

Ryun Strides Ahead

Success of United States track and field competitors in international competition can be attributed to the early start, organized competition and good coaching on the high school level.

A survey by the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations lists 16,249 schools who field track and field teams with a total of 569,687 individuals taking an active part. And the figures continue to climb each year. Only basketball tops track in both categories and football claims the most individual participants. Although numbers won't always produce class, it apparently has had something to do with continued progress in schoolboy track. More preps are able to reach international status and the depth of quality performers is staggering.

Most pleasing to us is the increased interest in areas once considered backward in the area of track and field. Each section of the country was represented the past season by a national record breaker, and each sector continues to produce top quality performers and more participants.

Most notable improvement has been noted in the southeastern part of the country. Louisiana and Florida have produced in the past, and now Tennessee, Alabama and Georgia are making rapid strides. Although Kansas Jim Ryun is the "Athlete-of-the-Year" following his astounding efforts as a miler over three campaigns, Alabama produced an athlete who could have claimed the honor in all but a few seasons.

Richmond Flowers Jr., son of the State Attorney General of Alabama, developed into the best high hurdler in prep history with his national mark of 13.5 and an even more incredible 13.8 over the higher 42" barriers.

Ryun, of course, is one of the all-time greats and his senior campaign was marked by improvement over his junior campaign when he became the first and only high schooler to run the mile under four minutes. He went on to claim the American mile mark with his fantastic 3:55.3 in the National AAU Championships last summer.

Californian Paul Wilson, like Ryun, was a barrier breaker with his 16-foot vault as a junior. He reached international status as a senior by improving to 16'6 $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

Ryun, Wilson and Flowers were only part of a tremendous crop of super athletes developed in the nation's high schools during the 1965 season. Even those claiming records could not claim absolute top billing over a number of others in the same event.

Examples of depth can best be illustrated by comparing the fantastic crop of 1964 prep athletes to those of last year. A total of 20 preps ran the 440 in 48.2 in 1964--the total was 31 last year. The 1964 list had 21 milers at 4:16.3 or better--it took at least a 4:15.3 to make the first 25 in '65. A mark of 6'6 $\frac{3}{4}$ " was cleared by 21 high jumpers in '64, but last year it took a 6'7" leap to make the first 25.

A dozen sprinters claimed legitimate 9.5 clockings in the 100 this past year as compared to a half dozen the previous campaign. Harold Busby (Muir, Pasadena, Calif) had 13 in that category, at least eight of which were under the allowable wind reading.

Relays were also marked by mass efforts in the outstanding category. Three teams from Texas and another from Oklahoma were under the listed national 440 record of 41.5 and five other Texas teams were under the once magic mark of 42.0. Five California teams and one from Texas were under 1:27.0 in the 880 sprint relay, Castlemont of Oakland, Calif, missing the 1:25.9 national mark by a tick with its 1:26.0.

Many great efforts were registered in the distance relay events including national records by Proviso West of Hillside, Ill, and Crespi Carmelite of Encino, Calif.

Those whose names have been etched into the record book, at least until the next outdoor campaign starts, are as follows in alphabetical order.

RICHMOND FLOWERS JR., (Sidney Lanier HS, Montgomery, Ala) Hottest track and field article ever developed in southeastern states. His 13.5 clipped two-tenths off the high hurdle record and he also did 13.8 over the higher 42-inch barriers. Also ran 18.2 in the 180-lows and 9.5 in the 100-yard dash.

CLYDE GLOSSON (Wheatley, San Antonio, Tex) His 20.6 around a turn is a new prep 220 standard. Also had a windy 9.4 and a legal 9.5 for the 100 and anchored the sprint relay team to a 41.4 clocking.

JOHNNY JOHNSON (Pacific Grove, Calif) New prep long jump record holder at 25'4 $\frac{3}{4}$ " but has yet to win a California State crown. Will have another chance as he has another season.

RICHARD JOYCE (Sierra, Whittier, Calif) Switched from the 440 to the 880 at mid-season and climaxed his campaign with a 1:48.8 record in the State meet.

BILL MCCLELLON (DeWitt Clinton HS, New York, NY) First prep ever over 7 feet, and he did it as a junior. Has competed in meets in England and Jamaica and is looking forward to a big season in 1966.

FOSS MILLER (Eastmont, East Wenatchee, Wash) The apple of the eyes in apple country with his record 232'9" toss in javelin.

DICK NARCESSIAN (Woonsocket, RI) Hammer throw a rare event on prep level, but it is popular and is thrown well by a number of athletes in New England. Narcessian's 209'9" is the best ever by a prep.

JIM RYUN (East, Wichita, Kans) Besides his incredible record 3:55.3 in the mile, Ryun had a 1:50.5 in 880 and 9:04 in breezing to the Golden West Invitational 2-mile crown. Also anchored East two-mile relay team to national mark of 7:42.9 with a fantastic 1:47.7.

PAUL SIMS (Parkview, Springfield, Mo) An outstanding hurdler over highs and lows, his best came out in 330-yard intermediates which are seldom run by preps. His 38.0 is the best ever.

PAUL WILSON (Warren, Downey, Calif) It was an off-day when he failed to clear 16 feet, and his 16'6 $\frac{3}{4}$ " was the best in the world until international

veterans warmed up for the summer meets.

In addition to individual standards, three relay marks fell with Proviso West of Hillside, Ill, claiming one but losing another:

CRESPI CARMELITE, Encino, Calif. A team composed of Don Bowler (4:28.4), Jim Romaine (4:30.9), Mike Kearns (4:20.9) and Dave Saykally (4:21.0) set a new mark for the four-man four-mile relay at 17:41.2.

PORT NECHES-GROVES HS, Port Neches, Tex. A team composed of Mike Simpson, Randy Byrd, Kenneth Bernard and Lyman Landry clocked 41.2 for the 440-yard relay in the State championship meet at Austin, Tex.

PROVISO WEST, Hillside, Ill. A team composed of Jerry Mentz (1:59.8), Al Jakosa (1:56.1), Bruce Bowman (1:54.2) and Craig Grant (1:51.8) ran 7:41.9 for the two-mile relay mark after East, Wichita, Kans, had done 7:42.9 earlier in the campaign.

By no means does the outstanding talent end with record claimants--a number of others were also under, over or past listed records and many others were within striking distance--but space prevents us from reviewing their achievements. Top athletes by class follow:

SENIOR (Track) Jim Ryun's feats have already been mentioned, and we trust there are no dissenters to our pick of the Kansas as "Athlete-of-the-Year." There have been few preps able to claim an American record. (Field) Paul Wilson was a world class performer too, with his fantastic vaulting exploits. He is a remarkably consistent athlete in an event known for inconsistent performers. They claimed the same honors as juniors.

JUNIOR (Track) Difficult to single out one, we had to settle for three who became known for competitive toughness. Rick Riley (Ferris of Spokane, Wash) ran 14:08.6 in the three-mile run, 9:11.2 in the two-mile and 4:11.6 in the mile. Art Dulong (Randolph, Mass) did 14:12.6, 9:00.8 and 4:15 for the same distances, Tim Danielson (Chula Vista, Calif) won the State mile crown easily in 4:08.0 and also did 1:53.9 in the 880 and 9:24.8 in the only two-mile try. (Field) Bill McClellon (DeWitt Clinton of New York City) is the first prep ever to clear 7-feet in the high jump and he did it twice, once under pressure in National AAU meet in San Diego. Great competitor.

SOPHOMORE (Track) This class was loaded with top competitors, but it is difficult to match the record of Robert Gonzales (Falfurrias, Tex) who enjoyed an unbeaten season enroute to his victory in the State meet in which he ran his fastest race--4:13.4. Had many sub-4:20 efforts, often under adverse conditions. (Field) No argument here, Clifford (Chip) Kell (Avondale, Ga) in metro Atlanta area, won the same honor as a freshman when his 59'1" effort was good for the class shot put record. He improved to 62'10 $\frac{3}{4}$ " for the soph class mark last spring.

FRESHMEN (Track) Bill Gaines (Clearview, NJ) clocked an impressive 9.6 and had a fine competitive record to share laurels with Doug Smith (West Jr High School, Sioux City, Ia) whose 4:15.5 is the all-time best mile for a ninth grader. (Field) Casey Carrigan (Orting Jr High School, Orting, Wash) is from an athletic family, and he displayed promise with a 13'3" jump in the pole vault.

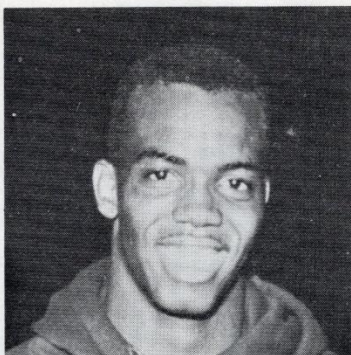

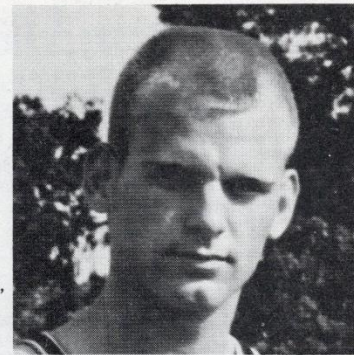

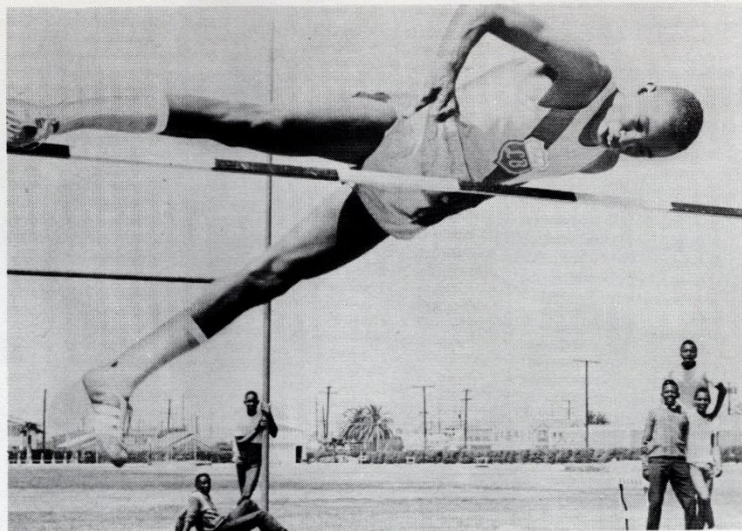

Billy Miles, Bishop Loughlin Memorial track coach for 19 years before deciding to take a leave of absence from the sport this season, admits missing the excitement and activity connected with the sport. His former assistant, Edward Bowes, has replaced him as the varsity coach at the Brooklyn school... Coach Lee Gould of Waltham, Mass, is hopeful his Donald Ricciatti gets down to 2:16 in the 1000-yard run this season after doing 2:20 in his opening meet. He was State Class A champ in the 880 last spring with a 1:56.8. Gould has another good boy in Joseph DeStefano who hit 57'6" in shot put in his first meet... Werner Beiersdoerfer, Banks High of Birmingham, Ala, ran 4:21.2 to win the mile run in the Senior Bowl Indoor meet. He was shooting for 4:16... Andy O'Reilly of Bishop Reilly ran a 1:57.6 half-mile leg during the Catholic High Schools Relay Carnival Dec. 18, but a 1:59.3 by Ed Zieminski paced the well-balanced Molloy team to the overall win in 8:04.0. A 4:26.6 mile by Ed Walsh led Molloy's Stanners to the distance medley win in 7:44.4.

Although Walter Keys of Mount Vernon was awarded the gold medal over Bill McClellon at the Bishop Loughlin Games last month when both cleared 6'5", each boy was awarded 4½ points in the competition and officially finished in a tie for first. Keys was given the gold medal because of fewer misses, but under Public School Athletic League rules, the event was ruled a tie and McClellon preserves his unbeaten status over two seasons... The Atlanta Track Club had top flight guests at its annual cross country banquet in December. Guest speakers were Jim Beatty, first American to run the mile under four minutes indoors and Don Bowden, first American to run a sub-four minute mile outdoors... Encina of Sacramento, Calif., featured high school performances in the Examiner Indoor meet in San Francisco Jan 8. Encina, with Greg Hall anchoring the 1920-yard medley relay team, clocked 3:59.9 as compared to the old mark of 4:01.4 set by Pittsburg High in the same meet the year previous.

Ron Stjern of Snohomish, Wash, is a good two-miler but is even better at longer distances. He was an easy winner of the Washington Track & Field Federation's Long Distance Development 8-mile Race Jan 15 with a clocking of 40:21.8, breaking his old record of 42:44 and old open mark of 41:06 set by Karl Weiser of the University of Washington last year. Teammate Walt Hoerath was second in 42:35 and Tom Rosenau of Mountlake Terrace third in 43:02... Andy Curtin of Lower Merion won the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.5 and Tony Giannini of the same school the 60-yard dash in 6.3 to top the field in the Track & Field Coaches Association of Greater Philadelphia indoor meet at Haverford College... Bill Gaines, 16-year old soph at Clearview High in Mullica Hill, NJ, clocked 6.2 in 60-yard sprint in Jersey City meet. He did 9.6 as a freshman during the last outdoor season... Mike Garvey must qualify as the hard-luck athlete of many years. The Roselle Catholic (Roselle Park, NJ) distance ace will miss the indoor season and possibly the outdoor campaign because of mononucleosis.

Dulong Clips Off 8:59.6

Boston, Mass, Jan 15--Arthur Dulong has started his 1966 indoor season with a faster clocking than he recorded at the close of the 1965 outdoor campaign.

The sensational Randolph, Mass, schoolboy ripped off an 8:59.6 clocking in the two-mile for fifth place in the Knights of Columbus Games here against some of the finest runners in the world.

Dulong on Dec 29 won the "outstanding athlete" laurels in the 21st annual Navy-NEAAU trackfest in South Boston for winning the Open mile in 4:22.5 and the 880 in 1:58.9

Cardinal Hayes Games: 440 Mark to Meade

New York City, Jan 15--Julio Meade of Jackson High School figures to be one of the nation's outstanding sprinters and those who saw him run here in the 17th annual Cardinal Hayes Games in the State Armory are fully convinced.

Meade outdueled Otis Hill, crack 440 ace from White Plains and also claimed a national standard of 49.4 on a flat floor surface. Hill passed the 220 mark in 22.4 and had a big lead before the fast pace began to tell on the White Plains runner. Meade caught Hill at the tape and was declared the winner although Hill was credited with the same time.

Four other meet marks fell in the meet won by White Plains with 17 points to 16½ for Jackson.

More World Records OK

Ten additional marks recorded in 1965 were ratified as world records by the Council of the IAAF during its January meeting.

Most significant approved mark was Michel Jazy's 3:53.6 mile. Notable performances still missing from the accepted list include three marks by Ron Clarke, at three-miles (12:52.4), six-miles (26:47.0) and 10,000-meters (27:39.4), and one each by Ludvik Daneke (213'11½" in the discus) and Gyula Zsivotsky (241'11" in the hammer).
