The cross-country season, now in its third week, has seen some new individual standouts and team powers. Most prominent among the team powers is Albertus Magnus. Competing in the meet that they sponsored in Bear Mt. on Sept. 28, the Falcons ran away with the "A" race, scoring an astounding 25 points! The team, led by Junior Pat Chambers who battled the rain and muddy course to win, placed six men in the top ten. Placing third and fourth for Magnus were Kevin Leonard and James Kempton, only two seconds away from the winner. Viewing the display by the Falcons here, they may well prove to be one of the top teams in the state.

From the individual standpoint this looks to be the year of the Junior. Maurice Weaver (Power) won the "B" race at Bear Mt. in 12:48.9. Third in that race was Spellman's Jim Clifford. Chaminade's ace steep-lechaser, Jim Shields, has two titles to his credit in as many weeks on the Sunken Meadow 3-mile course. Other Juniors of note are Lou Ostologaza (Loughlin) and John Dowuyan (Sacred Heart).

League harriers also to be reckoned with are Pete Croke (St. Ant) who ran 12:50 at Van Court. Park last year. Leon Martin, the number two man on Chaminade's team, Ed Von Bevern, who about beat teammate Croke at Sunken Meadow, and Brian Haugh, who has placed 6th and 2nd for St. John's on two successive weeks. These are only a few thus far this season who have asserted themselves and the season being only in its infancy.

There will be numerous others who can be expected to win honors during the season. The top team appears to be Magnus, but they are not going to win down to the league championship without a battle. Power Memorial despite graduation of their top two men, still looks strong. Behind Weaver are Kevin Meuchner and Frank Rafferty, both whom ran in the low 13:20's at VCP last year. Chaminade is stronger than last year with the maturation of Shields and improvement of Seniors Leon Martin and Matt Munson. St. Anthony's has the big gun in ● Croke, and a bright promise in Ed Von Bevern. They also have a strong runner in Jim Moore. Loughlin also manages to field a good team, and this year they are led by Ostozaga and Chris Scotto Di Vetta. Farrell is composed of mostly Sophs, which might hurt in the big meets; and Nolley always manages a good effort.

As you can see, this season offers much in the way of excitement.

Come CHSAA Champs, who knows what team will be "up".

The biggest news, as far as alumni go, is the transferring of Matt Centrowitz from Manhattan to the University of Oregon. The metropolitan area will lose the NY State scholastic record holder in the mile (4:02.7) which Matt set in 1973 while at Power Memorial...  
.....Former Mater Christi star, Marcel Phillipe, ran 3:37.9 for 1500 meters (9:55.5 mile) in Sweden in July. Marcel is the NY State scholastic record holder in the 880 (1:49.2) and has since lowered his best to 1:45.8 (meters).....  
Tony Colon (Power graduate of 1970) recorded a 3:58.8 mile over the summer, but the time is questionable for the track may have been short.....  
Denis Fikes still ranks among the top milers in the world this year with his 9:55.0. Fikes attended Rice HS where he ran 4:13.8 and 9:03 bests. He ran the 3:55 last April at Penn while placing second to Tony Waldrop....  
.....Top steeplechaser in the CHSAA last year, Paul Kaftanski of Loughlin, had the second best time in the nation for 1974. His time also ranks him as the 21st best performer on the all-time HS list in the nation.....  
The best steepler in the league's history is Mike Brown (LaSalle '72). He ranks 17th on the all-time HS list. Mike is now a junior at Georgetown University.....  
Rich Szaro, a former St. Francis javelin thrower who ranks 2nd on the CHSAA all-time list with a heave of 198', was signed by the Philadelphia Eagles as a place-kicker and punter. Rich, now 26, was originally signed by the Detroit Lions upon graduation from Harvard. After being released, he played a while for the World Football League's Philadelphia Bell before being signed by the Eagles.  
.....St. Francis Prep is looking for an assistant field events coach (shot, discus, javelin) for the coming '75-'76 indoor-outdoor seasons. Applicants should contact Bro. Norman or send resumes

Other CHSAA placers were: Larry Haden (Power soph) who placed third in the 440 with 51.0; Bill Clark (Loughlin frosh) took 3rd in the LJ with 20'5". Haden also was on the 880 relay that placed 2nd.
