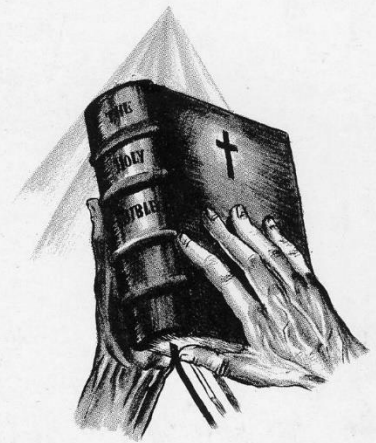

CROSS-COUNTRY TRACK

This year's track has made an impressive record for all concerned. Many of the trackmen are seniors such as "Jim" Mahoney, who holds top honors, with John Stoddard and "Dave" Smallwood as runners-up.

At the Manhattan College Meet Smallwood was the first Powerman to finish. During the Fordham College Meet, Mahoney ran a sensational race to cop second place in 14:01. In the Christian Brothers of Ireland Meet, Mahoney maintained his pace by winning first place over Rice. Other winners from Power were Smallwood, fourth, Bailey, thirteenth, Stoddard, sixteenth, and Rossler, eighteenth. In the Bronx-Manhattan-Westchester Meet, Mahoney again took second place. For the fourth time Mahoney led the Power team and placed eighth at the C. H. S. A. A. championship meet. Power placed fifth in the private schools meet and Mahoney finished fourth at the Mt. St. Michael's meet. In the Rice and Manhattan races Mahoney came in first with Stoddard and Smallwood close behind.

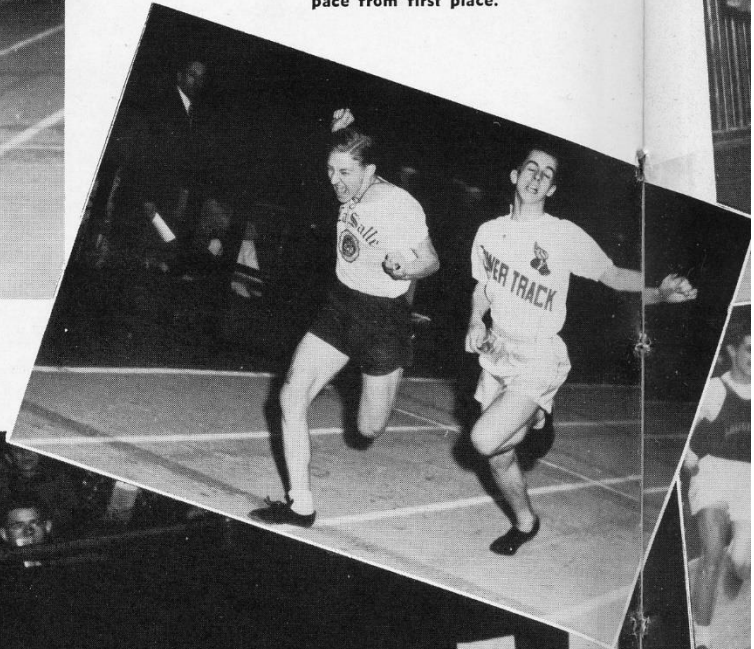

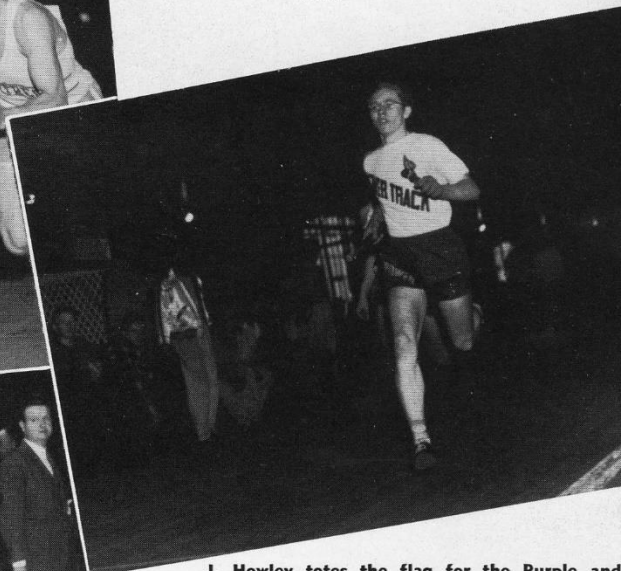

J. Doyle, second from right, carries the mail for Power in the mile relay at the Bronx Championships indoor meet.



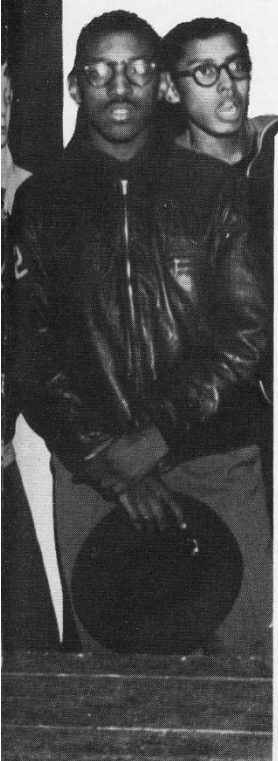
J. Howley totes the flag for the Purple and Gold on the second lap of the mile relay at 168th Street.

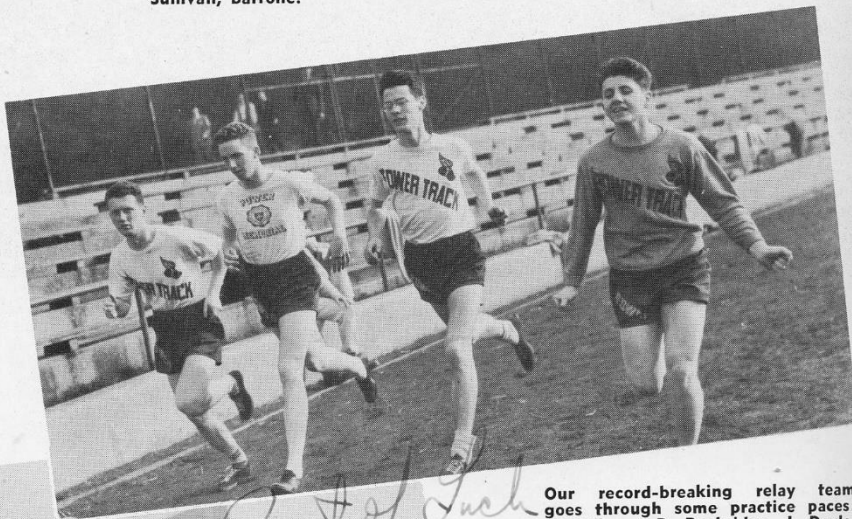


INDOOR SEASON

The Stuyvesant meet at the 33rd St. armory opened the indoor season. "Jim" Mahoney took third place in the mile run, with Rossler taking third in the 880 and Stoddard taking fifth in the 880 and 880 relays. In the St. Peter's, Mellrose, A. A. U., N. Y. A. C. and the IC4A meets, our teams missed by seconds. The Cardinal Spellman invitation found Mahoney taking second place. The 880-relay of Buckridge, O'Connor and Calhoun broke the meet record in the N. Y. U. meet while the boys gathered gold medals to boot. In the Manual meet in Brooklyn the novice mile relay of Howley, Lamb, Stoddard, and Doyle broke the meet record. Power was well represented in the Catholic High School meet at Madison Square Garden.



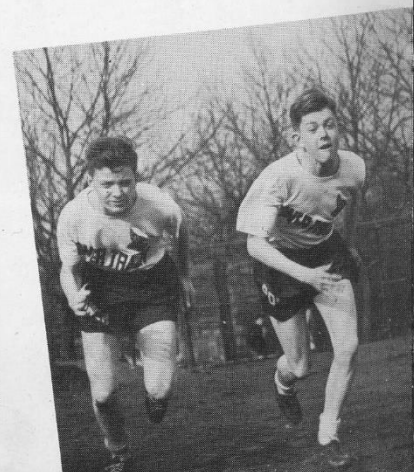
