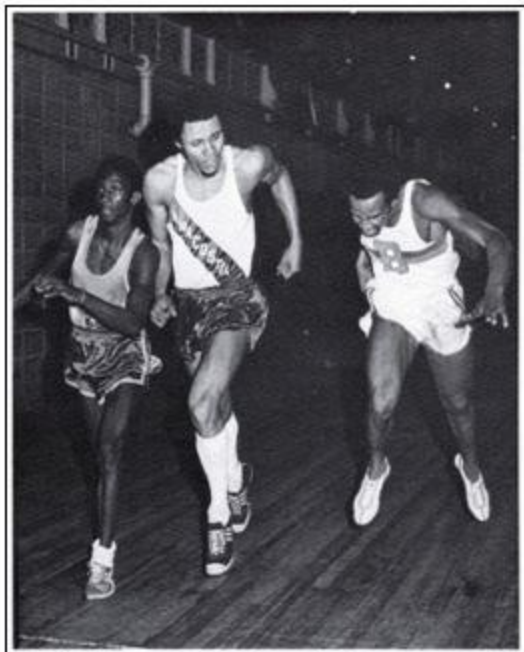
Known to his friends as “*Kokomo*”, one way to introduce Arthur Clark might be to list some of his many accomplishments, which we’ll get to. Another way might be to describe how, years after Arthur graduated in 1972, his former coaches would speak reverentially of him to their current crop of athletes. And those who attended Power Memorial Academy during Arthur’s years remember him not only as a record-setting champion but also as a well-liked, well-respected classmate and friend. When Arthur Clark spoke, people listened. When Arthur Clark ran, the people were behind him.

Those who arrived in the years after Arthur graduated noted, with some awe, the number of times Arthur’s name appeared throughout the Power Memorial Academy track & field record book. Sure, there was Colon and Centrowitz and others, but Arthur Clark left his own indelible mark in Power Memorial’s storied Track & Field history.

Arthur Clark had a slim, slight frame and trademark droopy socks when he ran. And when he ran, he ran fast. How fast? In all, Arthur set 35 track & field school records, sometimes breaking records he himself had previously set in distances ranging from 50-yards to 660-yards. There were records for class (Frosh, Soph), weight, novice and open status, records on the track and records in field events. Arthur set school records in 1969, 1970, 1971 and 1972. And it’s not just Power Memorial’s school record book where he left a mark. Arthur Clark was a CHSAA City Champion at 440-yards, and a two-time National Record holder, once for an individual performance and once as part of a championship relay team.

Like the star he was, Arthur’s performance during the 1972 Indoor season was nothing short of brilliant. A quick recap of just a handful of his races:

His scintillating 50.5 second 440-yard dash at the St. Francis Prep Meet would hold up as the #2 Indoor mark in New York State that year. Already the winner of CHSAA Manhattan-Bronx Sectional 440-yard dash, just a week later, at the 1972 Indoor CHSAA Track & Field Intersectional Championships, Arthur blazed through a quarter mile in 51.1 seconds earning a gold medal against the top Catholic schoolboys in New York City, giving Power six valuable points in their quest for the schools very first Indoor team title.

For all his success at varying distances, some might say Arthur's signature event during his Senior year was 600 yards. In four races Arthur would win four titles against top-notch competition. That competition came from Catholic, Public and Private schools, from all parts of the surrounding metro area, from upstate NY, from Pennsylvania, Washington, D.C., and points elsewhere. All came and all failed to defeat Arthur at 600 yards that year. Arthur was the 600 Yard Run champion at the Bishop Loughlin Games, the Iona College Spiked Shoe Club Meet, the New York University Games and to cap the wins he was the 1972 New York Mayor's Cup "All-City" Champion.



Those triumphs alone might get Arthur into the hall of fame, but there's more. En route to one of his 600-yard run victories, Arthur was clocked in a blistering 59.4 seconds as he passed 500 yards to become that event's National Flat-Floor recordholder. An incredible achievement! And this was the 2nd National Flat-Floor record Arthur was associated with while he represented Power Memorial Academy. His first National Flat-Floor record occurred on March 8, 1971 when, as a Junior, he along with teammates Pat Rafferty, Marty Wisnieski and Paul Barbary won the Distance Medley Relay

at the Indoor Eastern States Championships in a record-shattering time of 10:32.9

On many occasions, Br. Bielen called on Arthur to run a half-mile leg on important relays. At this distance, Arthur displayed tremendous range owning an outstanding personal best time of 1:56.8 for 880 yards.

Arthur ended his high school track career with, of course, a school record. At the 1972 CHSAA Outdoor City Championships "Kokomo" cruised a quarter mile in a sizzling 49.3 seconds to garner a silver medal. Over four-years he earned major victories as an individual, on relays, and as a scorer in championship meets. A record setting competitor, a friend to his classmates and teammates, a respected racing rival to his peers around the city: Arthur Clark is among the legendary figures in the history of Power Memorial Academy Track & Field.

Cartier of Scotch Plains High Wins 2-Mile Run at Bishop Loughlin Games

By WILLIAM J. MILLER

Vincent Cartier, who dominated the schoolboy cross-country scene this fall, served notice yesterday that he may do the same during the indoor track season.

The 17-year-old junior from Scotch Plains (N. J.) High opened the board campaign with an impressive victory in the two-mile run at the 17th annual Bishop Loughlin Games in the 102d Engineers Armory. More than 3,600 athletes from 161 schools took part in the 10-hour program.

Cartier's time of 9 minutes 16.9 seconds was fast for the first meet of the campaign and was accomplished with no one pressing the New Jersey runner.

His clocking was 2.6 seconds slower than the outstanding meet record set by Mike Keogh of Essex Catholic (now a freshman at Manhattan College) last year.

At that, Cartier was not pleased with his time. The youngster, the son of Walter Cartier, who was once the No. 1 contender for the middle-weight boxing title, was undefeated in 11 major cross-country meets and was primed yesterday for a 9:13 or better time.

But he slowed down in the second half of the race, after hitting the mile mark in 4:34.7, almost on schedule. "I just felt tired over the last quarter and couldn't get up enough steam on the final two laps. It seems silly to say this after the cross-country season I had, but I still think I need conditioning."

Cartier was aware before the race that earlier in the day at the Jersey City Armory, his chief challenger, Mike Butynes of Sterling (N.J.) High, had turned in a brilliant 9:14.3 two miles at a development meet. "Sure wish Mike had been over here today," Cartier said. "I know I would have run faster."

Guevara Sets Mark

There were some other noteworthy performances at the meet. Rudy Guevara, a 240-pounder from Newark's Essex Catholic, passed the 60-foot mark for the first time indoors in his four-year career and he did it with a shot-put meet record heave of 63 feet one-half inch.

Harold Williams, Newtown senior, showed that he might be headed for a stellar year in the sprints, when he was timed in 32.2 seconds in the 300-yard dash to tie the meet mark.

Vincent Dwyer of Rice, running in an unseeded section, came up with a 4:23.3 victory in the mile run, only 1.2 seconds slower than the record.

Boys High won the team title, when Rick Jones took the 100-yard dash in 10.2 seconds, the next to last event on the open program.

The Brooklyn team tallied 21 points. LaSalle Academy made it close, when its Bob Antosh captured the last event, the 60-yard high hurdles, in 7.6 seconds, to pull the Cardinals into second place with 19 points. Essex Catholic was third with 14.

Jones was the only individual winner for Boys but Doug Terry's squad, in winning its second straight title in this meet, tallied points on second places in the 300 and 600, a third in the mile relay and fourth places in the 1,000 and 880-yard relays.

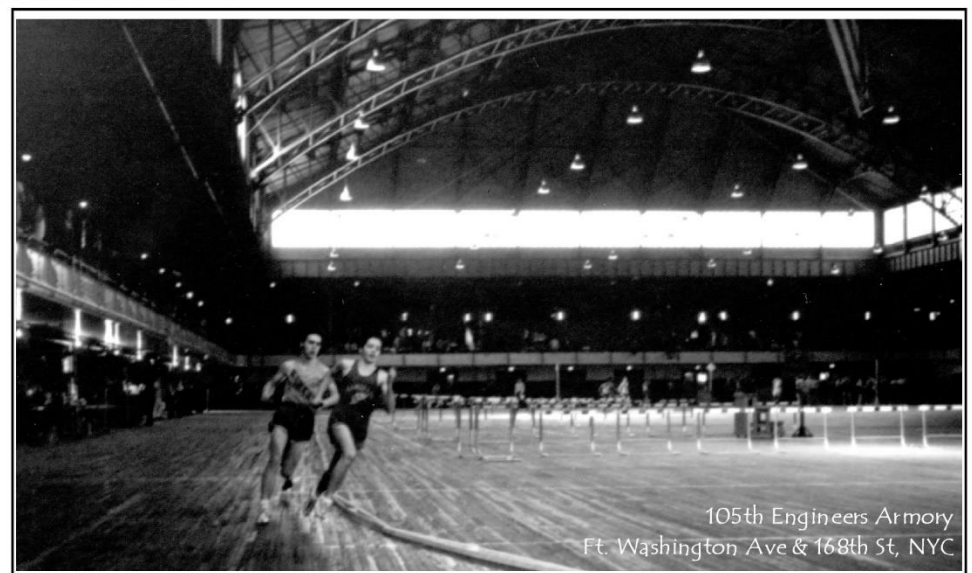
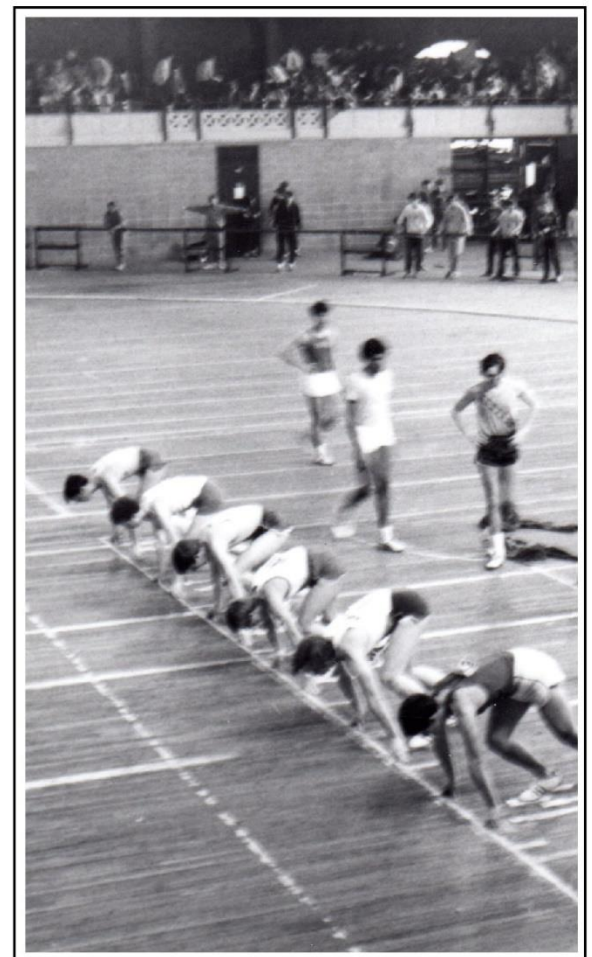

NEWTOWN STAR EQUALS RECORD

Williams Hits 9.9 for 100 at
N.Y.U. School Meet

Harold Williams of Newtown High School reaffirmed his superiority among scholastic sprinters yesterday by defeating an outstanding 100-yard field in the New York University track games at the 102d Engineers Armory.

Williams, a 17-year-old senior, clocked 9.9 seconds to triumph by a long yard over Cal Grannum of Erasmus. In an earlier qualifying heat, Williams ran 9.9, which equaled the New York state indoor record shared by Oliver Hunter of New Rochelle and Bill Collins of Mount Vernon.

Williams, in recording his fourth straight victory this season, had hoped to equal the national flat-four mark of 9.8 held by Al Phillips of Montclair, N. J. One mark he did snap was the Public Schools Athletic League standard of 10.0 shared by seven sprinters.

La Salle won its second straight team championship with 13 1/5 points. Boys High, the favorite, finished with 6 points after the Kangaroos' Don Johnson pulled a muscle in the 300-yard run final and its 880-yard relay team was disqualified. Power placed second with 10 points.

Herman Wins Hurdles

A talented hurdles field was topped by Dave Herman of Shaker High, outside Albany. Herman ran 7.3 in the 60-yard highs, the fastest time of the season. Herman also owns the state's fastest 60-yard dash mark of the winter, 6.3, and two weeks ago ran 6.8 to come within a tenth of the national record for the 60-yard lows.

Bob Marman of Sewanhaka got tripped up on the first turn of the 1,000-yard run. The race was re-called and run a second time, and Herman won it. Driving hard with deceptively long strides, he took the lead with about 200 yards to go and won by two yards over Brian Guacsino of North Bergen, N.J. The winner's time was 2:17.2.

Vince Cartier of Scotch Plains, N.J., posted his 28th consecutive victory dating back to the fall cross-country season. He won the mile in 4:21, surging to the lead after the first half-mile. The expected dual between Cartier and Matt Centrowitz, Power Memorial's soph sensation, never materialized. Centrowitz finished fourth in 4:24.2.

Howard Ostrander, who is in charge of New York State armory facilities operations, and explained the situation. Mr. Monahan told him he had enough help on hand to supervise the crowd and the officials of the P.S.A.L. would also help out."

"Major Ostrander gave the okay on this basis and we opened the doors."

The South Shore (Brooklyn) High track coach added: "As things turned out, we had no trouble or incidents in a meet that lasted nine hours and where we had over 400 people in the stands and 2,100 athletes competing."

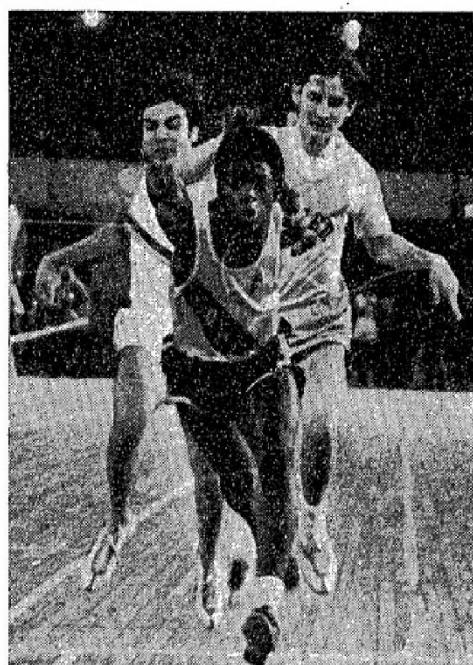

Whether you call it the double-triple or the triple-double, that's what Power Memorial High is after. It might even be the triple-triple. At any rate, Brother Bielen, track coach at the W. 61st St. school, will know all about it after the New York Relays, Friday, April 30, and Saturday, May 1, at Randalls Island. During the indoor season, this foursome was clocked in 7:51.8. The meet record for the New York Relays is 7:44.3 set in '69—by Power Memorial.

FOR THE DISTANCE medley,

the likely lineup is Jeff Snaggs on the opening 880 leg, Art Clark on the 440, Ed Walsh at the three-quarter mile, and Paul Barbary, the anchor mile. This quartet turned in a classy 10:33 indoors. The meet record for the New York Relays is 10:18.5 set last year by Power Memorial.

Redd, Lazarus, McLee In Loucks Games' Spotlight

All-Day Downpour Ruins Record Bids

Of course, it could have been worse.

It might have been snow. But the truth of the matter is that old man Jupiter Pluvius, the ancient god of rain who really has much more to say about the success of an athletic event than Avery Brundage, Bowie Kuhn and Pete Rozelle all rolled into one — at least this side of the Strodome—had done it again.

Sabotaged the Glenn D. Loucks Memorial Games, the most ambitious and best planned spring schoolboy track and carnival in all the north-east.

The 4th annual edition of the Loucks Games, down for decision at White Plains High School on Saturday with 1,025 boys entered from 101 separate schools from five different states and the District of Columbia, fell victim to a monsoon that might have driven a channel swimmer up the Dover Cliffs.

So bad, in fact, that 27 schools withdrew, four of the scheduled eight field events (pole vault, high jump, broad jump and triple jump) were moved into the WPHS gymnasiums and another — the discus — was postponed until 4 o'clock, Wednesday afternoon.

This four-day delay also left the ultimate disposition of one of the five team championships — that for the high scoring unit among competing New York State Public Schools — in abeyance until the completion of this event. Lawrence High of Long Island and Alexander Hamilton of Elmsford currently are tied for the title as each has at least one boy in the test capable of at least scoring, if not winning the platter spin.

The other team titles went to Coach Dave Rider's Knight of Mount Vernon in the Open bracket — the perennial Westchester power eligible for only one trophy, thus contributing to the Lawrence-Hamilton mixup for the NYSPSAA prize; Andrew Jackson High of the New York City Schools (PSAL) division; Essex (N.J.) Catholic for out-of-state schools and Power Memorial for Catholic High School A.A. teams.

The meet, scored on the top five finishing places, on a 6-4-3-2-1 points basis, saw Mount Vernon the victor with ease, the Knights earning 40 counters as compared to 26 by runnersup Jackson, 24 by Essex, 16 each (thus far) by Hamilton, Lawrence and Power Memorial.

Next-in-line came Scotch Plains-Fanwood, N.J., and Shaker High of Latham in the North Colonie district (above Albany), each with 12. Sacred Heart of Yonkers had 11. Other Westchester and Rockland County schools among the 44 teams to get on the board were New Rochelle and hosting White Plains, six points each, Croton-Harmon and Suffern, four pts., and Rye Neck, three.

Hit with such atrocious weather, the officials of the Loucks Games were put on a most uncomfortable spot at the day's outset. To run... or not to run?

Had it been merely a Sectional Championship, or even a gigantic invitational carnival also involving PSAL and CHSAA teams from elsewhere in the Metropolitan area, its likely the whole affair would have been put over one day or even two — the Mother's Day angle also adding further problems concerning a mere 24 hour postponement.

But with schools coming from as far off as Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Pennsylvania, south New Jersey and upstate New York, as well as from the nation's Capital, there was only one decision possible.

"Nothing short of an earthquake could have stopped us," Games Committee Chairman and WPHS Coach Ed Kehe smiled damply, an hour after it was all over. "We just had to make the best of it and I congratulate everyone, the athletes, their coaches and our officials, who went along with the decision, as uncomfortable as it was for all of us..."

"The kids who competed to-day were truly real champions, all of them."

And, as is usually the case in a mammoth meet such as the Loucks Games, involving only the cream-of-crop athletes, form — though also soaking wet — stood up, almost in every instance. This caused Kehe to add, "This was to be expected. Anyone who wins consistently against the best, usually continues to be a winner, even under the poorest of playing conditions..."

Under the conditions that prevailed, the record books, as might be imagined, got off almost scott free. The standards scrolls had been braced for a major rewriting, but only one of the 20 marks that went on Saturday's line was equalled; and none broken.

The boy who can now look forward to seeing his name in next year's program is Pete LaCorte of Cedar Grove (N.J.) High. However he may have to

carry an asterisk next to his superlative high jump effort of 6 ft. 6 in., stigmatized by the fact it was achieved "indoors."

To of the day's individual standouts were Mount Vernon's spring-legged Ken McBryde and Dave Herman, a low-flying streak from Shaker High at Latham. Each registered a double triumph, McBryde's long and triple jumps also coming in the more comfortable if cramped confines of the gymnasium.

Herman, a 17-year-old senior who also possesses outstanding football (nine touchdowns as a wide receiver when a junior) and baseball (centerfield on a title-winning American Legion team) talents, but has given these other sports up to concentrate now on track, swept to a brace of hurdles firsts. Probably headed for Florida U. Herman, who runs dashes in dual meets back home, took the 330 intermediates away from Mount Vernon All-County basketball whiz Mike Young by a whisker. Defeated another Westchester stickout, Jeff Schlieper of little Croton-Harmon, in the 180 lows.

A successful defending champion was Alexander Hamilton senior Jimmy Redd, the pride of Coach Howie Ryan's stable splashing home on top in the 440 in 51.6. The relaxed winner who is already two-time New York State quarter-mile king, has clocked 47.8 was unable to get anywhere near the 48.4 he hugh out in hot, humid conditions a year ago.

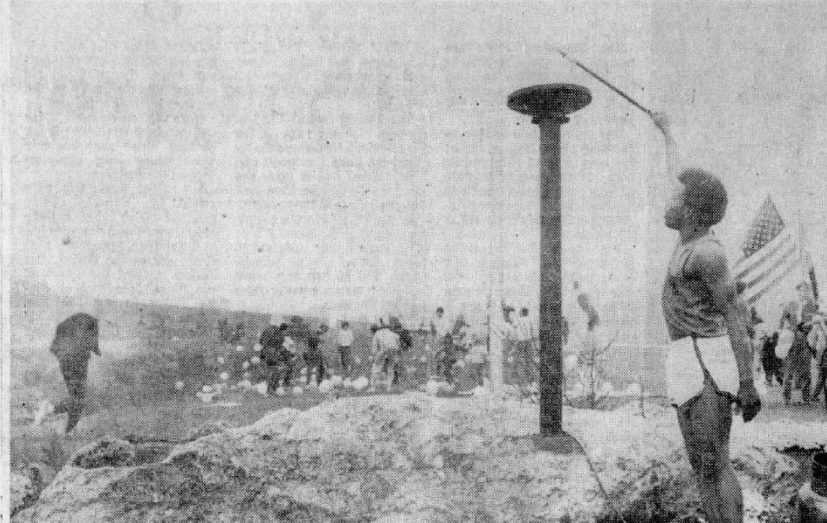
Redd, however, wasn't the only winner on the day for the Class C-sized Elmsford school, durable Kevin McLee capturing the 3,000-meter steeplechase with ease, the first time the gruelling test has been run at the Loucks Games. McLee, timed in 10:04.7, had nearly 20 seconds on his closest pursuer, Brian Farley, of Archbishop Maloney.

Westchester had one other individual winner on the dreary day, junior pole-vault specialist Jon Lazarus of Kehe's hosting Bengals, following in his brother's footsteps when he took this event which also was driven indoors. Jon's height of 12-6 was a full foot superior to that achieved by a trio who tied for second, and equalled the winning measurement hung out in the 1970 Loucks Games — by graduated older brother Eddie Lazarus.

Mount Vernon harvested a total of 13 points in the three relay events, getting a first in the half-mile (with a blending of Dave Patterson, Otis George, Tony Wells and Alfonso Owens), a second in the two-miles and a third in the mile.

Some other bang-up near misses by area individuals other than those of hurdlers Young and Schlieper were recorded by New Rochelle's Wayne Crutchfield in the 120-highs, behind Larry Shipp of Washington's St. Albans High, with Young third; Suffern's Mark Connors in the 220, trailing Donnie Smith of Jackson with Redd third; and Sacred Heart's Danny Maloney in the two mile; won by Vince Cartier of Scotch Plains.

"Maybe next year we should take a closer look at the Farmer's Almanac?"

BOYS EDGES POWER IN LOUGHLIN TRACK

Dabney's Fast Anchor Leg Key in Point Victory

By WILLIAM J. MILLER

Bill Dabney, a talented junior runner from Boys High, made a move by Coach Doug Terry look like a stroke of genius yesterday.

Dabney, the prerace favorite in the 1,000-yard run, was switched by Terry to the anchor leg of the two-mile relay in the 18th annual Bishop Loughlin track and field games at the 102d Engineers Armory.

Dabney received the stick in sixth place, about 80 yards behind the leaders, La Salle and Essex Catholic. At the finish he was only 5 yards back in third place and had run a sensational 1-minute-52.6-second leg, said to be the fastest in the state's history of 880-yard relay legs indoors.

The resulting 3 points were important ones for Boys. The Brooklyn school wound up edging Power Memorial by a point, 24-23, for the team title. Boys had two individual winners and Power had three.

187 Schools at Meet

The meet opened the metropolitan area schoolboy campaign and drew more than 4,000 entries from 187 schools in four states.

One meet record was set. Harold Schwab of Centereach (L.I.) beat Reggie Blackshear of Metuchen (N.J.) in the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.3 seconds.

Power showed strength in the one and two mile runs. Pat Rafferty, whose four older brothers also enjoyed success in New York City track in the last six years, won the mile by 10 yards in 4:24.5.

Matt Centrowitz, outstanding as a sophomore last year, won the two-mile run. He took the lead with three laps to go, and when Kevin McCarey of Cathedral Prep, the favorite, dropped out with two laps remaining, Centrowitz went the distance unchallenged and won in 9:22.7.

Schoolboys Clip 3 Records In Iona College Track Meet

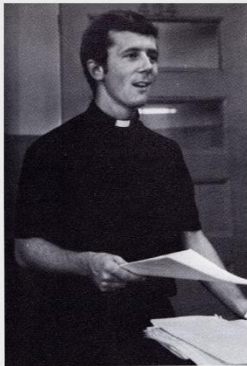
Three meet records were set yesterday in the 11th annual Iona College Spike Shoe Club schoolboy track meet at the 102d Engineers Armory.

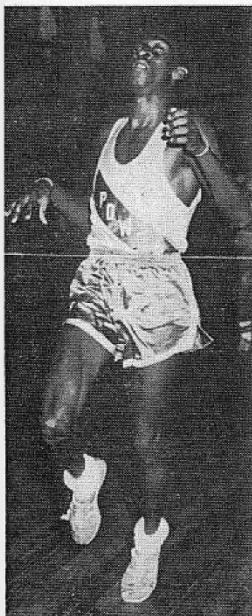

PREP MILE WON BY CENTROWITZ

Power Ace Turns 4:16.9
at St. Francis Meet

Matt Centrowitz of Power Memorial Academy continued to live up to his reputation yesterday in the 16th annual St. Francis Prep indoor track games at the 102d Engineers Armory.

The 16-year-old junior ran a front race all the way, but had to hold off a late challenge by Cathedral Prep's Kevin McCarey to take the mile run in 4 minutes 16.9 seconds. The time tied the meet record set by Marty Liquori of Newark's Essex Catholic in 1966.

Centrowitz, whose best previous indoor mile time was 4:19.5 as a sophomore last year for a New York State class record, went out fast. He hit 1:00.8 for the first quarter, but then slowed to 1:07.4 and 1:07.7 for the next two quarters which allowed McCarey, a top-flight two-miler, to stay close.

McCarey, who finished in 4:17.5, his fastest mile, made his bid just before the final turn and drew even as the two came off the turn into the straightaway. But there Centrowitz's physical stamina paid off as he pulled away and won by three yards. The Power junior is 6-foot-1-inch and 170 pounds, while McCarey is 5-foot-9-inches and 132 pounds.

Decided on Monday

"We decided on Monday," Brother Biehlen, Power coach, said after the race, "to run the mile although Matt was also entered in the two-mile. He was disappointed after finishing third in the Iona two-mile in 9:28 so we figured he'd make up for it in the mile."

"When Matt finished with a two-minute 880 after running 15 220's in 29 seconds and under in a workout on Thursday," Brother Biehlen said, "I knew he was ready. We planned a 4:15 mile but his slow third quarter today closed the door on that time."

Centrowitz, who Brother Biehlen called a "tireless worker who does everything you tell him," will run the thousand in the Hayes Games next Saturday. "He'll run the mile again in several of the late meets this season. I want to give him some variety compared to last year when he ran eight indoor miles," the coach said.

La Salle Academy scored two impressive individual victories when Mike Brown won the two-mile easily in 9:24 and Dennis Donahue took it 1,000 in 2:17 by two feet over

John Meehan of Essex Catholic.

In an exciting 440-yard run finish, Bob Cox of Brooklyn's Alexander Hamilton edged A Clark of Power in the goal time of 50.3 seconds.

Essex Catholic won the team title with 18 points.

Several outstanding competitors were sidelined for this meet. TRACK TITLES GO TO POWER, MOLLOY

McCarey Batters Brooklyn Section Mile-Run Record in Catholic High Meet

Power Memorial and Archbishop Molloy captured the team titles yesterday in the sectional indoor track championships of the Catholic High Schools Athletic Association.

In the New York section at the 102d Engineers Armory, Power was challenged strongly by La Salle but Molloy took the Brooklyn-Long Island honors by a big margin.

Kevin McCarey of Cathedral Prep posted the only meet record of the day. He won the Brooklyn-Long Island one-mile run in 4 minutes 18.2 seconds. He bettered the previous mark by a second.

Sweeney Ties Dash Mark

In the same section, Mike Sweeney of Molloy equaled the 100-yard dash mark of 10.3 seconds, Pat Clifford of Bishop Ford won two events, the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.8 seconds and the high jump at 5 feet 11 inches.

The most noteworthy performance in the New York section was the victory by Matt Centrowitz of Power in the 880-yard run. He won by 10 yards over Chris Ryan of Farrell with a 1:17.8 clocking.

Mike Brown, La Salle's distance star, had an unexpected battle from Neil Coleman of Albertus Magnus before winning the two-mile run in 9:29. Coleman's time was 9:29.7.

MOLLOY IS NEXT IN CLOSE MEET

Power Clinches Crown on
Last Event, 880 Relay
—LaSalle Is Third

The stage was set for a thrilling finish to the 45th edition of the Catholic High Schools Athletic Association indoor track championships yesterday when Power Memorial and Archbishop Molloy faced each other in the final event.

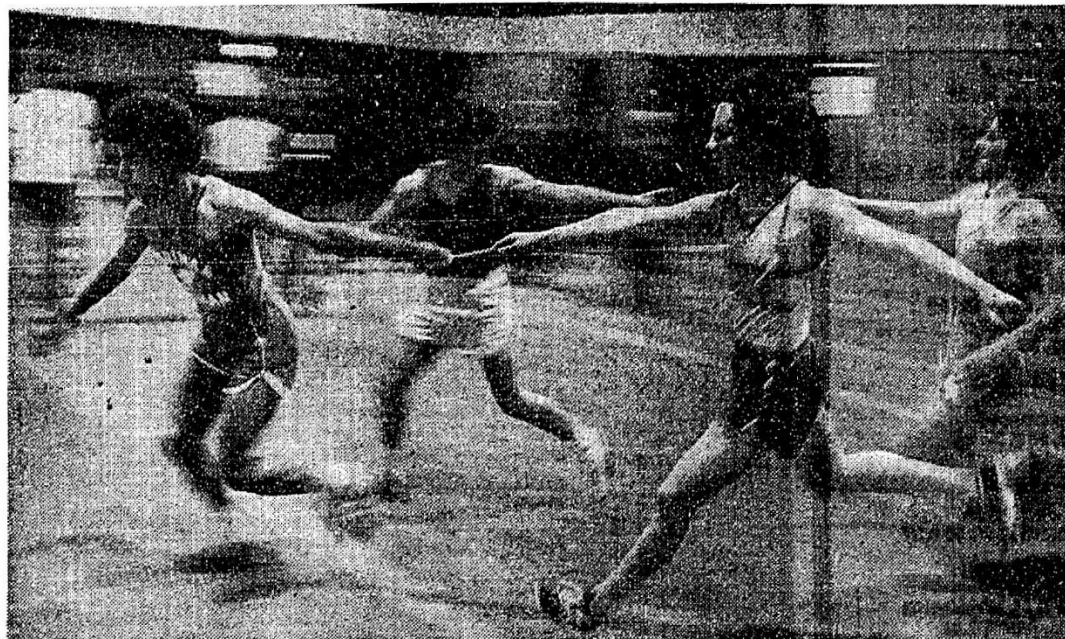
One point separated the schools with the team title hanging in the balance of the 880-yard relay.

The spectators were not disappointed. The quartets battled each other for all four legs with a driving finish by Greg Little, a sophomore, in the final 50 yards bringing Power home first by two feet over Molloy.

The resulting six points gave Power its first city-wide track championship on a final total of 29 points to 28 for Molloy. It was a frantic finish to one of the most exciting C.H.S.A.A. title meets.

Another school, La Salle Academy, wasn't counted out until the final event in which it didn't have a qualifier. The defending champions, who gained their first city crown last year, finished third with 25 1/10 points.

The close team race made up for the fact that no meet records were set. However, Matt Centrowitz, Power's ace, continued his winning ways with a fast clocking of 1 minute 55.7 seconds in the 880-yard run. A slow first 220 (27.6 seconds) prevented Centrowitz from lowering the 1:54.2 meet record set by Tony Colon, also of Power, in 1970.

Another impressive performance was the 8-minute flat two-mile relay, the fastest of the season, registered by Cardinal Spellman. The foursome of Mike Clifford (2:02.6), Joe Veth (2:00.7), Jim Wynne (1:58.6) and Tom Twomey (1:58) gave Spellman its second relay triumph. Earlier in the day, it won the mile relay.

In other highlights, Mike Brown of La Salle remained unbeaten this season in taking the two-mile run (9:22.5); Kevin McCarey of Cathedral Prep won the mile run (4:19.5), and Fred Rom of Chaminade leaped 6 feet 6 inches in the high jump.

Power's victory was well earned. The Manhattan-based school, short on depth, showed top quality as it won four events. In addition to the 800-relay and Centrowitz, the Kangaroos had Bernie Greaux take the 300 in 33.3 seconds, and Art Clark first in the 440 in 51.1 seconds.

A second by Al Jackson in the 100 and a fifth by Larry McGee in the hurdles were the other point scorers for the winners.

Brother Biehler, the Power coach, was slightly ecstatic as Little broke the tape in the 880-relay. He jumped up and down as the Power rooting section in the stands went wild.

"I switched Greg to the anchor on a hunch," Brother Biehler said later, when he could finally talk. "He ran well last week on the third leg, so I moved Zayas [Richard] to third today." Little, whose brother, Doug, finished second in the 440 for Most Holy Trinity, was touched off two yards behind Molloy.

The Cross-country garnished 22 trophies and a total of 324 medals while the indoor track received 9 trophies and over 200 medals.

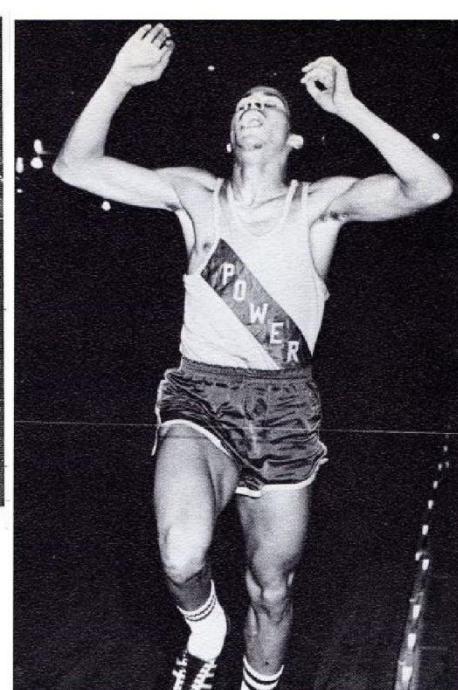




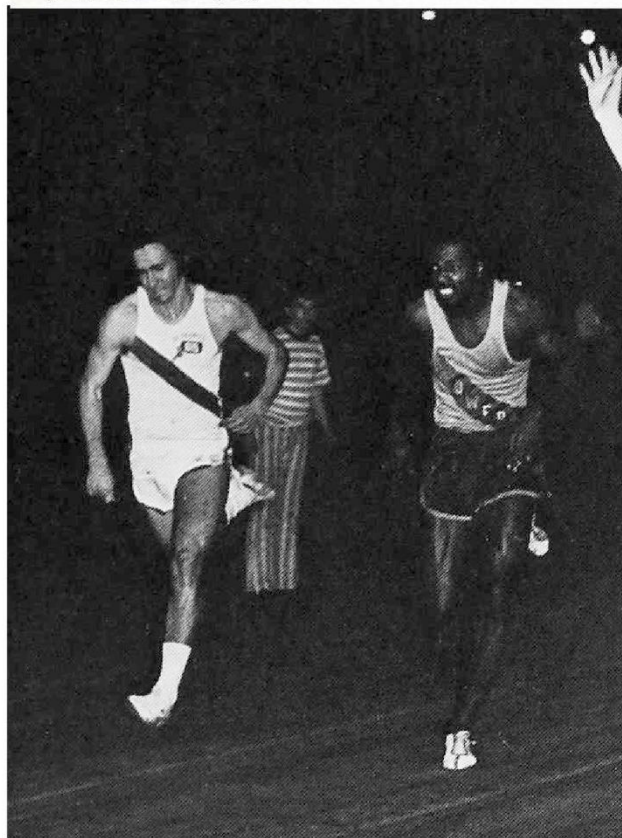

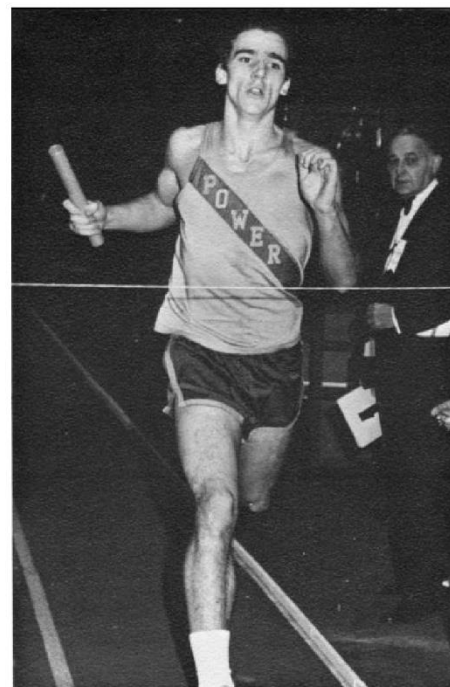

McCarey Wins 2-Mile

At Mayor's Meet in 9:15

Kevin McCarey, who has put Cathedral Prep on the scholastic track map, served notice yesterday that he's ready for the Eastern States Indoor Championships on Tuesday.

The 5-foot-8-inch, 126-pound senior set a meet record of 9 minutes 15 seconds in the two-mile run at the 16th annual Mayor's All-City Schoolboy Championships in the 102d Engineers' Armory. It was the fastest flat-floor clocking in the country this indoor season.

"I wanted to let my opponents on Tuesday know that they'll really have to run to beat me," McCarey said later.

His coach, Jim Mitchell, echoed these sentiments. "This was a dress rehearsal," he said. "We wanted to go to the starting line Tuesday with the best time."

McCarey had little other incentive in this race. He left his opposition well behind in the first mile and won by almost 200 yards. He clocked 4:36.5 for his initial mile and wound up with a 4:38.5.

Despite his fine showing, the Queens runner, who so far has won five races this year and ran the second fastest 2.5-miles over Van Cortlandt's cross-country course last fall, dislikes indoor racing. "The air is bad, it's too hot and stuffy and there's too many laps compared to outdoors," McCarey said.

Although it failed to get the meet record, La Salle Academy's two-mile relay team registered

the fastest time in the country this season. The Cardinals, with Joe Gonzalez (2:01.8) John Egan (1:58.7), Mike Brown (1:57.5), and Dennis Donahue (1:57.9), ran 7:55.9 in winning by 30 yards.

Boys High, Public Schools' champion, defeated Power Memorial, the Catholic High Schools' champion for the team title with 22 points to 16 for Power. Columbus was third with 10 1/3.

Boys was led by Bill Dabney, who took the 1,000 meters easily in 2:16.4 and its 880 relay team, which won in 1:32.5.

Matt Centrowitz of Power captured his sixth gold medal this season in the mile run in 4:18.6 after a week when he was in bed with the flu for two days and lost another day's practice because of a bomb scare at the armory on Thursday.

Bob Cox of Alexander Hamilton continued his winning ways as he recorded his fastest 440 clocking of the season, 49.8 seconds. Art Clark of Power, who has also enjoyed a fine season, won the 600-yard run in 1:14.5.

A mix-up by the officials in the 60-yard dash led to an unusual solution. The three first-place judges picked three different men as the winner. The result was a triple tie among Greg Evans of Columbia, Al Cobhan of Evander and Lance Harrison of Far Rockaway in 6.6 seconds.

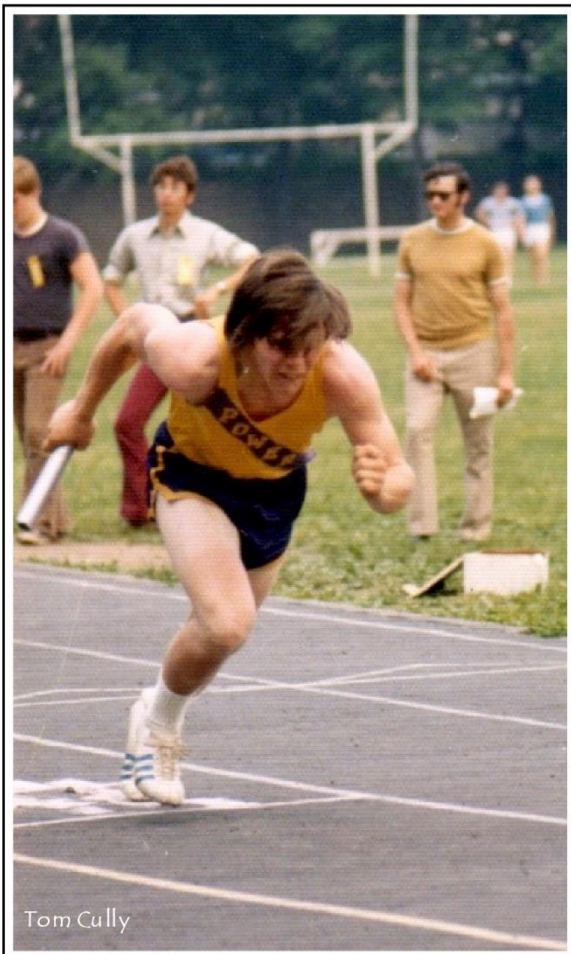

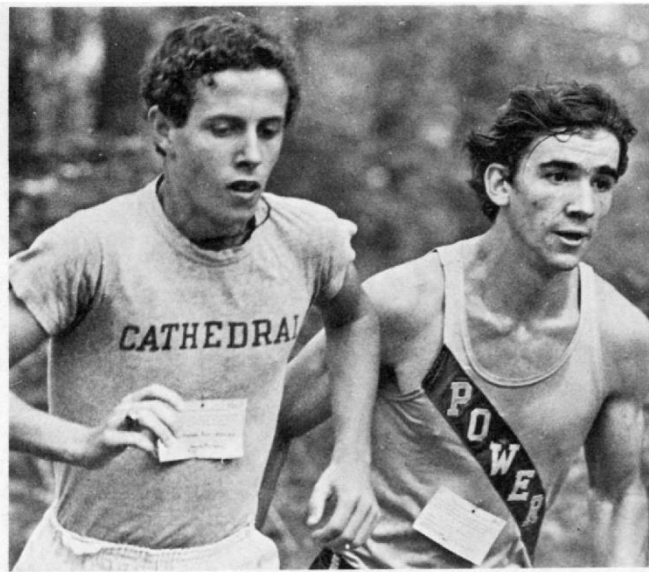

Mike Brown of La Salle of New York City scored his second major triumph in two weeks. He won the two-mile in 9:19.3, holding off the surging Larry Lane of Bishop Turner, Buffalo, whose 63-second last quarter brought him within two feet of Brown. Cathedral's McCarey Sets 2-Mile Mark in Eastern

Kevin McCarey of Cathedral Prep and a fleet foursome from John Bartram High of Philadelphia turned in record performances yesterday in the 16th annual Eastern States track championships at Downing Stadium, Randall's Island. Boys High captured the team title for the third time with 21 points. Essex Catholic of Newark was second with 12 3/4 points and Shore Regional of New Jersey was third with 10.

McCarey, a senior who is bound for Villanova this fall, ran away from Mike Butynes of Sterling, N.J., in the last lap to take the two-mile run in 9 minutes 7.8 seconds. Butynes set the previous mark of 9:10 last year.

Bartram, using Vic McKinley (22.5), Tony Bullock (21.5), Steve Trueheart (21.2) and Wayne Matthews (21.8), ran away with the 880-yard relay in 1:27. Boys, which held the previous mark of 1:27.6, was second.

Bill Dabney of Boys received a tough battle from Gary Trojanowski of Metuchen's St. Joseph's before winning the 880 by two yards in a fast time of 1:51.8. Trojanowski clocked 1:52.3 as the first five finishers went under 1:54.

Other running highlights were a 21.7-second 220 by Charley Wells of Jersey City's Lincoln; a 7:48.5 by La Salle in the two-mile relay; a 48.3-second 440 by Roy Lake of Boys; a 38.2-second 330-yard intermediate hurdles by Kevin Allen of Madison, N.J., and a 4:15.5 mile victory by Harold Kronick of Franklin Township, N.J.

Outstanding in the field events were Ron Yanello of Shore Regional, who threw the javelin 226 feet 1 1/2 inches, and Joe Johnson of Hackensack, who cleared 6 feet 8 inches in the high jump.

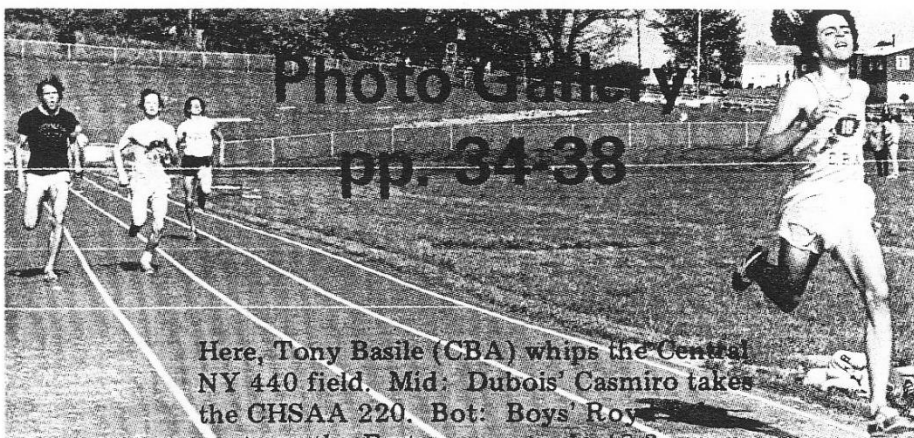

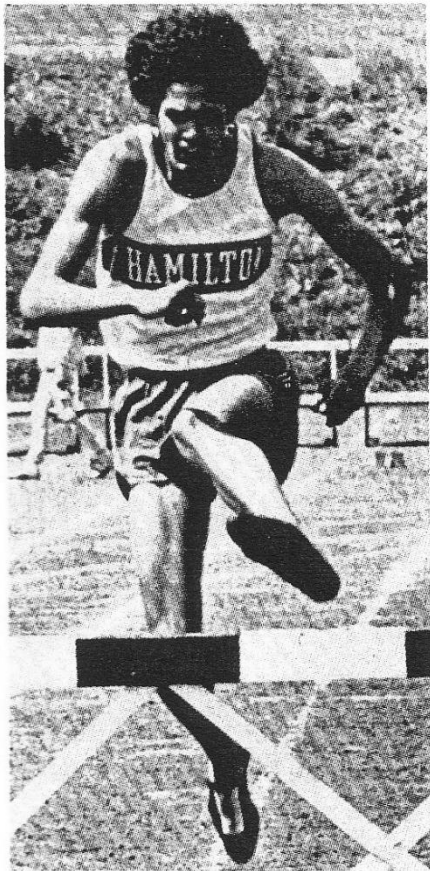

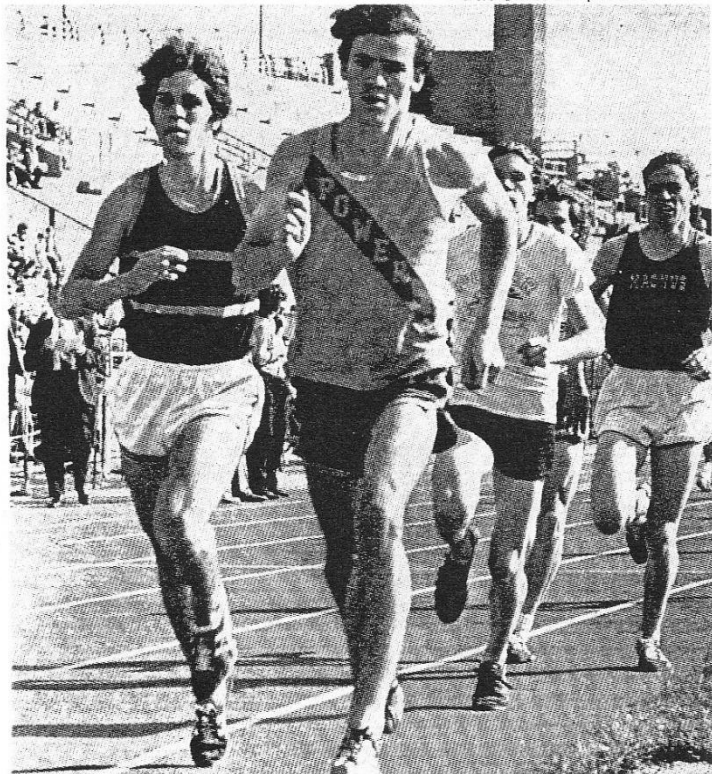
