Sixty percent of the student body belong to the Knights of the Blessed Sacrament.





THE varsity cagers enjoyed a successful basketball season, capturing second place in the Manhattan-Bronx C.H.S.A.A. division and winning third-place trophies in the Irish Christian Brothers tournament and the Knights of Columbus tourney. Of the 28 games played, 20 of them were marked down in the win column. The season's record in league competition was 9 and 3. Only two opponents, Newtown and La Salle, managed to get better than an even draw in the season's series with the Panthers. Powers split with All Hallows, Hayes, and Xavier.


In the early days of the campaign, Power appeared to possess one of the best teams in its cage history. However, the loss of Frank O'Shea and Bob Holden shortly after Christmas proved a severe blow. Before leaving to enlist in the Navy, O'Shea set a new school-boy record in the Garden when he scored 16 points in the first half of the 50-17 victory over Brooklyn Prep.

Don Kennedy quickly whipped up a new combination consisting of Charlie Kane, Captain Bob Macken, John Hughes, John McManus, and Frank Donovan, which played well and, at times, brilliantly, but which showed a general lack of experience by tending to tighten up when the pressure increased, as it did in the tournament games. St. Ann's, a team we had beaten twice during the regular season, knocked us out of the St. Joan of Arc tourney. All Hallows, the team to beat in the Irish Christian Brothers tournament, set us back, 50-41, while Xavier, the ultimate K.C. winner, defeated us in a heart-breaking overtime struggle in in the semi-finals of the Knights of Columbus tournament.

However, the season's record as a whole is one of which Power may well be proud. A quick glance at the list of victims shows that the 20 triumphs were rolled up against formidable opposition. The team was always in there fighting and on every occasion gave a good account of itself.

The 1945 fans will for a long time remember the fine leadership and floorwork of Captain Bob Macken, the defensive play of Frank Donovan, the drive and hustle of John Hughes, the set-shooting and fancy passing of John McManus, and the general all-around ability of big Charlie Kane. John Herlihy joined the team too late in the season to put himself high in the scoring column but proved to be a good floorman and a heady ballplayer. Of the above six, Frank Donovan will be the only one returning next season. He, together with Vinnie Fox, George Keckeison, James Gill, and John Collins, will form the nucleus of next year's squad. Pat Caulfield and Joe Gowing moved up from the J.V. in the latter part of the season and showed a good deal of promise.

High scoring honors for the season went to hard-driving forward, John Hughes, who dropped in 273 points over the 28-game campaign. Charlie Kane and Bob Macken trailed him closely with 235 and 234 points respectively.




J. V. and Freshman Basketball





Important events for the track team this year will be the Penn Relays and the various C. H. S. A. A. meets. Several dual meets are projected.


