel (38.7) and Hauptmann. Big time runner, 440/38.3. The frosh, soph & junior class marks fell and the 440/38.3 was a real change drastically from year to year because of the event's new status. Eight sub-40-second runners are back, headed by junior recordbreaker Randy Clark (Midwood). Somewhere there's a 15-second high hurdler who will finally try the intermediates and run 37wt.



### Selection Policy:

The 9th annual NY State All-Star rankings are not based on how the yearbook feels the athletes would place in an idealized competition. Rather, the selections are based on the level of accomplishment: victories, competitive record, consistency, outstanding marks, with emphasis on league championship meets. Generally, dual meets were not considered because most reported are sketchy at best and because they are treated differently from team to team.

### Explanation of Selections:

100: Smith. Green was unbeaten with a pair of 9.6's and a 9.7 before his State loss to Smith, gaining a slight edge over NYC champ Russell, 9.6 best. Pugh, 9.6, a close 4th, while 9.5 Gregory, very inconsistent.  
220: Smith. Rosenberg consistent while trailing Willie all spring... Pugh 21.6 Section win followed by 21.7 3rd in States... Russell close off 21.8 NYC triumph, but only other effort was narrow (21.9) Boro loss.  
440: Price unbeaten... Schmidt consistent 48pt with only setback in States--too tough all year to eject him... Massey took Loucks in 48.3 and second to Price with 48.7 in PSAL... Poellnitz, shocking State winner, very inconsistent, with only other sub-50 a 49.2 3rd at Loucks.  
880: Belger. Degnan and Stafford almost a tossup with the former gaining the edge with LI and All-City Ig victories. Farrell's Daly not far behind in 4th.  
Mile: Hagon. Belger unbeaten with 4:12.2 Easterns win. McCarthy with 4:13.1, 4:13.3 and 4:14 efforts nosing out Don Faige, 4:11.4 Jr for 3rd.

The Knights harnessed their sprinters into a MR foursome that ran 3:19.8 to upset O'dale for the State title. Led by 14.0 Corny Addison, they ran 60.2 for the 4x120M to rank nationally with a hurdles quartet. MV also was strong in the jumps (Gary Brownlee, Danville Bent), weights (Bruce Alterman) and distances (Roger Stewart).  
Xaverian, which has been moving up through the team rankings under coach Frank McCartney, gets the 2nd spot after upsetting Molloy for the NY City Catholic schools crown. Molloy maintains No. 3, just ahead of the perennial LI trio of Uniondale (So Shore and Nassau champ), Mepharm and Oceanside (which--I'll be told--whipped U'dale in a dual meet). Bklyn Tech, the NY City PSAL champ, is rated next, ahead of a second LI trio of W Babylon, St. John the Baptist and Holy Trinity.



# GIRLS TRACK

**PROGRESS:** It cannot be denied--girls HS track is booming in NY State (and elsewhere), and the movement thus far is just the tip of the iceberg. Last spring the NYSPSAA, under the leadership of chairwomen, Louise Tricard, established sectional competition for girls throughout the state. As a gesture to the boys intersectional meet absorbed two girls' events--the 100 and 880--but next spring the girls' events will have their own intersectional championship meet. The NY City Girls Schools Athletic League held a citywide girls championship meet for the second straight year, under the supervision of the league's sports(girls) head, Margaret Wigiser. The NYSPSAA and PSAL comprise over 90% of the state's high schools, leaving out the parochial and private(independent) schools, many of which are not coded anyway.

Indoors, dozens of girls competed against boys in meets at the State Armory in NY City as indoor track was removed from its taboo status as a "contact" sport. Upstate, several meets--especially in the Rochester area--had special girls' events. Many upstate leagues also had girls races added to their cross-country meets, although in the NY City area girls in search of HS events had to get into the boys races. An important development in that regard has been made by Manhattan College, which will have a girls race in its mammoth HS X-C meet Oct. 5. It will mark the first time for such an event in a HS meet at well-traveled Van Cortlandt Park.

Of course, HS-age girls continued all year to represent clubs in AAU meets in the absence of fulfilling HS-sponsored programs.

On the horizon, then, is a statewide HS girls track and field(X-C) alignment that will eventually match that of the boys in planning, supervision, opportunity and recognition. It will not be long, it seems, before

every interested and capable girl can expect within a school term a chance to train daily and compete weekly in developmental and championship events that will serve to enhance her education.

**COMMENT:** The NY State Scholastic Track Yearbook fully endorses girls HS track and will continue to support worthwhile efforts to further its development. The Yearbook calls upon those involved in the administration of girls track not to be satisfied with tokenism but to seek a complete program that would fulfill the needs of all of its participants. Incidentally, a rule is in the offing that would forbid girls from competing for both a club and a school team during the season. This rule has applied to the boys, but since they have more than enough competition, there is no reason for them to join the club route. But if a girl can expect only two or three meets a spring, what is wrong with her also competing for a club and getting much-needed experience? This harmful idea should not be legislated.

**FUTURE COVERAGE:** The Yearbook is calling upon the hierarchy of girls track to send the results of all X-C, indoor and outdoor meets. These can be HS-sponsored meets or even AAU meets involving HS-age girls. Leading placers and their performances are essential along with such other information as school grade and age. It is hoped that with satisfactory cooperation, the Yearbook in the future(1975?) can compile lists and records for girls just as it has done for the boys.



# Clinton 4, 'radical' PV, S&B

The sprinting of Willie Smith, the strength of Mark Belger, the melding of the Clinton Four and some very radical pole vaulting highlighted the 1978 indoor season in New York in which 10 state records were broken or tied. Smith and Belger won every major race they ran—yielding some pretty tied times—and a trio headed by Paul Flint made past vault standards obsolete.

While Smith's outdoor efforts gained him widespread acclaim, he was equally devastating in the winter. The Uniondale senior won eight races in eight starts and broke two nat'l records—22.0 for the 220 (in the Eastern 300 heats) and 31.0 in the Eastern finals. His other victories: Loughlin (32.5), St. Francis (9.9 100), Nassau Inv (31.4), LI Coaches (32.0), So Shore (33.1), Section 8 (32.9), Intersectional (31.2-31.1h). Smith also led the Knights 880R team to a 2nd-team All-State ranking.

Belger split his success between the 1000 and the mile, totaling 12 triumphs. His fastest clockings were 2:12.3 (interscholastic record) and 4:15. He had doubles in the LI, County and I-S meets.

Until last winter the state vault record was an unspectacular 14-0 and only 13 others had done 13-0 or higher. Well, another 10 were added to the 13-0 rolls, while Flint (Highland Falls), plus Gerry Byrne (Ardley) and Andy Pintas (HJH) slaughtered the record. Flint was over 14-0 in every meet while doing 14-6 in Jan, 14-7½ in Feb and that sweet 15-0 in March. He lost only in the I-S when a clutch Byrne made 14-6. Pintas had just been one of the crowd until a 14-7½ in the Easterns when he lost to Flint on fewer misses.

Smith was not the only hot sprinter. NY generally is a weak 6 state, but there were 6.2's from Manny Rosenberg (VSC), Neil Green (Millbrook) and Brian Fraine (Madison, Roch). Clinton's Brady Crain hit 22.5 and drew four others under 23 in the PSAL 220. Fred Dugard's (Edison) 22.7 in that race and his 31.9 (4th) in the Easterns shattered nat'l soph standards. Cardoso's Kevin Price ran 49.9 and 1:12.8 (U.S. best) to win the PSAL 440 and Eastern 600 crowns.

Then, there was the Clinton Four. No, not a rock group or rebel inmates. Just an 880 relay with numbers like 23.2, 22.2, 22.2, 22.2. Those figures added up to a national record of 1:29.9 on the slick Princeton track at, yes, the Easterns. Their handoffs were consistently smooth—unlike in the spring.

Mike Hagon of Suffern was another athlete who thrived on the Easterns. He revived after a one-year absence and, we hope, never to be absent again after an astonishing set of performances. Hagon set a state 2M mark of 9:09.4 but received the shock of his life 10 days later at Cornell when Mephap's shifty Norm Goldwire put forth a 61 last quarter toward a 9:17.3 triumph. It was a banner season for distancemen as 8 broke 4:20 and 8 broke 9:20. Hagon, who also ran 4:16.6, was the only runner in both groups.

Mt. Vernon's hurdles factory came up with a state and national mark in the seldom-held 3x60 event with a 22 flat time anchored by Cory Addison's 7.1. A hurdles race was tied by Jim Kappel, of Plainedge, who twice equaled the five-flight standard of 7.3 and took the state title.

Almost as surprising as the 15-0 vault—and with just as much stature—was the 23-9 LJ by East Islip's Jim Greene. He won his only two competitions and ranked third in the U.S. The DMR still is held sparingly, and St. Anthony's had the nation's best of 10:22.6 in its Eastern triumph.

Archbishop Molloy of Queens, the CHSAA champion, was named No. 1 indoor team for the second straight year. Edison won its first PSAL title, and Section 8 (who else?) took the Intersectionals.

Besides Smith and Clinton, new nat'l marks were claimed by Noel Ruebel of Indiana in the HJ (7'), Tim Johnson of Ill. in the PV (16-7'), Ken McClenon of Colo. in the TJ (51-9 3/4) and Lane Tech of Chicago in the MR (3:19.5).



## Mac, Hull, Lockport hills ahead

THE accomplishments of two harriers, competing on opposite ends of the state, overshadowed the traditional team emphasis last fall during the 1973 cross-country season in New York.

Gene McCarthy of All Hollows (Bronx) and Brian Hull of Southwestern (Jamestown)--350 miles apart--ran through unbeaten seasons including respective Eastern and Intersectional triumphs that earned them Top Athlete acclaim of the fall campaign.

McCarthy, now a Fordham freshman, confined his running to Van Cortlandt Park where he became the first schoolboy ever to maintain a clean slate in seven major races and compile a sub-12:30 (12:29.2) average for the 2.5 course.

McCarthy opened his season in the Iona Run with a near record 12:23.8, which, curiously, was to be his fastest time. His other wins were in the Bronx Boro (12:28), Manhattan (12:35), St. John's (12:30), Easterns (12:29), League (12:26.4) and CHSAA city championships (12:32.4).

Hull also ran the Easterns, but because the race (A) is seeded only on the basis of team strength, he was forced into the C section. After Hull won the race by 100 yards in 12:35.6 in his first tour of Van Cortlandt, sideliners pondered the inevitable "What if...?" of a McCarthy-Hull matchup.

Hull set meet and/or course records almost everywhere he went and had victories in the Hilton, McQuaid, Section 6 and West NY Runs before taking the State title in record time in the snow at Binghamton. He did have one loss--in the post-season Jr AAU 10,000 meter run, the day after (!) the State Meet. He was fourth in 31 minutes flat.

Lockport of Section 6 (Western NY) was the state's Number One team for the second straight year. Lockport won races in the Baldwinsville, Hilton, Alfred-Almond, Niagara Frontier, McQuaid and Sectional Runs prior to the Intersectionals, which was its proving ground, also for the second straight year. Lockport surprised favored CBA-Syracuse in '72; last fall Lockport was the favorite and their balanced attack repelled a strong CBA showing. Lockport's scoring five was Mike Ranney, Buster Simmons, Dave Marotta, Dave Smith and Gary Lantinen.

The only blemish on Lockport's record--and it temporarily displaced it as No. 1--came in the Easterns when they finished fifth. CBA took the state's most talent-laden race with St. Joe's, Power and Grimes next. Pascaock Valley (NJ), Chamade, Molloy, St. Anthony's and Bernards (NJ) completed the first ten.

The other I-S winners were Grimes (B) and Floyd (defender, C), the 5th and 7th ranked teams. Section victors were 8(A), 3(B) and 11(C). New York's only other unbeaten runner is the all-star team's only 1st-team junior, Gary Lindquist of Mepham. Lindquist won divisions of the Nassau and Suffolk

Coaches meets and took the So Shore and Section 8 titles. He also captured sections of the Manhattan and Cobleskill meets and won the State A race in a record time that lasted only until Hull erased it an hour later.

Other 1st-teamers were Steve Crooke (St. Anthony's), Mike Hagon (Suffern), John Evans (Grimes), the State B victor, and Mark Ogden (Molloy), who trailed McCarthy all season.

NY City team champions were Power Memorial in the Catholic Schools (CHSAA) and Susan Wagner in the Public Schools (PSAL).

The 74 season will see the return of, besides Lindquist, the following all-stars: Peter Crooke (St. Anthony's), USTFF Jr Champ; Carlos Ward (Sheepshead), PSAL champ; Dave Dobrynski (CBA-Syr); Mike Keogh (Bing Cath); and George Vogel (No Salem), 4:11.5 outdoor miler. St. Joe's, which returns five runners from its fourth-ranked 73 squad, assumes a pre-season edge over the usual cross-country powers in the race for team honors.

### 1st STATE MEET!

As the Yearbook went to press in mid-summer, two cross-country developments--one with enormous impact for all scholastic sports in the state--were being ironed out for the 74 season.

Now that there is a State Federation embracing all school leagues, a full-scale State Championship in cross-country is scheduled for the fall of 74. It marks the first time in the state's history that a sport will reach its season's climax with a true state championship.

The PSAL of NY City has been authorized by the State Federation to conduct the event on Nov. 16--the week after the Intersectionals--at Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx. The sponsoring school is John F. Kennedy HS of the Bronx.

The specific qualifying standards of entry into the meet had not been finalized at press time; by now, at publication time, those details will certainly have been announced. Plans were being discussed for a luncheon, sightseeing (for upstaters), videotape of the race and other special functions in connection with the meet.

The distance of the race involves a second X-C development. A package that would extend the maximum distance from 2.5 miles to 3.0 and lower the time between races from 72 to 60 hours had passed preliminary committees and was awaiting a final Regents vote. Passage was considered probable. But whether it is acted upon in time for implementation for the 74 season is questionable. If so, the State Championship race--and some others, for that matter--could go to 3 miles.


