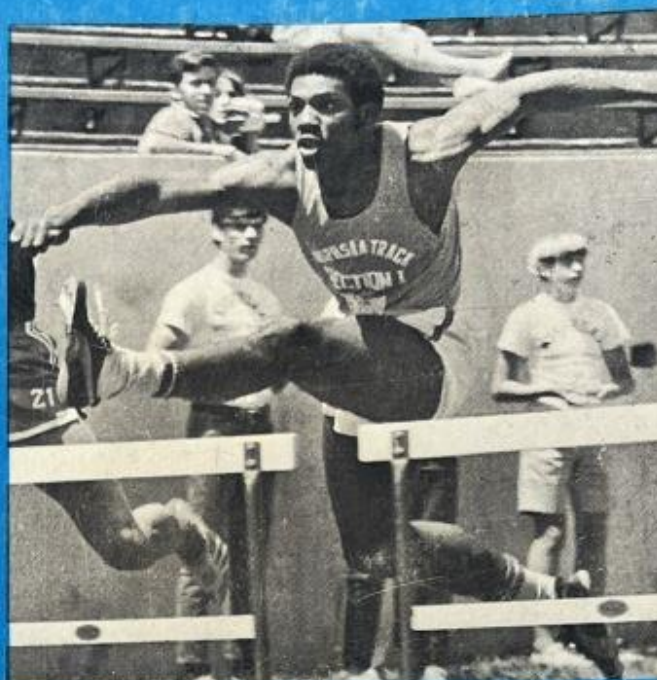

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FOREWORD

The most notable improvement in this 1971 edition are photographs that picture athletes from all parts of the state. Despite this addition, the stories and statistics that contributed to the success of last year's issue have not been lessened.

New York State Scholastic Track is now a parent publication with the start of its bi-weekly, State Track Newsletter. Designed to provide regular comprehensive coverage of competition throughout the state, the newsletter's 20 issues are available for \$2 at this address(\$3 after Jan. 1).

The leagues and associations that govern scholastic track in New York do an excellent job. However, NYSST believes that some of the rules imposed on athletes and competition by various groups are restrictive at times and do not provide for full recognition of outstanding achievements. For the most part, therefore, NYSST follows the policies(some are noted below) of Track & Field News with regard to records and statistical compilations.

The '70 outdoor lists considered all marks made during the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1969 and August 31, 1970. Class marks are the best outdoor performances made by athletes while competing as freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors. An athlete is considered to be a junior, for example, until the 1st of September prior to his senior year.

Furthermore, for purposes of maximum completeness, no performances have been excluded because of type of meet, form of competition or placing in an event. In cases in which anemometers were not in use during sprints, hurdles and horizontal jumps, decisions concerning wind velocity were made on the basis of reliable reports by seasoned correspondents.

Some performances were tailored to abide by international rules. All marks recorded in races of more than one mile were rounded off to the nearest fifth slower than the actual clocking(a 9:32.3 two-mile becomes 9:32.4). All fractions in distances over 100 feet--which pertain specifically to the discus, javelin and hammer--were eliminated. All other field performances with fractions in eighths were reduced to the nearest quarter below the actual mark. An exception is made when there is a conversion from meters to feet; in this case the eighths remained, as in the state indoor high jump record(6-11 1/8). Also with regard to indoor competition, oversized tracks are tracks greater than 220 yards. Excepting sprints and hurdles, performances made on such tracks have been indicated by asterisks and were not considered for records. (Other statistical explanations appear throughout the book.)

Located below some of the statistics are additions and changes. This was caused by late receipt of pertinent information that could not be placed among figures that were already prepared for printing. Most of these changes were listed on the Late News sheet.

Often used are the following abbreviations: n--non-winning; h--heat; m--meters; *--junior; **--sophomore; ***--freshman.

Distance marks in productive year

NYSST/Outdoor Review

The 1970 outdoor season was marked by consistent record-breaking in the middle and long distances and was characterized by depth in most events.

The outstanding marks were spiced by close competition as few athletes appeared able to leave the opposition far behind. Improvements were made in the quality of meets in all parts of New York, and upstaters made advances toward the productive stability of the Southern Tier.

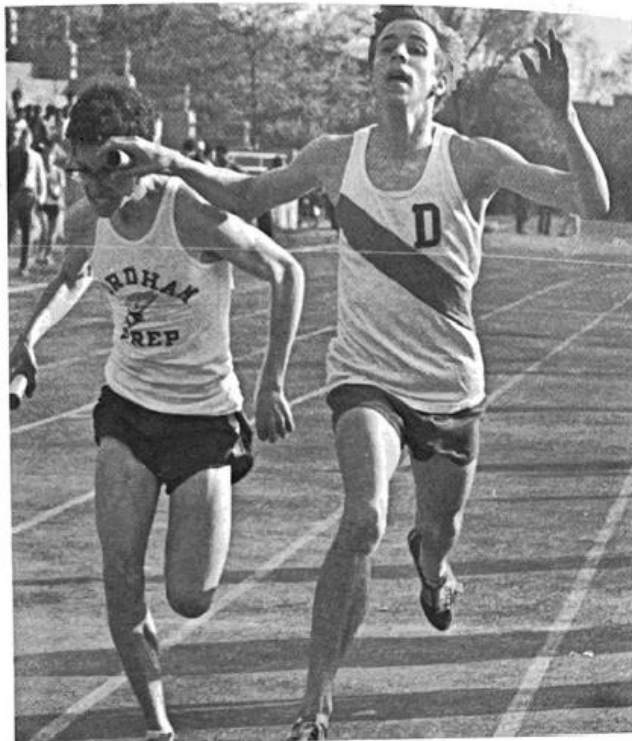
Bill Collins of Mt. Vernon paced the sprints along with Bob Barlette of Dunkirk. Barlette's

9.6 and 21.3s measure Collins' 9.6w, 9.8, 21.6t, and if an edge must be given, consider the latter's narrow win in the Intersectional 100. Harold Williams of Newtown(Elmhurst) was close with 9.6h and 21.6t.

A record 28 runners better 10.0 in the 100. Among them was Mike Sands, a '70 junior from Sheepshead(Bklyn), whose 9.8 is nothing extraordinary. However, at press time, it was reliably reported that he ran 9.5m(and 47.5n 440) while competing in his native Bahamas in a meet that qualified him for competition in the British Commonwealth Games in Scotland. Further confirmation is being sought.

The straight 220 was primarily an upstate event with the top five coming from northern and western areas. On the turn Collins 21.6 lead was shared by Williams. It was a banner year in the 440 as 32 athletes--twice as many as in '69--ran below 50 seconds. Jim Redd(Hamilton,Elmsford) was the leader at 47.7, until the Sands' mark is confirmed.

Ken Schappert's(Dubois,NYC) early-season 1:52.2n held up as the season's fastest 880. He was supported by 13 others who bettered 1:55, including three juniors and two sophs. Tony Colon of Power(NYC) and Denis Fikes of Rice(NYC) accounted for four state marks. Colon ran the 1500(3:48.2) and mile(4:06), Fikes the two-(9:03n) and three-mile(14:13.4n).

In a sense, New York was the finest hurdling state in view of the victories posted by Fred Singleton(Mt.Vernon) and Kevin Bligh(Herricks,New Hyde Park) in the Golden West. Singleton's 13.4w and 18.3tw and Bligh's 37.1 were among the best marks in the national meet. Subsequently, Singleton ran to a state mark of 13.5 in a national junior invitational in Ohio.

In the weights there was renewed strength with Joe Zelezniak of Mt. Pleasant(Schenectady) leading for the second straight year. Jerome Hannon, '70 junior from Memorial(Levittown), topped discus throwers with a mark of 173-4.

The horizontal jumps were marked by slight deficiencies. Greg Flippen, national ranking junior from Riverhead, did 25-0 to easily lead the long jump, but only two others reached 23 feet. The triple jump was the only event in which at least 20 athletes did not meet the pre-season qualifying standard. Only 16 did 45 feet or better with Mt. Vernon's Ken McBryde(49-0) leading 48-footers Gerald Lytle(Whitman,So.Huntington) and Tom Gilliams(Uniandale).

Not to be excluded are hurdlers Dave Herman of Shaker(Latham), 14.6 and 18.9n, and 38.1n intermediate runner, Mike Corbett of Lewis(Flushing).

Craig Segerlin of Cassadaga Valley (Sinclairville) vaulted 13-7 in a summer AAU meet to share the lead with Mark Maher of Eastridge(Rochester) and Neil Stone of Stepinac(White Plains) in an event still considered New York's weakest. Al Davis'(Evander,Bronx) 6-7½ led consistent Brian Bozzone of Nazareth(Bklyn), 6-6, and inconsistent Jeff Flanders of Southwestern (Jamestown), 6-6½. Molloy's Mike Wasp led the javelin with 197-9.

Newtown(Elmhurst), Boys(Bklyn) and Mt. Vernon led the sprint relays with times of 42.0, 1:27.5 and 3:16.0n, respectively. Fordham(Bronx) repeated its '69 feat by ranking nationally in the mile and two-mile relays with 8 different runners(3:17.9h, 7:49.8). Power(NYC) shattered the four-mile mark(17:45.6) and did 10:13.4 to top the DMR. Fordham did 3:29.9 in the SMR.

NYSPPHSA: balance of power shifts

NYSST/League Review

The NYSPPHSA, with its 736 member schools sprinkled throughout the state, enjoyed a typically successful year that was marked by the excellence of Fred Singleton(Mt. Vernon) and climaxed(for most) by its exciting Intersectional meet in Rochester.

Traditionally strong southern areas, specifically sections 1, 8 and 11, continued to reign supreme, but the balance of power shifted northward on the strength of athletes located in and around the Capital District.

Mt. Vernon paced section 1 to the title in a meet that saw Bill Collins(Mt.Vernon) nip Bob Barlette(Dunkirk) in the 100; Ken McBryde(Mt.Vernon) leap 49-0 in the TJ; Singleton post a double hurdles win; and Paul Nowicki(Nanuet), Jack Uhrig(Smithtown) and Vince DeRosa(Whitman,So.Huntington) survive crowded fields to capture the 880, mile and two-mile respectively. (Most of the 100, 220 and HH races were wind-aided.)

Mt. Vernon also won the Easterns, which included victories by Singleton in the highs(13.9), Greg Flippen(Riverhead) in the LJ(24-7½), Jim Redd(Hamilton,Elmsford) in the 440(47.7) and Kevin Bligh(Herricks,NH Park) in the 330 IH(37.7). Subsequently, Singleton did 13.4w, 13.5 and 18.3tw and Bligh ran 37.1.

PSAL: Tech dominates sprinters' year

Brooklyn Tech, which won the PSAL's X-C, indoor and outdoor titles, replaced Boys(Bklyn) High as the league's outstanding team in a sprinters' year that was dampened by a rain-soaked 75-school championship meet.

The borough championships were captured by Boys(Bklyn), New Dorp(Staten Is), Jackson(Queens), Clinton(Bronx) and Stuyvesant(Manhattan).

Among the league's top performers were sprinters Harold Williams of Newtown(Elmhurst) and Mike Sands of Sheepshead(Bklyn); quarter-milers Bill Wallace and Gary Gordon of Boys(Bklyn); half-miler Larry Cimato of New Dorp(SI); distance runner Marty Walsh of New Dorp(SI); hurdlers Clyde Valentine of Tech(Bklyn) and Mike Corbett of Lewis(Flushing); shot putter Des Smith of Tech(Bklyn); high jumper/triple jumper Al Davis of Evander(Bronx); vaulter Elton Kane of Evander(Bx); and long jumper Ray Lee of Jackson(Cambria Hts).

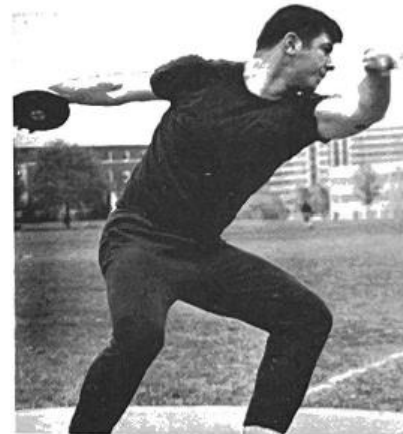

The distance running of Tony Colon(Power, NYC) and Denis Fikes(Rice, NYC) highlighted the season for the Catholic High Schools Athletic Association, whose title meet had an exciting finish with an ironic twist.

Prior to the meet, Molloy(Briarwood) and Stepinac(White Plains) captured the Bklyn. and NY Archdiocese(sectional) meets. But neither figured in the title finish won at the final event by Loughlin, whose intermediate hurdler placed third to give it a one-point triumph over St. Francis(Bklyn).

Among the other outstanding athletes were sprinter John Hallinan of Fordham(Bronx); quarter-miler Marty Towey of Reilly(Flushing); half-milers Ken Schappert and Cliff Bruce of Dubois(NYC); milers Bob Anastasio(Fordham) and Kevin Tracy of Stepinac(White Plains); high jumper Brian Bozzone of Nazareth(Bklyn); vaulter Neil Stone of Stepinac(White Plains); and shot putters Bruce Pohlot of Stepinac and Ralph Ferretta of Trinity(Hicksville).

Don Brown of CBA(Syracuse) and Brian Clemente of CBA(Albany) paced the NYSCHSAA.

Brown, a junior who holds the state soph 220s mark, ran a 48.9 440. Clemente did 57-6½ in the shot and was second in the state in the discus(171-11). Both won titles in the Inter-Diocesan meet, won by the Buffalo Diocese.

One of the league's outstanding teams was McQuaid(Rochester) Its sprinter, Mike Pignato, ran 9.9 and 21.8s.

Colon, Singleton leading athletes

For the second consecutive year New York State was fortunate to have among its competitors two rare athletes, two young men who did their thing better than any other schoolboys in the nation.

They were Fred Singleton of Mt. Vernon in the hurdles and Tony Colon of Power(NYC) Memorial in the mile, a pair of 18-year-old seniors who refused to be beaten to the finish line. Both shattered state records and posted victories in the Golden West(see pp. 16-17), just as award-winners Brian McElroy and Zach Gillon did in '69.

Despite the equity of their achievements, the complexion of their performances variedly greatly. Singleton usually had a few steps on the field at the third hurdle and merely coasted to an easy win. And for him to maintain competitive sharpness under such potentially weakening circumstances is a tribute to his sound mental preparation.

Colon, on the other hand, grew in a different way. In April, he became part of a dog-eat-dog relay grind that produced some of the most spectacular anchor leg duels ever in the east. His opposition was furnished primarily by Joe Savage of Roselle(N.J.)Catholic--affectionately labeled The Savage by admirers--and Denis Fikes of Rice(NYC), who had not been running very well at the time.

In the Queens-Iona Relays Colon posted a 1:52.8(880)--4:11.1(mile) anchor double(two days), the latter mark whipping Fikes(4:15.9) to give the Panthers both the distance medley and two-mile championships. At Penn the following week, Tony split with Savage, holding him off in the distance medley but unable to keep up with the Jersey star's 1:50.7 on the anchor of the two-mile. In the final segment of the relay triple, in New York, Tony ran 4:11.1 to beat Fikes in the individual mile and again fought off Savage to give Power yet another distance medley title.

Brother Bielen, Power coach, had now committed Tony to the mile. Subsequently, he ran with little pressure except for the stopwatch. In what

amounted to a warmup in early May, he cruised a 1:54.1 to capture the Private(AAPS)Schools 880. He then won miles in the Loucks, NY Sectional and CHSAA meets in 4:14.3, 4:14 and 4:08.8, state record.

Meanwhile, Singleton was having his own feast. In the Loucks meet he ran the 120 HH for the first time and won in 14.3; then, he ran the 180 lows in 18.6, a personal best. in the Eddy Games he lowered his bests to 18.4 and 13.8. After capturing the league title, Fred ran 14.0w and 18.5 in the NYSPHSAA, 13.9 in the Easterns and a state record 13.5 in the junior champ-

ionships in Ohio.

Colon passed up the Easterns in favor of graduation exercises. The layoff didn't hurt him. He clocked 4:06 to win the Golden West mile. Perhaps, Singleton was even more impressive. He won both the highs and lows in national record-equaling times of 13.4 and 18.3t; both marks were nullified because of excessive following winds.

Both athletes also excelled in other events. Colon ran a 9:14.6 two-mile and ran a 1:54.2(record) 880 and 2:15.7 1,000 indoors last winter. Singleton was the strong third leg on the 3:16.0n mile relay team. His fastest split was 47.4. He ran the 330 intermediates once--in 39.6n--and added a 21.9tn while being beaten by teammate Bill Collins in a dual meet 220. Indoors, Fred won the 60-yard highs in the Hayes, St. Francis and Easterns meets. His best time of 7.4 equaled the fastest of the season in New York. He is now at Penn State. Colon is attending Manhattan.

The outstanding field athlete of the year, and junior class award winner is Greg Flippen of Riverhead. Flippen, who won the Easterns long jump with a mark of 24-7½ (and placed in the TJ--46-10 3/4) is an outstanding horizontal jump prospect. He also captured the Intersectional title for the third straight year and leaped 25 feet in the Junior Olympic meet at Wantagh. He was a narrow choice over Jim Redd(Hamilton,Elmsford), who ran a 47.7 440.

The soph award is shared by Dwight Fowler, 1:54.9 half-miler from Lansingburgh and Dave Jackson, 9:24.2n two-mile from Sayville. Dave Pitzer of Ithaca was the freshmen standout with a new class pole vault record of 13 feet.

Mt. Vernon captures third crown

OUTDOOR--1970

Mt. Vernon High displayed extraordinary balance, particularly in the running events, to rate as one of the nation's finest scholastic track squads and certainly claim the 1970 team-of-the-year award for New York State.

In capturing its third title in the last four years, Mt. Vernon edged Tech (Bklyn), which completed the Public Schools Athletic League triple crown--team triumphs in the league's cross-country, indoor and outdoor meets.

Led by Fred Singleton in the hurdles and Bill Collins in the sprints, Mt. Vernon posted team victories in the Loucks Games, Eddy Games, County and Section meets, Eastern States and led Section 1 to the Intersectional title. The Westchester school scored 41½ points, more than other entire section save 8 (Nassau).

Singleton, co-athlete-of-the-year, was called "one of the greatest hurdlers of all time" by Fran Errota of Track & Field News after Fred's double victory in the Golden West Invitational. He clocked

13.4 (highs) and 18.3t (lows) to equal national records, but both marks were nullified because of excessive wind.

Fred also ran 13.5 for a state mark and 18.4 in addition to outstanding relay legs. Collins repeated as the Intersectional 100 champ and posted clockings of 9.6w, 9.8 and 21.6ht.

Other running stars included junior half-miler Steve Groom (1:53.2n), miler Greg Bryant (4:18.4n) and junior hurdler Mike Young (14.5h and 19.6n).

Ken McBryde, the state's leading triple jumper, did 49-0 as a junior to pace the field events. Collins

long jumped 22-73/4. Mitchell Woody did 12-6 in the vault. Ironically, not one quarter-miler made the 440 list, despite having the top mile relay team, one that ran 3:16 behind Lincoln (NJ) at the Penn Relays. The slight vacuum was created because Singleton (47.5r) and Collins did not run the event individually.

However, Groom did 49.7n from the start and junior Mike Patterson did 49.8n. Mt. Vernon also did a 1:28.3 880 relay.

Indoors, Collins did 6.5h, 9.9 (equals state mark) and 32.2n for the 60, 100 and 300, respectively.

Singleton clocked 7.4 for the 60 highs, and Bryant ran the two-mile in 9:29.4n. Mt. Vernon also posted a 1:31.1 880 relay on West Point's oversized track. Among its team triumphs were titles in the St. Francis and Eastern States meets.

With so many star competitors returning, MV may make it four out of five in '71.

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Golden West a scholastic Olympics

NYSST/Golden West

The Golden West Invitational is an extraordinary track meet. It brings the nation's outstanding seniors to Sacramento, Calif. to compete in 16 events. It is a veritable national championship; in essence, it is more than that: sort of a scholastic Olympic Games.

Athletes of all shapes and sizes, races and religions, filed into meet headquarters in Sacramento State College. They came from all parts of the United States, from Camp Springs, Md. to Oahu, Hawaii, from Meridian, Miss. to Enterprise, Ore. They represented varied attitudes and philosophies and joined together in an atmosphere of camaraderie similar to that expressed in international competitions. Sweatshirts and jerseys were exchanged. Oftentimes, track talk was replaced with evaluations of girls "back where I come from."

Come Saturday morning, though, tension mounted and breakfasts were lighter (even for weightmen). It was quiet around the pool in the afternoon. Ping Pong tables had been abandoned. Only a few sun-seeking coaches had not retired to their rooms.

In the evening, a soft breeze blew through the open end of Hughes Stadium—to the dismay of sprinters, hurdlers, horizontal jumpers and track nuts. The 100° heat had cooled to the 70's. Some 7,000 persons waited for the start of competition. More than 100 athletes from 31 states waited for their signals. Many had traveled thousands of miles and knew that a false start, foul jump or grazed hurdle might send them home without good news.

The javelin commenced the competition. Jack Hall (Pulaski, New Britain, Conn) took a 237-4 lead with only the final throw remaining an hour later. Meanwhile, with little fanfare, the pole vault, shot put and long jump had begun amid the pageantry of the opening ceremonies.

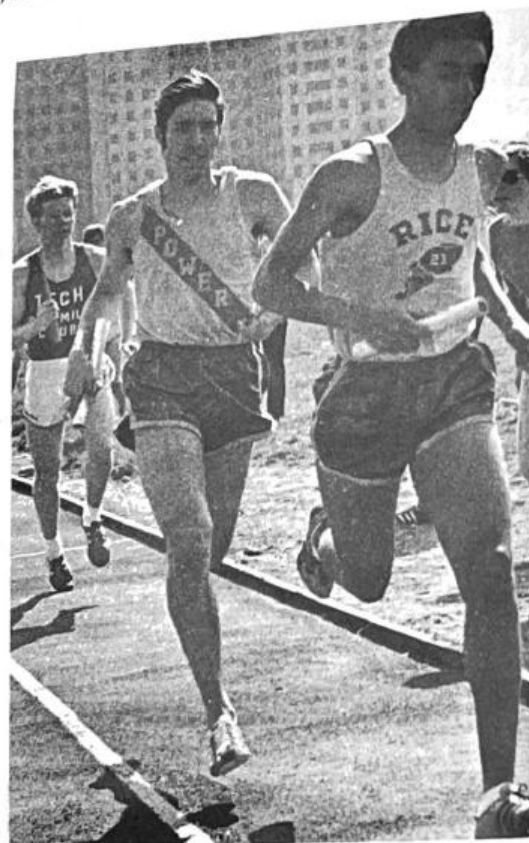
The lineup for the 120 HH was announced. Fred Singleton of Mt. Vernon had a step on the field midway through the race and confidently ran to a two-yard victory. The tone had been set for the evening—an Eastern coup. Fred's time of 13.4 equaled the national record, but the 7.1 mph wind disallowed the mark.

The excellent two-mile field was without California's 9-minute runner, Ron Johnson, who accidentally injured his foot at the dormitories. Nevertheless, the lineup was a dream, and it included Denis Fikes of Rice (NYC) and Mike Keogh of Essex Catholic (Newark, N.J.). The pair, just neighbors across the Hudson River, had to travel across the country to race each other for the first time.

After five laps it was all Keogh and Fikes. With two to go Denis pulled away, apparently to reduce the potency of Keogh's kick. Fikes maintained a huge lead with only a straightaway left and seemed assured of victory along with an 8:50 clocking. But he "hit a wall" and could barely stagger home as Keogh dashed by for a win in 8:54. Fikes was third in 9:03.

Meanwhile, Jesse Stuart had put the shot on the next train back to

Glasgow, Ky. (71-93/4) Joe Savage of Roselle (NJ) Catholic ran even with Kevin Reabe of Michigan for a half lap before Reabe edged ahead for a narrow win. Savage's 1:51 was .4 short.

Hall hung on in the javelin; Florida's Ray Robinson sprinted a windy 9.2 ("slowest field ever" said officials before the meet); and Gene White of Bristol, Pa. long jumped a windy 25-4½ for a total of six Eastern wind, thus far. In the 180 lows (turn) the margin was one yard and the wind was 5.08—and again the winner was Singleton and the mark was nullified.

Darwin Bond of Tenn. won a slow 440 in 48.1, and Robinson captured the 220t in a windy 20.7. The high jump ended with Oceanside's Jerry Culp giving Calif. its first win (record of 6-10¼).

The meet ended gloriously for NY'ers as Kevin Bligh won the 330 intermediates (NY's Mike Corbett 6th), and Tony Colon ran a 57.1 gun lap for a mile triumph in 4:06. The TJ, DT and PV results gave wins to Gerald Gaines (Va.), Chris Adams (Calif.) and Gordon Crail (Ind.). NY's Tom Gilliams and Gerald Lytle were third and sixth in the TJ.

Despite the Eastern supremacy on the victory stand, Calif.'s depth prevailed in the unofficial state standings, 88 to 54 (NYO, 44 (NJ), 37 (Texas).

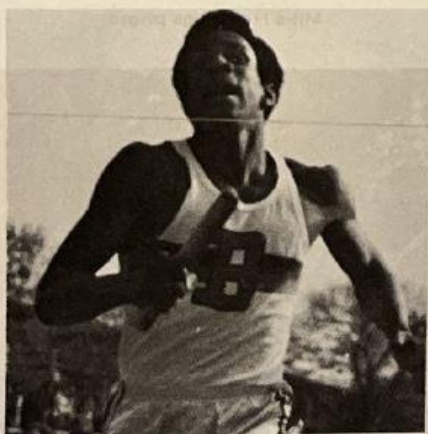

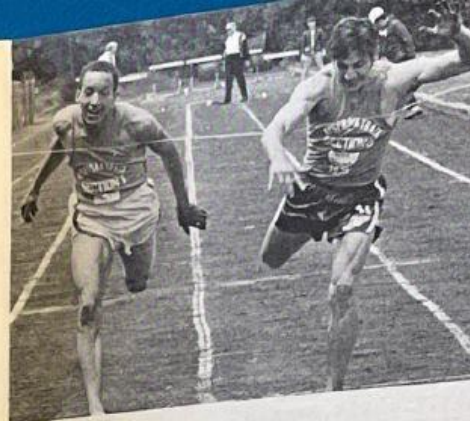

Training: stress syndrome important

NYSST/Training, Girls

(Ed Note: Warner, a 3:18:12 marathoner, is a philosophy student at Long Island University.)

Many articles on conditioning advocate either interval training or Long Slow Distance (LSD). The writers are emphatic in their support for one or the other.

Running--fortunately or unfortunately--is not a science. There are relative merits to various methods, including a very useful system endorsed by Hans Selyes. It's called the General Adaptation to Stress Syndrome, and it should be an important source or reference for coaches.

Selyes states that each person has a certain amount of adaptation energy which allows him to recover from stress. "The basis of all training," says distance runner Ken Moore, "is that an organism exposed to stress will get stronger if allowed to recover."

An athlete who constantly uses up a tremendous amount of energy will find himself in a state of exhaustion. An athlete's ability to withstand stress comes with maturity and a gradual buildup of training.

Unfortunately, long range goals are not always reached, caused, in part, by an immediate-success tendency that affects many runners. Only a small portion of the distance runners on the all-time list for New York (and other states as well) achieved great success after high school.

Whatever the philosophy of a coach, following Selyes' stress concept will result in better performances and add enjoyment to training.

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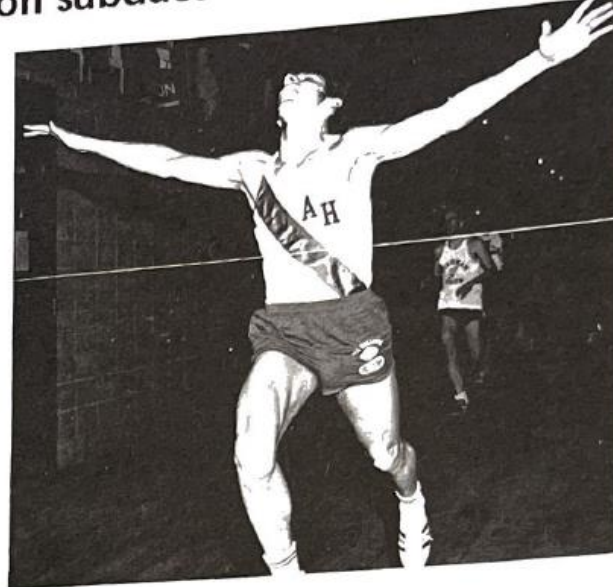

NYCST/Indoor Review

It was as though the State Armory in Washington Heights was the Alamo and Jersey's athletes stormed across the border to wage a war in their best Davy Crockett-style. Only this time the intruders won.

The 60-year-old fortress was infiltrated successfully and New Yorkers were badly bruised in 1970 by Garden Staters in a series of championship indoor meets. As always, most of the top competition was staged in the armory, where as many as 3,000 athletes from several states took part

on a single day. The schedule was supported by gatherings in Westchester and Long Island, a few up-state meets and some invitation events at Madison Square Garden.

Leading the Jersey surge were several Lincoln(Jersey City) sprinters, including Keith Davis, national 600 recordbreaker; Fred Geiger and Joe Savage of Roselle Catholic; Mike Keogh of Essex Catholic(Newark), and a dozen weightmen headed by Steve Adams and Bob Brady of St. Joseph's(Montvale) and Essex' Rudy Guevera.

Still, New Yorkers enjoyed a successful season with quality marks posted amid the excitement generated by screaming armory crowds.

Bill Collins(Mt. Vernon) equaled the state 100 record of 9.9, and junior Harold Williams(Newtown, Elmhurst) ran 6.4 to lead the 60. The 220, 300 and 440 were relatively lackluster with the highlight coming when Joe Primus(Lafayette, Bklyn) nipped Collins in the Eastern 300 in 32.1.

Larry Cimato(New Dorp, Staten Is) was pulled to a 1:13.2n 600 by Davis in the Easterns. Tony Colon of Power(NYC) ran to a state 880 mark(1:54.2), and Ken Schappert of Dubois(NYC) led the 1000(2:13.5n) while being beaten by Savage in a record race. Denis Fikes of Rice(NYC) ran 4:14.2 and 9:10.8 (state mark) for distance bests in the mile and two-mile. Three hurdlers ran 7.4 for the 60 highs. Brian Bozzone(Nazareth, Bklyn) high jumped 6-8, and eight men bettered 55 feet in the shot put.

Records were set in some seldom-contested events. They were: Dennis Morgan's 4.5 40; Ed Lazarus' 12-1/2 vault. Both were from White Plains. Also, Don Brown's(CBA, Syracuse) 60.7 500, and Justin Gubbins'(Sayville) 14:44.8n three-mile.

Among the team champions were Tech(Bklyn) in the PSAL, Molloy(Briarwood) in the CHSAA and Mt. Vernon in the Easterns.

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Fikes ends era in cross-country

NYSST/X-C Review

There ought to be a sign at Van Cortlandt Park that reads: "Denis Fikes: He came and he conquered. 1967-1969."

During that three-year period Fikes, of Rice High(NYC), dominated the hilly, 2½-mile Bronx course as no one had ever done before him. He captured the Catholic High Schools Athletic Association title three straight years and won 16 of 20 major championships including six out of six last fall in his senior year.

In each of the six Denis ran under 13 minutes. His best time was 12:25.7; his average time was 12:36.2. The only goal that eluded him was Marty Liquori's course record of 12:23.2, and Denis might have achieved that mark had he more competition to push him.

Fikes' triumphs came in the Iona, St. John's(C), NYU(B), Easterns(A), NY CHSAA and CHSAA meets. Among the other major NY victors at the Park, where thousands competed weekly, were: Vince DeRosa of Whitman(So.Huhtington) in NYU(D); Craig MacDonald of Melville(Setauket) in St. John's(A) and NYU(C); Marty Walsh of New Dorp(Staten Is) in NYU(A) and Public Schools Athletic League; Pete Barrett of Reilly(Flushing) in the Bklyn CHSAA, St. John's(B) and Privates, and Jack Uhrig of Smithtown in the Easterns(C).

In all, 17 New Yorkers bettered 13 minutes and another 18 bettered 13:15. (Individual and team champions in meets throughout the state are listed on the next page.)

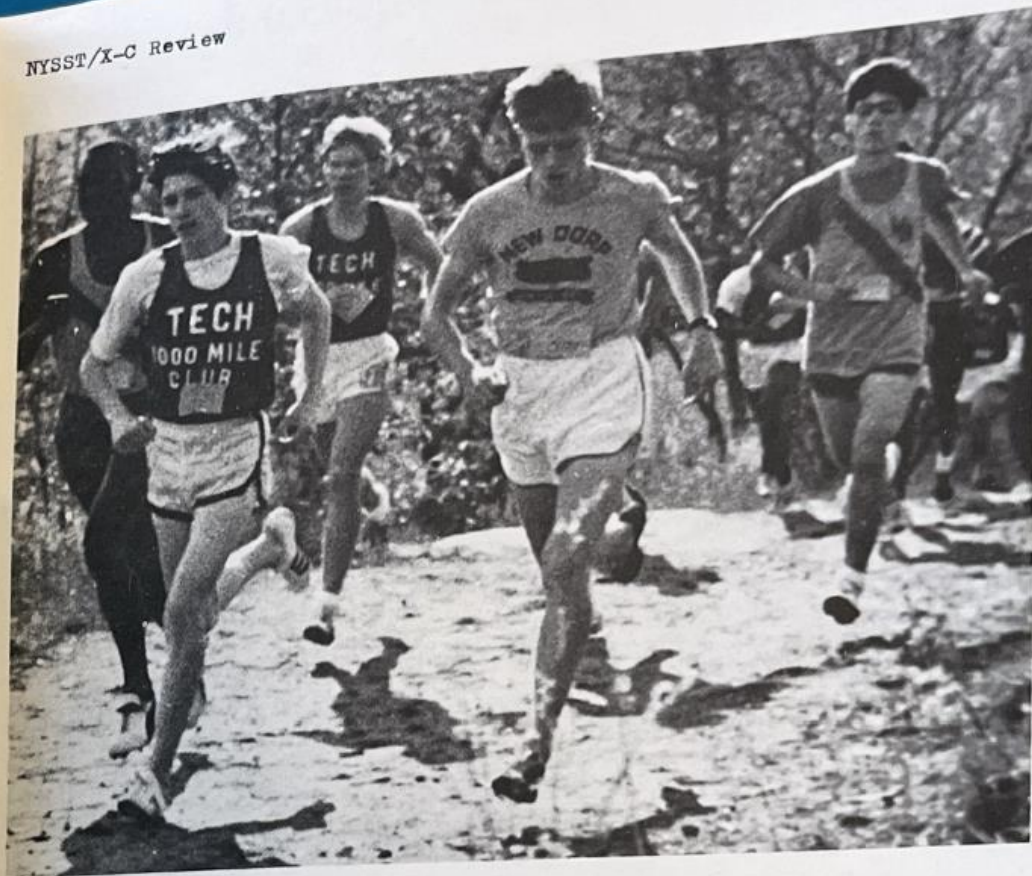
There was much outstanding competition elsewhere in the state. In the Intersectional meet at Albany State, champions were crowned in three divisions. Class A was won by DeRosa, 12:03.7, Mt. Vernon and Section 8. Class B went to MacDonald, Melville(Setauket) and Section 11. Class C was taken by John Hunt(Dobbs Ferry), Division(Levittown) and Section 8.

Schenectady's Grout Memorial Run produced six team champions. Jay Williams of Sacred Heart(Yonkers) ran the fastest time of 11:48.

Sprints highlight '71 forecast

NYSST/'71 Preview

Increasing excellence makes subsequent improvement very difficult. This situation gives New Yorkers a tough act to follow in 1971.

There is enough talent returning to indicate that the coming year will be a fine one. Whether it will outclass '70 is another question.

The sprints are loaded. Eight sub-10 flat dashmen are back, including Harold Williams(Newtown, Elmhurst), 9.6, and Mike Sands(Sheepshead, Bklyn), whose 9.5 in the Bahamas in July was not yet confirmed at press time. Williams' 21.6t leads a strong 220.

Jim Redd(Hamilton, Elmsford), 47.7, and Sands at 47.5(unverified) may challenge other 440 runners across the country for the national title. Their supporting cast is quite superb. Brooklyn's Boys High has Bill Wallace and Gary Gordon, 48.5 and 48.7, respectively. Don Brown(CBA, Syracuse), 48.9, and Charles Hall(Hempstead), 49.3, round out an impressive sextet.

Five half-milers who bettered 1:55 are back. Nassau champion Bob Marman(Sewanhaka, Floral Pk) leads the group at 1:52.4. Mt. Vernon's Steve Groom(1:53.2), Power's(NYC) Ray Naudain(1:53.9n) and two '70 sophs--Greg Moore(Free, Rome) and Dwight Fowler(Lansingburgh)--offer great promise.

Graduation has hurt the distance events. Rich Langford(Vochresville), 4:20.6, and Bob Maranville(Hudson Falls), 4:21.7, top the milers. Long Islanders Cliff Mandel(Sewanhaka, Floral Pk), 9:23.8n, and Dave Jackson(Sayville), 9:24.2n pace the two-mile along with Pete Barrett of Reilly(Flushing).

Dave Herman(Shaker, Latham) won't have to worry about Fred Singleton any more, but Dave Rider, who seems to have a patent on hurdling, has another fine prospect at Mt. Vernon. He's Mike Young and he's done 14.5h(120 HH) and 19.6n(180 LH). But that's not quite in line with Herman's 14.6 and 18.9n. Clyde Valentine(Tech, Bklyn), 14.9 over the 42" highs, has potential. Oceanside's Mike Fasolo and Art Campbell are strong in the 330 intermediates.

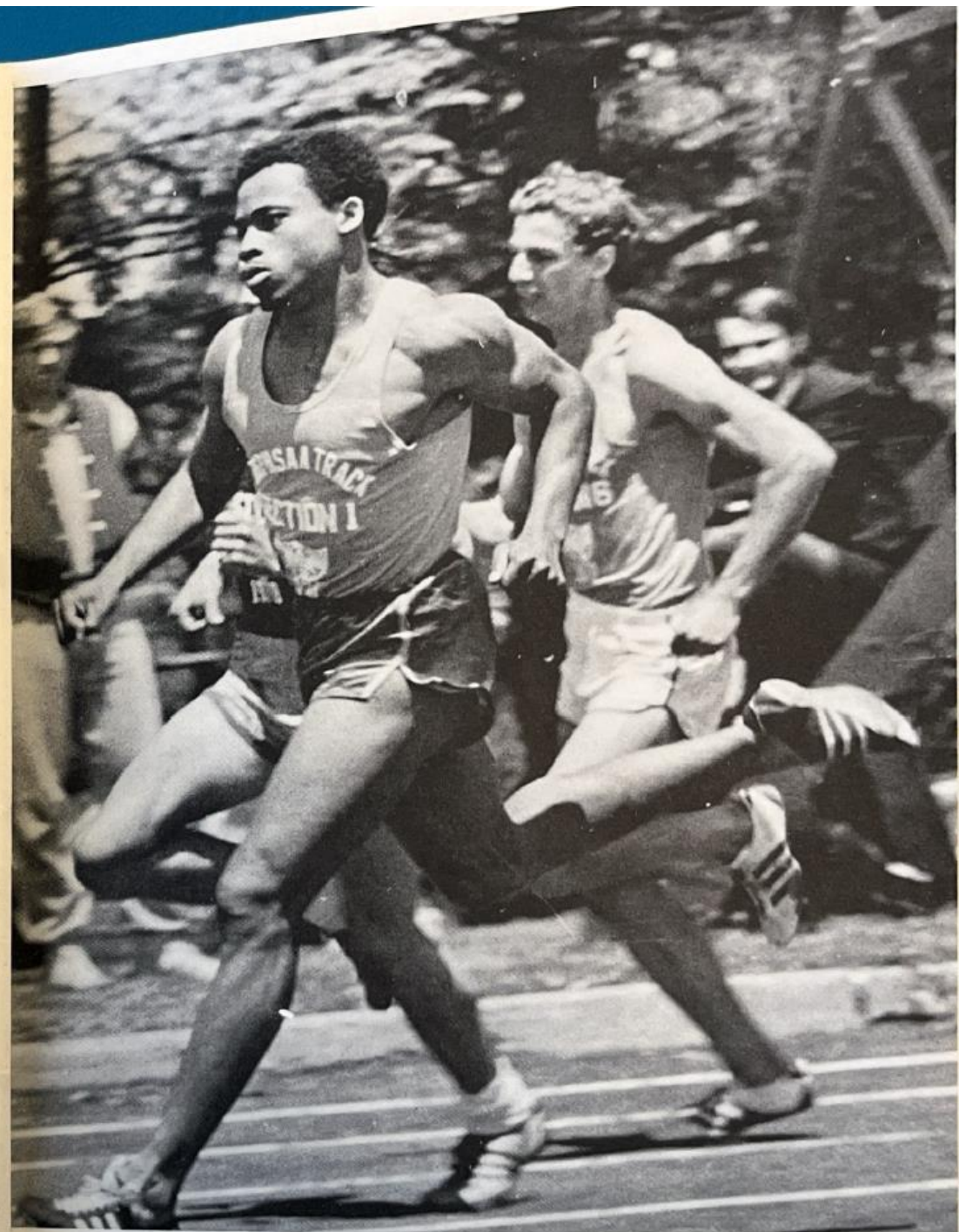
The field events seem well balanced with particular strength in the horizontal jumps.

Jerome Hannon(Memorial, Levittown), 173-4, paces six ranking discus throwers who may also boost the shot if they double successfully. Rich Wenskus(Wantagh), 56-3½, leads the returnees in that event.

Ken McBryde of Mt. Vernon has done 49-0 in the triple jump and is not yet finished. Neither are three others around 47 feet, including 25-foot long jumper Greg Flippen(Riverhead), who will be seeking his fourth consecutive Intersectional title in addition to the national championship.

Potential 14-footer in the vault is Craig Segerlin(Cassadaga Valley, Sinclairville), 13-7. A pair of 6-4 high jumpers are back and Ed McElroy(LaSalle, NYC) may become this state's second 200-foot javelin thrower.

Last year, Tony Colon's name did not appear in the preview. This year, he's on the cover. No doubt there are other unheralded athletes who will surge to stardom.

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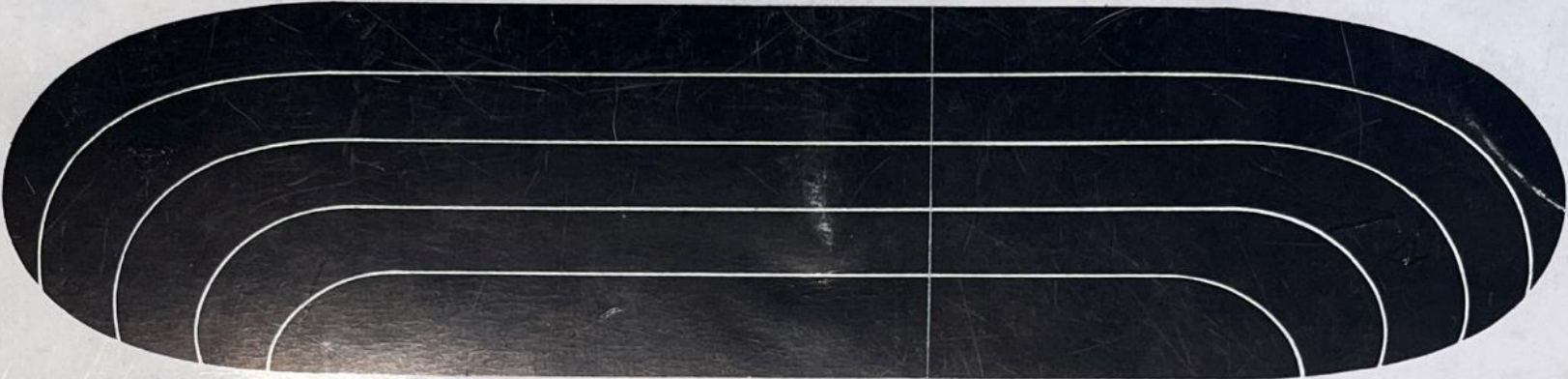


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
