Foreword

It has always been the objective of this yearbook to give recognition to outstanding accomplishments by athletes and coaches who work so tenaciously at their crafts, and to foster interest in and understanding of the comprehensive scholastic track and field programs conducted in New York State.

With this in mind, NY State Scholastic Track has widened its scope. This 1973 edition is its largest ever--68 pages--made possible primarily by increased advertising revenue.

The additional pages include many new features, illustrations and much expanded statistical material. This was all done without the loss of any standard features--such as the three dozen action photos--that have made past editions widely heralded throughout the state.

The leagues and associations that govern scholastic track in NY do an excellent job. However, NYSST believes that some of the rules imposed on athletes and competition by various groups are restrictive at times and do not provide for full recognition of outstanding achievements. For the most part, therefore, NYSST follows the policies (some are noted below) of Track & Field News--the established "bible" of the sport--with regard to records and statistical compilations.

The '72 outdoor lists considered all marks made during the 12-month period beginning Sept. 1, 1971 and ending Aug. 31, 1972. Class marks are the best performances made by athletes while competing as freshmen, sophs, juniors and seniors. An athlete is considered to be a junior, for example, until the 1st of Sept. prior to his senior year.

Furthermore, for purposes of maximum completeness, no performances have been excluded because of type of meet, form of competition or placing in an event. In cases where anemometers were not in use during sprints, hurdles and horizontal jumps, decisions concerning wind velocity were made on the basis of reliable reports by seasoned correspondents.

(Other statistical explanations appear throughout the yearbook.)

Some often-used abbreviations are: n-non-winning, h-heat, m-meters, *-junior, **-sophomore and ***-freshman.

For the past two years NYSST also published a bi-weekly newsletter, 20 issues a year from Oct. through June. This was terminated for several reasons. However, the editor will now be writing a regular track column(s) for the NY State Sports Writers Assn., which publishes a weekly sports bulletin. See their advertisement in this edition.

Since printing costs--always on the rise--are expensive, the only way to expand future editions is to make healthy gains in advertising revenue. Any ad-minded reader whether he be a coach and/or businessman is advised to see the ad notice at the back.

A few stars and a lot of distance in '72

NYSST/Outdoor Review

There are periodic changes in decathlon tables as breakthroughs in progress affect certain events. Similarly, NY'ers will have to revise their standards for evaluation with statistics for 1973 revealing unprecedented depth in several events.

Camouflaged by a few superstars--a national hurdles champion, a 7-foot high jumper, NY's first 15-foot vaulter; and an abundance of relay excitement--was a long line of solid talent that produced a noteworthy pool of quality performances.

At least 34 athletes broke 50 seconds in the 440, led by powerful Ray Johnson of Mt. Pleasant (S'tady), the Intersectional winner, and Boys junior, Royd Lake, who clocked three 48.3's, two of which gave him the PSAL and Eastern titles. Only 15 bettered 50.0 in '66, although four were under 48.0.

In the 880 25 youngsters bettered 1:57 and, altogether, there were 56 under 1:59 with 16 of those returning in '73.

The most dramatic yardsticks of progress have come, not unexpectedly, in the distance events. No fewer than 48 competitors ran 4:25 or faster in the mile and 46 broke 9:40 in the 2-mile. Of that group, 24 have not yet been graduated. Again using '66 as a barometer, that year produced only 16 runners who bettered those standards in each event.

What does this mean for NY'ers? It means that coaches and athletes must put performances and goals in new perspective. For example, today's

young distance runner with hopes for statewide recognition would have to think beyond the 4:25 and 9:40 times, which might not even gain him local honors. Of course there's no shame in being "just" one of the Top 50, or one of the Top 500; it has been said that it is worthwhile just to take part.

The three biggest names were all from Long Island--Harold Schwab (Centereach), Jay Meisler (Farmingdale) and John Hochuli (Syosset).

Schwab set a state record in the 120 high hurdles (13.7) at Penn. Then, after recovering from an injury, took a windy 13.8/18.7 double in the Intersectionals and went on to a national 330 intermediates mark with a thrilling Golden West victory.

Meisler, a junior, did his best high jumping with a cast on his broken right wrist. He leaped 6-10 1/4 in May, 6-9 3/4 in the LIAC Games and hit the magic number "7" while taking fifth (behind collegians) in the US Junior (under 20) championships. His record leap tied the state mark and led the nation.

Hochuli became NY's first 15-foot pole vaulter--not once, but twice. He excited an I-S gathering at CW Post with a 15-3/4 clearance. Three days later he improved to 15-2.

And there were other highlights. Bill Dabney, a Boys High junior, ran unbeaten in scholastic competition en route to a 1:51.8 Easterns triumph. Perhaps even more significant was his 1:50 relay leg.

As indicated, top milers were everywhere. Mike Lizzul of St. Francis

won the talent-laden CHSAA finals in 4:15.2. Power's Matt Centrowitz, a junior, clicked off 4:15.9n, 4:15 and 4:13 after regaining the strength that was sapped by an early-season illness. Impressive doublers were Dan Ambrose of Aquinas(1:53.7/4:16.8), Steve Wynne of Vestal (1:55/4:18.2) and Alex Trammell of St.Joe's(1:53.5n/4:17).

Perhaps the most versatile athlete was New Dorp's Bill Jankunis, another junior. He ran 14.1, 19.4 and 38.9 in the hurdles and was also a 22-foot long jumper and 6-6 high jumper.

Besides Meisler and Hochuli, the field events were relatively unspectacular, although the vault saw 30 go over 13 feet or higher. However, last spring was the first since '61 in which NY did not have a triple jumper over 48 feet—not even one over 47'!

Boys and St. Joe's of Buffalo were the darlings of the relay races. The Kangaroos won a bevy of titles and posted clockings of 41.8, 1:26.6, 3:15.2, 7:48 and 3:27.3 for the 440, 880, mile, 2-mile and sprint medley, respectively. They never got a chance to run their best 880 combination against adequate competition.

St.Joe's, the cross-country champs who took their Cinderella team to NY and Philadelphia, pleased many a crowd with their awesome strength. The Trammell twins, Eric and Alex, and Gary Duszynski, led the upstarters

to Penn Relays triumphs of 7:46 and 10:06.4, just shy of the national record. Alex ran 3:00.8 for his three-quarters leg, the fastest ever by a schoolboy.

Some of the seldom-contested events were noteworthy. Schwab set a state mark in the 440 intermediates in 52.9. Smooth Mike Brown of LaSalle(NYC) ran three miles in 14:29.6 and the 3000-meter steeplechase in 9:33.8, one of the best ever by a prep. Molloy junior Steve Francks got the class javelin mark with a toss of 203-lm.

Boys and Molloy took the NYC PSAL and CHSAA crowns. Section 8 (Nassau) won its 20th Intersectional title and the Albany Diocesan won the depleted Inter-Diocesan meet.

Potsdam was the top team in the developing Northern NY-Adirondack region. The school's Ray Cyrus scored in the state vault and nearby Tupper Lake had a 4:23 miler in Ray Bigrow.

Harold Schwab is not the apocryphal athletic stereotype. Articulate, poised, bespectacled and angular, with long, silky hair, he chooses his words carefully and says what's on his mind.

Perhaps it was this intelligence, this seriousness, that put the extra edge on his hurdling, which led to a national scholastic championship and New York State Scholastic Track's Athlete-of-the-Year Award for 1972.

Sidelined in May with a muscle pull, the Center- each senior came back a month later to post double wins in his section (14.0/19.5t) and State Intersectional (13.8w/18.7w) meets. Then the Golden West; again, a setback.

At that Calif. meet he's accidentally rapped a few times by an opponent in the 120 highs and finishes fourth in 14.0. The 330's follow--his race, with his grace, his 48.8 440 speed (LIAC champ), his 13 steps between each and every hurdle. The pressure is intense. An ordinary hurdler would have crumbled.

Schwab's got to get out there. But he finds himself behind some fancy steppers

with only a straightaway to go. Then, he shocks everyone in sun-drenched Hughes Stadium by floating passed the field to a five-yard triumph in the national-record time of 36.3.

It was only his second IH race, his first a 37.6 NY Relays win. Prior to that he won the highs in the Penn Relays in 13.7, another state mark.

Schwab got his first taste of international competition in the USSR Junior meet (under 20) back in Sacramento, the site of his finest hour, on July 29. He had qualified third in the trials in late June

with a 52.9 440 IH, the fifth fastest ever by a school-boy.

Only the first two were to compete, with Harold along as an alternate. Ten minutes before the race, as he sat around munching peanuts, the

US's No. 2 man, Ron Primeau of UTEP, reportedly got cold feet. Enter Schwab, who would be the first to admit he looked miserable on nat'l television as he ran fourth in 54.2.

Jay Weisler of Farmingdale was named both the top field athlete in the state and the leading junior athlete. Boys' Bill Dabney was the top junior runner. The sophs are LI's Mark Belger and Andy Pintus. Jon Berich is the freshman winner.

Explanation of Selections:

100: Although somewhat inconsistent because of an injury, Meyer still ran 9.7 to beat Smith in the So. Shore and did it when it counted in the Intersectionals (I-S). Evans edged tough soph Russell of Lafayette to win the PSAL in 9.7. Russell just missed being selected as did Gomer's Pray, Easterns champion in 9.8, a time he also posted in taking the Eddy 100.

220: Bartlett, the I-S champ in a windy 21.3, is the narrow choice over Carey, PSAL winner with 21.7 best (21.6w). They never met. Williams, tough in Capital area all season, second to Bartlett with 21.5w in I-S.

440: Johnson, unbeaten with a 48.4 in the rain, also had a 47.5 leg as part of four races in the windy I-S. Lake a hair behind with three 48.3's plus the PSAL and Easterns title. They never met. Pre-season favorite Cox couldn't put it together until late June with a leading 48.2.

880: Dabney clearly the best. Gabriel, I-S winner in 1:55, beat a tough field, including Belger, by more than the time differences would indicate. Trammell, who ran all the way with Dabney early in the season, was never heard from individually again. Belger's 1:53.6 Easterns mark was close.

mile: Toughest selections. Lizzul beat Centrowitz and won the year's toughest race in the CHSAA as six broke 4:20. Wynne ran well in the Southern Tier and took the I-S. Matt, injured, came back with 4:15 and 4:13 late in the season.

2-mile: Three clear selections. Too bad the group never met.

Hurdles: Schwab and Jankunis secure in all three. Heffernan and Parker, I-S runnersup, notch second. Duncan took a quality CHSAA final in the IH.

Field: Meisler in HJ. Rom's solid jumping a nose over Fields, who won I-S, beating Meisler...Vault is clear...Sterling class of LJ with Sinclair very narrow over rival Nathaniel, both consistent...TJ to steady winner Sinclair over I-S champ Schiffler and runnerup Johnson...Bello and Harper solid in pacing weights.

Relays: Boys and St. Joe's shared the billing with others vying for next spots.

With perhaps as many as eight squads in contention, Uniondale edged the tightly-knit field and was named Team-of-the-Year for 1972 by NY State Scholastic Track.

Uniondale, coached by Al Krauser, was the Nassau champion and led all scorers in the Intersectionals. Mike Sterling, the state's leading long jumper and Golden West participant, led the team. The Dalers also boasted such top dashmen as Willie Smith (9.7) and Bill Graba (22.2), who formed the core of great sprint relays (1:28.4n). Among its other headliners were Tim Bilash (49.6n/1:58.6) and jumpers Jim Tate (23-4/45-4n) and Jorman Granger (46-2 3/4).

Molloy, the NYC Catholic schools champion, ranks a close second. The Stanners were very deep in the 440 and 880 and had talent distributed well into the distances and field. Mike Sweeney (49.6n), Tony Blaha (164-4) and Steve Francks (203-1) were a few of its stars.

Riverhead's balance gained the Blue Wave the third spot. They had a great crop of fieldmen in addition to top sprinters that were anchored by Intersectional 220 titlist, Dan Bartlett.

Boys High—with no fieldmen except a couple of sprinters who could long jump 20 feet if they had to—places fourth. But last spring as in every spring the Kangaroos running feats become legendary. The names that dot the Top-25 listings contributed to several major titles including two Penn Relays championships plus the NYC Public Schools and Eastern States crowns. The returning Bill Dabney (1:51.8, 1:50r) and Royd Lake (48.3, 47.9r) were also part of several top relay combos.

Mephram, the youngest ranking team with bushels of sophs and juniors, rounds out the top five. They were headed by Mark Belger, their 1:53.6 half-miler.

Retiring Blatt: "Track is special ..."

NYSST/Blatt Retires

Milt Blatt, one of the most successful and well-loved track coaches in NY State, retired from Andrew Jackson HS in June after 42 years as a teacher, coach and college advisor. "Of course I'm going to miss it," he admitted. "Track is a special world ...when it's in your blood it's difficult to stay away."

Blatt, who taught English, started his coaching career in 1931 with tennis and basketball (ass't) at Jamaica, his alma mater. He moved to Jackson when it opened in '37 and continued with tennis, which, he insists, he knows better than track. But Jackson had no track team until a few anxious boys asked Milt to start one.

And since that day in '46 Jackson teams have done it all under Milt: 14 PSAL titles, 27 Queens triumphs...names like Bobby Ellison, Art Chichlow, Neville Christian, Doug Dobbs, Julio Meade, La-motte Hyman, Sam Thomas, Mark Ferrell and Vinnie Mathews...a nat'l 2-mile relay record. Last season Milt said, "I get a big kick out of this."

Weather: Rain ruined big-meet-weekends of Apr. 22 and May 20. It came down in most of the state for at least 20 days during June.

Many freshmen are not so "green" anymore. Their naivete has been replaced by some sophistication as they become more aware of the nuances of track and field. The merits of such cognizance could be argued. Nevertheless, the cold facts are that today's freshmen athletes are quite superior to their counterparts of recent years.

No, they're not breaking records in droves; track is not swimming. But more of them are there--winning medals, comprising victorious relays, placing among the leaders, helping teams take dual meets. It's happening in every season--cross-country, indoor and outdoor. This past spring there were several freshman, in particular, who stood out above the rest.

First and foremost, there was Nanuet's Don Berich, a hurdler. He acquired some needed experience indoors when he made the Intersectional finals and posted a class mark of 7.7 over five flights. He picked up the outdoor class mark in the 120 highs, 14.7, only one-tenth off the nat'l record. Actually, he did clock a 14.5, but it was wind-aided, in the Intersectional semis. He also has impressed Knights coach Dave Hanson with some tough mile relay legs.

Another top newcomer was lanky Oliver Thomas of South Shore(Bklyn). Ollie enjoyed successful X-C and indoor(4:37 mile) seasons before achieving an outdoor best of 4:31.8 with a third in the Bklyn Public Schools meet.

There were others in the distance ranks. Colonie's Stan Purzycki, 4:35.7 mile recordholder indoors, ran mostly relays outdoors with no significant solo effort received here. Gary

Lindquist of Mepham posted bests of 4:37 and 9:49. Ed Williams of Edison ran 9:51 for a spot in the Queens 2-mile. No. Salem's George Vogel, 14, had a 9:50 2-mile.

Of course, there was a score of great sophs, people like Mark Belger of Mepham(1:53.6), Ken Murphy of No. Salem(1:56/4:20.2), Andy Pinatus of HHH(13-10), Mark Ogden of Molloy(4:25.6/9:29.8) and Mike Solomon of Wingate(49.8).

Although gaining in intelligence, these young kids are still very impressionable. Whether their scholastic track careers prove worthwhile may depend on the way they are handled by their coaches.

Schwab beats the heat in GWI

Harold Schwab of Centereach was hotter than the heat in Hughes Stadium June 17 in the Golden West Invitational in Sacramento, Calif.

With temperatures pressing 100 degrees on a

clear and windless afternoon, Schwab set one of two national records in the invitation meet for seniors. Utilizing only 13 steps between hurdles for the entire race, the Cougar ace came from behind to win by five yards in 36.3, which bettered the mark of 36.6 set a week earlier. Schwab might have had a double win, but in the 120's he was hit repeatedly (and accidentally) by an opponent in an adjacent lane and "couldn't run my race." He ended up fourth in 14 flat.

The other national mark came in the LJ when Sacramento's Ken Duncan thrilled the hometown crowd with a leap of 26-2 $\frac{1}{4}$. In that event NY's Mike Sterling (Uniondale), a late entry, placed 7th with 22-2 $\frac{1}{4}$. He was bothered by the heat, which also affected the other two NY'ers, Kevin McCarey of Cathedral and John Hochuli of Syosset.

McCarey said, "I couldn't breathe...I was dragging my feet" after a creditable fourth in 9:05 (2-mile). Hochuli failed to clear the opening vault height of 14-0 after having done 15-2 four days before. "I was coming too close on the bar," he noted.

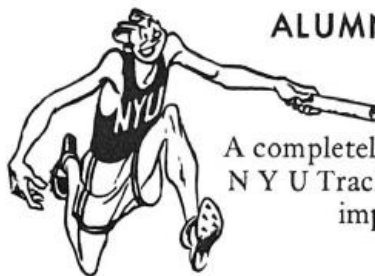
Altogether 57 NY'ers have competed in the GWI since 1961. Besides Schwab, there have been nine other winners starting with Bob Beamon (TJ)

Bro. J.G. Bielen, Power Memorial, NYC:

For the young athlete, the most important aspect of track is the "team". He joins to belong to something, to make friends. He leans on the group for support, entertainment and companionship. For this reason, efforts for a large program are essential. As many freshmen as possible must be coerced to try the track program. Poor runners, mediocre runners, great runners must all be welcomed out. A runner's times on the track will not be as important to him as the making of friends, and the more friends he has to choose from the greater the chance that he will by "peer pressure" remain on the team. A youngster at that age is self-conscious...the group protects him from being singled out too often. By its very nature the group will provide inner-squad competitiveness, essential to improvement.

Be very patient. Track is supposed to be recreation, fun. Make it that way. Tell them they are doing great. Take an interest in their studies and in personal matters. Keep telling them at group meetings how much track is doing for them. Sell them the program! Finally, there is no substitute for ingenuity and enthusiasm on the part of the coach for keeping kids out for track. And even then, expect to lose some.

Marty Lewis, South Shore, Brooklyn: It is difficult to spell out an approach to coaching that will pertain to all youngsters at a given time. Each athlete must be handled individually because each has his own personal desires, and each participates in the sport for his own personal reasons.

In dealing with the young, gifted athlete, I have found that the setting of realistic goals, goals that are attainable, has proven to be one of the most favorable means of guiding his development. Coach and athlete, together, discuss, evaluate and alter these goals from time to time. There are immediate goals, longer range goals and "dream goals."

The selection of events for the athlete is important in his development. He should be given many opportunities to try varied events. A choice of several areas should be made fairly early, i.e. sprints, middle distance, etc., but further refinement should be saved for the junior year. Specialization may be determined by need, and this may be the need of the athlete and/or his team. We can't disassociate the boy from his peers because he may be called upon to make certain sacrifices at times, which

Coaching the young star

How do you handle the young athlete--the 15-year-old freshman who has demonstrated extraordinary potential? How do you get the most out of him before he is graduated and, at the same time, not "burn him out" so that he loses his competitive desires? How do you bring along this special talent, whether he be a weightman, jumper, sprinter, hurdler or distance runner?

This was asked of these coaches (and others in upstate areas who apparently did not receive the request since it was sent in late June when school may have been out).

might seem harmful to his total development.

The young, talented athlete should be allowed to excel in his age group. He will have ample opportunities later on to take on all comers. An occasional step up into tougher competition should give insights into how the training is progressing.

The athlete and coach should experiment with different methods of training. Together they should decide which methods produce the best results.

The two must communicate freely. I do not believe that there can be too much conversation between coach and athlete. Many difficulties arise when one or the other won't, or can't, exchange ideas.

Paul Limmer, Mepham, Bellmore: As you know, 14- and 15-year-old boys form the backbone of your squad. That presents a difficult situation in that try as you will to keep the youngsters out of the limelight and away from the big pressure, it is almost impossible.

This problem is almost exclusively the province of distance runners, and, fortunately, with the three seasons of competition, they have an advantage. Prior to the spring, the young, budding star is almost let run loose, being that we almost fail to acknowledge his prowess. After two seasons (fall & winter) he has discovered this himself, and it may mean more to him because of this. With very little pressure exerted during X-C, and a little more during the winter, we feel any of our boys--whether he is 14 or 19--can handle 3 or 4 high-powered outdoor seasons. The problem is trying to get 9 or 12 pressure-packed seasons out of a boy before he graduates.

Tony Perrone, Molloy, Jamaica, Queens: 1. Developing in track and field is a continuing process and as such demands a progressive buildup of endurance, speed and technique, etc. over a period which may be short or may extend over a good number of years. 2. I would hope that a HS athlete would acquire an interest in track as a sport and as a conditioner, a lifetime interest. 3. This interest, I feel, can only be instilled in an athlete by permitting him to develop at his own rate. 4. There are no sacred formulas, no instant success plans; just common sense in trying to give each athlete the amount of work which would enable him to achieve his own goal for that meet, that season, that year or eventually in his career. 5. In order to eliminate as much internal pressure as possible, I try to psychologically and physiologically condition the team for a two- or three-peak season: Catholic champs in X-C, indoor and outdoor.

Doug Terry, Boys High, Brooklyn: In dealing with a young man who seems to possess the potential to be a great track star you must first assess his physical and mental makeup. If he is strong both physically and mentally, then you can proceed to bring out his potentials as the competition deems it necessary. However, a coach should be careful not to be influenced by outside track enthusiasts. This can result in an attempt to develop the team's talent too soon. I've found it necessary to hold

You were expecting a champion. Well, this is merely the tale of an ordinary jogger/runner who found out about high altitude workouts amid magnificent scenery during a three-week trip (with his wife) out West in July. That's right, it's your friendly editor, me!

I had been out West before but never with athletic credentials. I had been "training" (for what?) and was now an "athlete", replete with, among other things, two pairs of Tigers, a \$20 sweatsuit and shirts reading Munich '72 and Adidas. At least I was in style.

My first exercise was a 30-minute (about 4 miles) run through the streets of Salt Lake City, at 4700' and in 90° temperatures. Ah, back to the motel pool. My nervous wife (hereafter NW) has pleaded, "Promise me you won't make any turns--you'll get lost."

We're in Moran, Wyo., near the majestic Grand Tetons. I took 16 laps around the motel and parking lot, about 4 miles. Felt OK but also felt the 6200'. A little boy, about 7, joined me for 40 yards. I was afraid he was one of those age-group hotshots who might embarrass me. I jogged a "victory" lap so that the NW could get me with the movie camera.

Coincidentally, a waitress in the motel restaurant informed me she was a sprinter/hurdler who made the girls' state finals back in HS in Ponney Rock, Kans (pop. 450). She said she would have liked to run with me, and I gave her my card and invited her to call us if she ever gets to NY.

Up to Yellowstone Park, amid bears, moose and the like, at 7800'. After a six-mile hike in the Tetons earlier in the day, I took a few miles near Yellowstone Lake. The altitude hurt. Same thing the next day--felt stinging.

I developed a pretty bad cold, sore throat, cough and all, and had to see a doctor. This sidelined me for five days. This made the NW happy, even though morning sickness was still getting to her (the baby is due around the '73 Millrose Games). I was upset I had missed running around Glacier Park's (Mont.) gorgeous Lake MacDonald.

After a 320-mile drive we're in Canada's Banff Park. Took 30 minutes through town; very relaxing. It was cool--wore sweats and a hooded sweat shirt, which came in handy the following day during a driving rain. And the next day the NW cried because she didn't want to be left alone as I ran down the road in the dark.

North to Jasper Park. Ran only one day here, but it was most gratifying: an eight-miler to and from the Jasper Pk. Lodge, a hotel of international repute whose \$74/day charge is worth that and more. I knew the NW would be in tears when I returned, having told her I was only going out for 30 minutes. It's not every runner who can do 8 miles in 30 min.

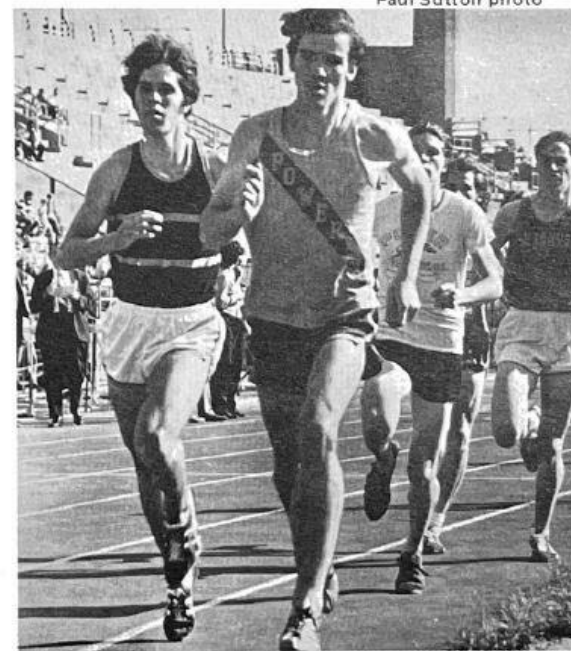

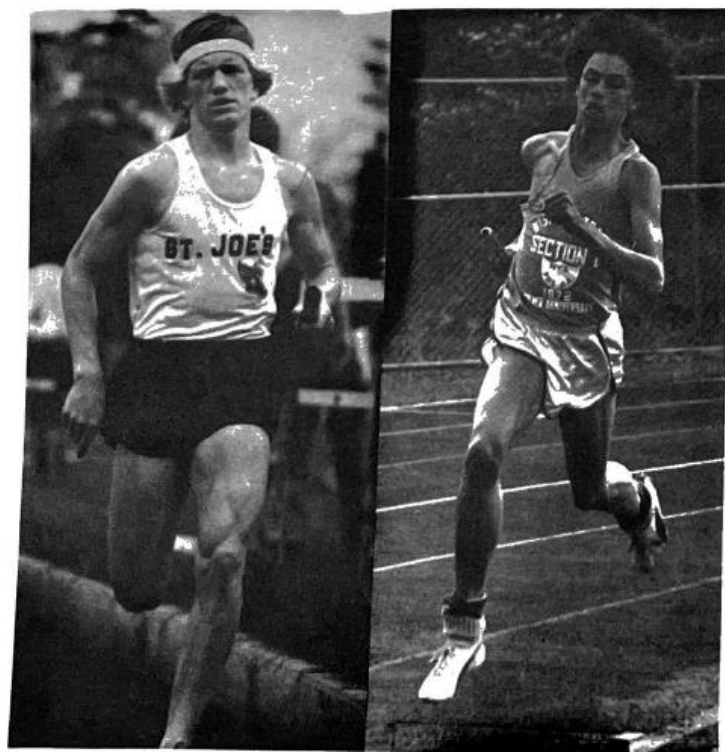

some of my young athletes back; that is, refrain from using them in certain events or meets. For example, neither James Jackson or Williams Dabney really began training seriously for the mile until their senior years. Yet, I now have a runner—Charles Sitton—whom I've been training for the mile since he has been a freshman.

In the case of sprinters one has to play it by ear and watch the development to determine the extent to which the athlete should extend himself. In conclusion I would say there is no rule of thumb for adequate development of a young track star. It varies for different individuals.

Upstate expansion boosts indoor stock

NYSST/Indoor Review

The NY City metropolitan area, mainly through the use of the State Armory for championship meets, has always had the finest indoor track program in the nation. Upstaters--some of them--had something called "winter" track, in which small-scale programs in a few cities resulted in mediocre performances, with rare exceptions.

Well, some still call it winter track, but upstaters have developed their indoor program enormously in all areas. The new Intersectional boosted interest by establishing goals to strive for and by creating more sectional competition.

There are now more meets in more places with more participants from more schools than ever before.

This resulted in great statewide depth and produced the finest indoor campaign in many years.

If you ran a 6.5 60 you're

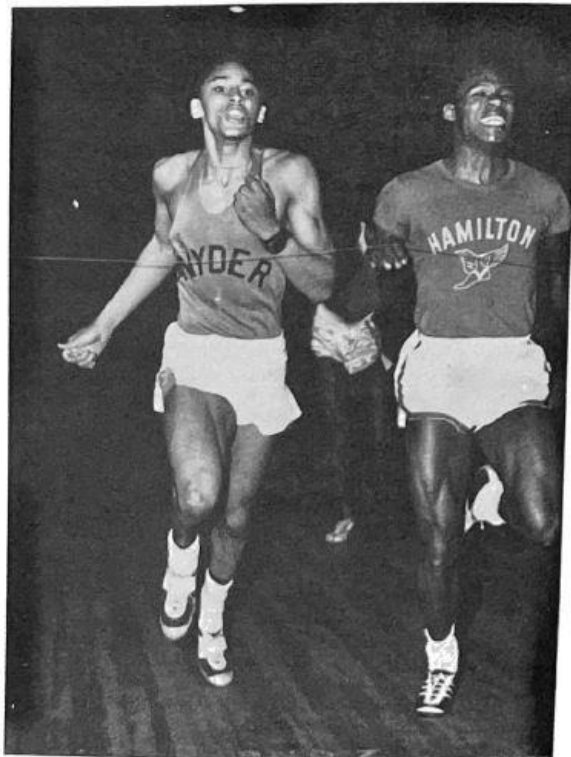
good, but don't get too excited. At least 27 sprinters ran 6.5 or faster, many with the aid of spikes and/or blocks. They were led by Berner's Dave Meyer, the Intersectional champion whose 6.2 in Nassau tied the state record. He also led the 100 with a 9.8, which equaled the nat'l flat-floor record set in 1956.

Bill Graba's I-S(Uniondale) 31.7 added glamor to a lackluster 300, and Robert Cox(Hamilton) was superb with a national-ranking 49.8(440) and Eastern 600 win in 1:13.5.

Boys' Bill Dabney, a junior, led the 880(1:55.2) and took the Easterns 1,000 in 2:13.8 for a state junior record. He was given a great

supporting cast: five others did better than 2:17 and altogether 20 broke 2:20.

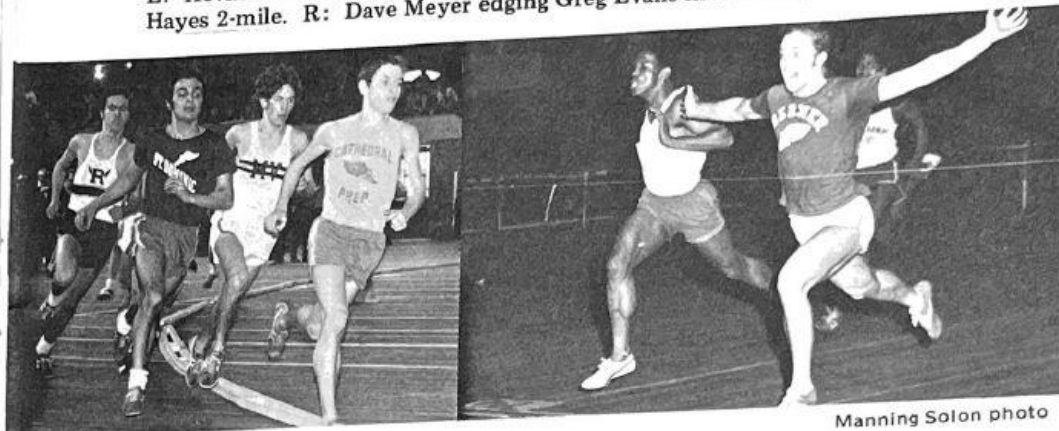
The distances were excellent as 34 athletes bettered 4:30 in the mile and 10 broke 9:30 in the two-mile. The CHSAA trio of Matt Centrowitz-Kevin McCarey-Mike Brown led the mile, while McCarey-Brown-Cent. led the deuce

The top mark was McCarey's 9:09.6 2-mile, a state record in a runaway Easterns win.

Harold Schwab of Centereach was clearly the state's top hurdler, losing only once all season and clocking 7.2 over four flights. Madison's Ron Smith ran 7.3 to tie the PSAL mark, and Ketchum's Gary Dellarocco, the I-S winner, led the five-flighters with 7.5.

The field events were marked by expanded competition in the long and triple jumps and vault, held in the Armory(twice) for the first time. Most of the weightmen were consistent while most of the high jumpers were not. The top mark was Fred Rom's(Chaminade) nationally-ranked 6-7½.

It was Boys in the sprint relays and LaSalle in the distance. The Kangaroos clocked 1:32.2(880) and 3:24.9(mile), the former with a half-stacked foursome. LaSalle's 7:56 led the 2-mile and its 10:25.2 set a national DMR record in that seldom-run indoor event.

Centrowitz and Meyer, both juniors, were named the top athletes by a four-judge panel. On a 10-8-6-4-3-2-1 basis, the results were: C & M (36); McCarey(21); Schwab(17); Dabney(14); Cox and Brown(6).

Centrowitz posted eight major victories in four different events. Meyer ran unbeaten, save a loss in the 300, not his specialty.

Boys, the PSAL champ, was the top team. Power and Molloy of the CHSAA were next followed by a strong upstate trio of CBA(Syr), ST.Joe & Colonie.

St. Joe's does it all over harrier trails

There, St. Joe's captured the Eastern title and added a five-man total time record (12:53.5 ave.) in the Christian Bros. meet at the season's end, an effort that placed them high in the all-time annals of outstanding teams in the state. They were led by four all-staters.

It was also a season in which Hamilton's Kevin McLee won seven major titles including the State Class C, losing only once all year—to Jersey Mike Butynes in the Easterns. McLee's best at Van Cortlandt was 12:39, which tied him for 12th on the all-time list at the heavily-traveled park. He topped the all-state team which, in addition to SJ's Alex Trammell, included Dave Billings of Nyack, Matt Centrowitz of Power, Tom Cappelluzzo of Berner, Brian Tolvanen of Pt. Jefferson and Kevin McCarey of Cathedral. Billings was the only one to run undefeated; unfortunately, he ran in a "slow" section of the Easterns. Centrowitz was the only junior.

The talent was very deep last fall. Four athletes who bettered 12:50 at VCP, two State runnersup and a harrier who holds four course records comprise the second team. Aquinas, which ran in the shadow of St. Joe's quite often, is the second-ranked team ahead of Power Memorial, which capitalized on injuries to Farrell and Loughlin to win another CHSAA championship. The Panthers loss to SJ in the Easterns has been its only setback in three years. Parochial schools gained 12 of the

Extraordinary season on tap for '73

NYSST/'73 Preview

The 1973 season will be an extraordinary one for scholastic track in NY State. Never before have so many athletes returned with such impressive credentials.

The most prominent returnee is Farmingdale's Jay Meisler, whose 7-0 leap led the nation's high jumpers last year. The interscholastic record of 7-1½ is within his reach. Another youngster seeking a national mark will be Bill Dabney of Boys in the 880. His best was 1:51.8 last year, and his immediate goal will be a state record, no small task.

Somewhat overshadowed last year was Power's Matt Centrowitz, junior class mile(4:13) recordholder who had been headed for the 4:08 vicinity before a six-week illness took the steam out of him. Matt may be pressed for mile supremacy by four others from the Catholic schools ranks, including the rapidly-developing Chris Horton of upstate McQuaid Jesuit. And one can only wonder what Mapham's young Mark Belger could do in the mile. He posted a state soph (and world age 15!) record of 1:53.6 in the 880 last spring.

The state's leading sprinters are back, in Berner's Dave Meyer, who ran 9.7 and won the Intersectional title despite a gnawing leg injury; and Willie Smith of Uniondale and Jerry Russell of Lafayette (Bklyn), a pair of 9.7 sophs.

Boys' Royd Lake will be searching for 47-point in the 440. Tony Basile (CBA, Syr) will seek to duplicate the feats of a recent Syracuse all-star, Don Brown, '71 Easterns champ. Basile's teammate, Ken Moliski, an Intersectional medalist, tops the returning 2-miles with a 9:24.8 best.

New Dorp's Bill Jankunis is the leading hurdler, whether he runs the highs, lows or intermediates.

Ithaca's Dave Pitzer has his eye on 15-0 in the vault. Jim Tate (23-4/45-4½) is back for Uniondale, and four 46-footers will add lustre to the TJ, which was dismal in '72. Joe Kessell of Levittown is the class of the weights (57-6/163-4).

The relays will be wide open, and some of the top all-around teams will be Bklyn Tech, Molloy, Farrell, Mapham, Colonie and CBA (Syr). Imagine a true State Meet in '73 with all of the talent competing!

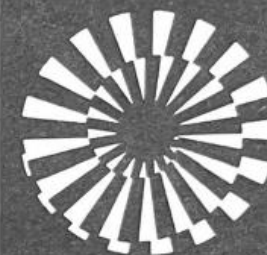

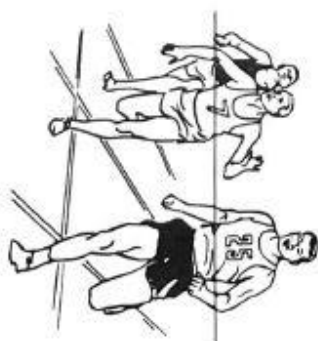
