

Track YEARBOOK Scholastic NEW YORK STATE

FOREWORD: This is sort of a Tenth Anniversary Issue for me. The first Yearbook was the 1966 edition. But I say "sort of" because that one really should have been dated 1967, having been sold during that year.
It covered the '66 season,
A wealth of local track & field history is found

on its pages. It was the year of The Star: Julio Meade, Mark Ferrell, James Jackson, Otis Hill; and, of The Star Teams: White Plains had NY's greatest team ever while Boys and Jackson, rated 2nd and 3rd, also were among the area's all-time great squads. From this group came national records in the 880. mile and two-mile relays plus a host of other scorch-

ing performances.
From outside this exclusive club was Al Pearman of Roosevelt(LI), hailed then as Athlete-of-the-Year. Pearman flirted with 7,000 points in the decathlon and had also won All-American status in football and

and had also won All-American status in football and wrestling. He went to a fine university but was never heard from, athletically, again.

My fondest menory was my first Golden West trip, when I first covered the meet as a 19-year-old reporter for the NY papers. We--six athletes, three coaches amyself--got to the Coast three days before the meet and packed ourselves into a rented station wagon to the gorgeous countryside. One of the athletes was larry James, who went on to considerably outshine his aforementioned colleagues.

That edition sold only a few hundred copies. But I was delighted to have done it, and I was also naive, thinking that future sales would be, perhaps, into the thousands. There are roughly 1,000 high schools in the state, with maybe 40,000-plus competing in track and cross-country, I figured. Surely, a big chunk of this group--not to mention the coaches--would be willing to spend 2 buck for all this great would be willing to spend a Duck for all this great stuff packed into one, handy little booklet, Wrong. Sure, the Yearbook's sales grew to a mark of around 2,000, where it has stayed for the past few years. That's why my enthusiasm has been dampened. Comment about the publications has always been positive, even laudatomy Yet, when approached in person or by mail.

about the publications has always been positive, even laudatory. Yet, when approached in person or by mail, most of the market is not interested. I've come to realize, now, that I'm dealing only with a kind of hardcore track man(woman), one who waits amdously for this Yearbook to come out each fall.

You see, if sales were, say, 7- or 8-thousand, the size of this Yearbook could be doubled to include a score of features, expanded stats and photos of everyone. Even the defunct Newsletter could be reborn to really do the job. But what's the pointy When this

really do the job. But what's the point's When this Yearbook is peddled at meets in the fall and winter, most coaches and athletes will still pass it by to spend a buck on a hot dog and a soda.

CHANGES: There are very few differences between last year's edition and this one. The yearly lists have been expanded—from 50 to 60 outdoors and 20 to 25 indoors. Next year, 75 and 30 are the goals. The girls section has more than doubled. There are a few mas advertisers to replace those that left including advertisers to replace those that left including two organizations that never paid their bills. The price(at meets) is still \$1.00, as it was in '66. The \$2 mail price also is the same, but mail orders are not sent first-class anymore.

STATISTICAL EXPLANATION: No need to delineate the generally accepted policies regarding acceptable performances, wind-readings, class status, track regulations and league rules. Some points germaine to certain sections are listed there. It must be noted though that the absense of a wind gauge again ruined a record for a top athlete. This is deplorable. The big meets in this state that use a gauge -- and have reliable persons working them -- can be counted on one hand. Get smart, already.

Track is a very tough sport, but Mr. Bohlinger made it enjoyable for the athletes, which is what really counts for a coach. He was the type of guy you'd really want to bust your rear-end for...! would give away both of my legs to have done what Mr. Bohlinger did for track and for his athletes."

### Reavis up. UD & AWAY

Even with shot-gun shot putting and very high high jumping, the moment that should have been filmed for presentation in every gym class in the state was the scene at the finish of the 10,000-meter walk in the

AAU Junior Nationals in Knoxville.
The early arrivals for the start of the second day's events were treated to an exhuberant show by two 17-year-old New York schoolboys, Steve Casarella of White Plains and Jim Murchie of Pt. Washington. Way ahead of the rest of the field, and with spots on the U.S. team assured, the pair obviously tried to tie as they entered Tennemee's Tom Black Stadium for the last 300 yards.

They crossed the wire together -- but not holding ands, as they would have liked, in deference to the rules. They embraced wildly, almost unaware of the spectator applause that greeted their victory. It was a welcome outburst on all counts for an event that embodies the amateur spirit but that has generally

been held in low esteem in the U.S.

It was the third year in a row that Murchie had
qualified for the U.S.-Russian Junior dual meet. Again
he placed third behind the Soviets in the Lincoln, match while Casarella took fourth. Murchie was headed for Rice while Casarella was to be a West Pointer; their efforts probably will inspire greater walk

success in the state, although only a few suburban NY City counties offer the event. The major achievements for the 1975 campaign in New York belong to Athletes-of-The-Fear Rudy Reavis(New Rochelle) and Robert Will(Lymbrock), the first fieldmen to be so honored since Mt. Vernon triple jumper men to be so honored since Mt. Vernon triple jumper Ken McBryde got the award for his '71 season, Perhaps Reavis, at Illinois, and Will, at Auburn(where he joins '74 champ Willie Smith), will match McBryde's college success at Manhattan, Baldwinsville's Don Paige, tops on the track, had an equally dazuling

spring till setbacks in post-season invitationals. Reavis(high jump), Will(shot put) and Casarella (mile walk) are the only new state recordholders in standard events. Eight other class records were broken in a variety of events.

In terms of best-in-show luster, the '75 season may not have been on a par with the previous two campaigns. However, depth in virtually all events never was greater. And, with all of the top juniors and a crop of talented newcomers barely into their teens, the 1976 Olympic Year looks like a hot one.

Among the administrative developments was the establishment of a championship meet for the state's catholic schools. It was a big success in its first year, on the Mt.Pleasant track in Schenectady, alyear, on the actreasant track in consenectary, ar-though some schools could not participate because of commitments to the Intersectionals being held the same day in Morrisville. One of the spring's biggest disappointments was the rain that almost ruined the Eastern States meet. Forced to completion on a second day, a week later, the meet's entry was diluted, and so were the performances. Otherwise, the weather here

was pretty good.
The girls' program continued to blossom with their first intersectional meet plus the wonderful Colgate series. (The girls season is analyzed elsewhere.) Following is an event-by-event rundown of the '75 campaign with some things to look for in 1976:

SPRINTS: The fastest time in the 100 was only 9.6, and that was done but once, but the groundwork was laid for a crackerjack year in '76, Lillo Thomas of Brooklyn's Jefferson was the 9.6 man, and he's back along with 20 other dashmen, including 7 '75 sopks and a pair of tough freshmen Never before have so many youngsters run so fast; those 27 others all broke 10 flat.

Thomas, a great prospect with a somewhat unorthodox style, recorded that 9.6 in the Eddy meet. In the Eddy heats, Thomas' teammate, Frank Moss, who went on to win the NY City PSAL crown(9.8), hit 9.7 along with Hackley's Warren Mathews. Other 9.7's bealong with Mark Holmes of Amityville, Maverly Atkins of Riverhead, the Suffolk champ; Keith Broughton of Williamsville North, the State Intersectional win-ner; Mark Rushmore of Glen Gove, the Nassau victor; and Ian Barrimund of Edison, 3rd in the FSAL after

a 9.7. heat.
All but Mathews and Atkins are back this year... not to mention New Rochelle's Steve Strothers, 9.8, the Eastern champ and Intersectional runnerup, Freshmen Jerry Blow(Clarkstown South) and Earl McNeil(Loughlin) continued their indoor success. Elow ran a windy 9.8 and a legit 9.9, taking second in the Easterns. McNeil won the NYC Youth Games in 9.9 and was to compete in the Nationals in Ft. Worth at press time in mid-August.

Thomas was better in the 220, running 21.1 in the PSAL to rank among the nation's top juniors. He added a 20.8 in the Junior Met AAU--that lost record consideration to the absense of a wind gauge. The mark would have broken national junior-class and age-16 records. Look for Thomas to challenge the national mark of 20.6 now shared by five sprinters (including Willie Smith). Atkins had a dual-meet 21.4 and won the Intersectionals. Lincoln's Rich Jones was runnerup to Thomas in the Loucks and FSAL(21.5) races. Sophs Steve Skinner(Jackson) and Strothers had 21.8 and 21.9, respectively while Broughton's best was 22.1. Add the record of 75 runners clocking 22.5 or faster.

QUARTER-MILE: Ken Carter of South Shore and Joe Morris of New Hyde Park dominated the event, and it took the Goldem West meet 3,000 miles from home to bring them together in a race for the first time. Carter was sectogether in a race for the first time, carter was second in the long jump) ond in 48,2(after another second in the long jump) while Morris, after running even with the leaders, finished fifth in 48,9. The previous week Carter had won the Senior Met title in 48,1 while Morris clocked best of 47.4 for meters in the Knoxville Junior meet. a meas of 47.4 for meters in the knowlile Junior meet. Carter also won at Englewood (48.3), Eddy (48.4), Boro (49.8) and FSAL(48.9) meets, Morris broke 48.0 at the Loucks (47.8) and Nassau(47.9) events and took the Inter-sectionals in 48.3. Add a 48.5(48.3h) Easterns triumph for Carter.

Thirty runners broke 50 flat and 10 are back this year, including the entire Mt.Vermon mile relay, led by Walt Kirkland, 48.9 from the blocks. Gerry Martori of St.Francis won the GNSAA(49.6), while Chaminade soph Ed Kane took the State Catholics (50.3).

HALF-MILE: With no Mark Belger to lead them around, it was a fluctuating year for the state's two-lappers. There were more of them running faster than ever as There were more of them running faster than ever as 10 bettered 1:58 and altogether 77 were under 1:58. The fastest of the lot was Wingate's Sam Sawney, who won a quick Eddy half in 1:51.5. But he was not the best. That accolade belonged, as expected, to Don Falge of Baldwinsville, the national indoor 1:000 leader. Besides dominating the action in the Central NY area, Paige was second(to Bill Martin of Mass.) in 1:52 at Loucks as part of an 880/mile double and a double-winner in the States with a 1:52.9 clocking.

The same double attempts were too presumptuous in the I Nationals and Golden West with a 1:51.8 runnerup in the latter his best mark. That anticipated 1:50 just could not surface for the Villanova-bound youth. Fordham's Jim Diffienso, Long Island's Big Three and a probable '76 Olympian added to the 880 heroics, Difienso won the City(1:53.6) and State Catholic(1:53.6) titles after a 1:52.9 runnerup(again Martin won) in the NY Relays. The Olympic contender is Ramon Severing of Westington. a Dominican Republic mative, who the Nr Nelays, The Clympic Contents Is naminated and no of Washington, a Dominican Republic native, who will be back this year after a junior year in which he he ran 1/53,4(beind Sawney) at Eddy and won the PSAL(1/54) and Esatern(1/54,2) titles). The LI trio of Ron Stafford(Maria Regina), Rich Degnan(Trinity) and Chris Henessey(Uniondale) ran virtually the same and Chris Henessey(Uniondais) ran virtually the same times as they did as juniors when they had Selger to do the work for them. Stafford was the most consistent of the group, although he tasted gold only once (Sec-tional) while hitting his best behind Falge and Martin at Loucks(1:52.5). Degman had a sportty spring, while Henessey posted wins in the South Shore, Massau and Hartford meets. Besides Severino, six others under his oome back, including Mt. Vernon's Dave Washington, who twice ran 1:53.4. A promising newcomer is North Rockland frosh Bob Frice, 1:59 from the blocks and

NILE: Paige was the big name here too, although his top mark of 4:11.1 only knocked a few ticks from his '74 best. That mark was the second part of his State double. Paige also won the Penn Relays (4:13.9 in the rain) and Loucks (4:12) events.

Depth was the keynote. A record 32 runners broke 4:20, while 60th place went to 4:23.2 and another 16 were under 4:25, including Amtyville frosh Reynolds Hawkins at 4:24.5. And sandwiched between 4:17 and

4:21 were six sophs and ten juniors who offer great promise for '76. The hottest action this year should be provided by Fower's Maurice Weaver and Loughlin's Luis Ostolozaga, who hooked up in several key indoor and outdoor events. Weaver had a bunch of '75 victories, including the NY Relays in 4:13.5, while Ostolozaga had runnerup 4:14.3's in NY Relays and Loucks. Weaver will have the tradition of Matt Centrowitz and Tony Colon in the shadows this sprins. Tony Colon in the shadows this spring.
George Vogel of North Salem, 4:11.5 in '74, never

really put it together last year, with 4:16.8's at Hartford (2nd) and Eddy (won it). Mahopac's Erich Komdat was an upset Easterns victor (4:15.6), by a step over Edison's Jon Williams, a 4:14.8 best. St.An-thony's Fete Crooke won the LIAC mile in 4:14.2. The hottest soph was Valley's Dave O'Conor, 4:17.8 to win the unseeded section at Morrisville and take

third overall.

TWO-MILE: The top nine runners all ran their fastest times before mid-May--on successive weekends at the Fenn Relays, NY Relays and Loucks Games. And not one of them won anything, except Mepham's Gary Lindquist, NY victor at 9:11.4, But that wasn't his best time. Crooke(9:05), Weaver(9:05.4-junior record) and CBA's Dave Dobrzynski(9:07.6) were 3rd, 4th and 5th at Loucks, while a whole bunch hung on to a snappy pace at Penn, won by Virginia's George Watts(9:02), who

went on to run 8:51 in June. Priedfeld beat Dobrzynski, 9:11.6 to 9:13 in the States while Ostolozaga(9:25,2) and Williams(9:22.2) won respective NY City Catholle and Public schools titles. Cathedral's Brendon Sheeby won a slow State Catholic race in 9:30. Weaver got outkicked by Jersey's Sal Vega in the Easterns, 9:18.4 to 9:19.8.

Weaver may be one of the best in the country this year. Another top returnee is Steve Martinez of Commack South, 3rd in the Intersectionals in 9:14.4 and the LIAC winner at 9:16.2. Hawkins slaughtered the frosh standard with a 9:27.2 and had two other races in the low 9:30's.

OTHER DISTANCE: Interest is increasing in the steeple-chase, although many "steeples" are contested without

the water jump. John McNulty(Nanuet), Jim Leary(New Rochelle) and Jim Shields(Chaminade) were 2nd, 3rd and 4th at Loucks behind Jersey's Marty Ludwikowski. Leary and Shields are back along with McNulty's teammate, Bret Watzka, fourth at Loucks. Shields came back to win the CHSAA title and hit a class standard of 9123 in a recordbreaking Junior AAU race that saw another junior, John Gustafson of Eugene, Ore(where else?) seash the U.S. standard with a 9:06.4 run.
Post-season meets provided opportunities beyond two

miles for some runners. Most notable was a 14:03.6 runnerup by Dobrzynski in the Golden West, the best mark ever recorded by a NYer in a high school 3M race. Weaver notched another junior standard with a 14:27.2/ 3M/5000M effort in Knoxville. Lindquist(15:02.4) and Friedfeld(15:27.8) also ran in what probably was the finest teenage distance field ever assembled.

WALKS: Besides the aforementioned Knoxville duel, asarella and Murchie matched strides in the Loucks mile with Casarella the victor in 7:02.9 to break Murchie's state record. The mark also was hailed as a national record; however, there are two or three marks just under 7:00 that have been reported by schoolboys. Casarella also won the Westchester County (7:23.7), Section-class(7:21.7) and Section One(7:22.2) races to enjoy the kind of season Murchie had as a soph. Loughlin's Faul Andrews, third at Loucks won the Junior Met two-mile(16:07.8) and Eastern Junior 5000M(25:09.4), beating Murchie by two yards.

HURDIES: Six runners at 14.0 or faster is a new highs standard for NY. The 13.9's were provided by Bklyn Tech's Mark Hurst in the arly-season West NY Relays and Plainedge's Larry Duttweiler in the Nassau County champs. The 14-flat men were more consistent as Mike Willis of Ketcham posted that mark three times and Wills of Ketcham posted that mark three times and won the Fenn Relays and Intersectional events. Nanuet's Don Berich was the Eastern runnerup: Midwood's Randy Clark, the Eddy champ, was the FSAL winner(over Hurst); Mepham Junior John Kowalsky followed Duttweiller in Massau...Clark shared intermediate honors with Mike Murphy of St.John the Baptist. They traded wins early in the spring before finding success separately that led to a Golden West showdown at the 440 distance.

But the normally clutch Clark stumbled and didn't finished while Murphy grabbed third in 54.1. There were four others at 38.2--including unbeaten Intersectional champ Willis -- in a solid year that saw the soph standard lowered to 39.2 by Mike White of Washingtonville. It took a mark of under 40 flat to make the state's top 30 for '75.

FIELD: The season was carried, so to speak, by Rudy Reavis of New Rochelle in the high jump and Robert Will of Lymbrook in the shot put. They could not separated for Athlete-Of-The-Year honors, as both had their shortcomings: Reavis in the early-season

had their shortcomings. Reavis in the early-season and Will in the post-season. Reavis leaped 7 feet or higher five times outdoors Reavis leaped 7 feet or higher five times outdoors and was the leading contender for Track & Field News 1st-team All-American. He had four "7's" in a row, after a 7-1 in the Nay Big Five. 7-0 in the States and Easterns. 7-1 to win the Juniors and 7-1 to lose on misses in the International. The latter two efforts found him beating rival Tim Walker of Rhode Island, who still ended up with a lopsided record over Reavis. Rudy also was a weak fourth in the Russian dual at 6-8. A strong 7+ win there might have propelled him over Will for state honors.

Will made a mess of local shot records. He upped the match mark by almost two feet with his Easterns

the state mark by almost two feet with his Easterns triumph at 67-6 3/4, putting him firmly into the number-2 spot in the U.S. behind California's Dave Kurrasch, who beat him with the 16-pounder in Knoxwille, will had eight other victories over 64 feet, and half of those were over 65-0. The only other prep to beat him outdoors was Brad Vassar of Calif. in the

Golden West.

Golden West, All things considered the high jump was the state's top event for 1975, Rome's Kevin Parker, at 6-11, was the nation's top junior. Columbus Mel Hubbard, the PSAL champ, reached 6-10. There were two more at 6-9, another pair at 6-8 and an incredible total of 22 jumpers at 6-6 or higher. Just four years ago only eight athletes cleared 6-6 with no one exceeding 6-8, The only other shot man over 60' was Molloy's Rich Stuart, and he only did it once, in the Colonial Relays in the City of the colonial Relays in the Virginia, Stuart was a weak third in the City Cath-olics behind Spellman's Robert Young and junior teammate Steve Voda, but he returned to win the first State CAS crown. Pt.Richmond junior Jeff Henry annexed the PSAL title. Henry is one of nine juniors over 55' to returned in '76. The discus continued to be a sore to returned in '76. The discus continued to be a sore spot in NY, with only three weightmen over 170', sparked by Will's nationally-ranked 182-8, making him NY's all-time top doubler. Returning this year will be Mike Cordes of Batavia's Notre Dame, who had a Junior best of 175-10 and won the State Catholic gold. Those hoped-for 15-foot yaults never came off, although 13-footers became more familiar-54 of them to

be exact. Three vaulters stood out: Joe Schneider of St. John The Baptist, Gary Haff of Quanside and Lance Arietta, a junior from Tappan Zee. All were consistently over 14 feet and had their share of titles. Arily over 14 feet and had their share of titles, Arietta beat Haff(and Arlington's Dan Doyle) on misses in the States and was the Eastern runnerup, giving him ample experience for a shot at the 15-foot club this year. The top mark was a 14-7 for Dave Farmer of Kenmore West, who went unplaced in the States, Strangely, good triple jumpers continue to abound while good long jumpers are as rare as a windgauge at Randalls Island. The three-steppers had four over 48 feet and four more over 47. The most consistent at those distances were Les Gordon of New Rochelle.

at those distances were les Gordon of New Rochelle, Lomnie Smith of Nyack and Luther Williams of Union-dale. Smith, who lost a Loucks 40-102 to the wind, had the best legal mark too, 48-3 3/4. He was hard to beat till Gordon got his number in the States and Taft's Leroy Soloman, the PSAL(48-1) champ, found it in the Easterns. Gordon won at the NY Relays and

Hartford, while Williams won in Massa and the LIAC. Xaverian junior Dom Concilio posted a 198-8 in the rarely-held <u>iavelin</u> and seems almost certain to sur-pass 200 feet in '76.

RELAYS: Look out for Jefferson of Brooklyn in the sprint relays this year. The Orangemen, running with only one senior clocked 41.7 and 1:28 for the 440 and 880 and generally showed beton passing that had about as much finesse as an overweight gymnast. With Lillo Thomas anchoring, the 41.7(in Eddy) was onetenth off Boys High's state mark. But the top 880 mark of 1:27.8 belonged to surprising Wingate, also at Eddy... A better-looking unit with equal potential was the Mt. Vernon mile relay that ran unbeaten,

gobbling up every major title. They were in the 3:18. three times with four juniors and will be seeking at least 3:13 this spring, Only Brookyn Tech, erratic Hempstead and Chaminade were able to break 3:20... Again 20 foursomes broke 8:00 in the 2MR and three Again 20 loursomes broke oldo in the gm and three more were at 8 flat as NY continued to lead all states in that event. McQuaid of Rochester, running balanced, was easily the best, breaking 7:50 twice-at Eddy (7:49.2) and the Intersectionals (7:48.2). The upstaters also won the Easterns in 7:53.4, Queens-Iona in 7:55.8, but their 7:51.2 could get them no better than fourth at the Penn Relays. New Rochelle's 7:50.2 came in their sectional. Loughlin's 7:51.6 took Hartford, in their sectional, Loughlin's 7:51.6 took Martford, and the Lions also won the City Catholics while New Dorp copped the PSAL, Molloy's entire 7:52.8 team is back, as is its 17:50.8 four-mile relay... Bonnor, the Eastern indoor victor, second(10:14.4) and Holy Trinity, which had the early lead, third(10:15.6). One of the year's most thrilling races came in the NY Relays medley as rivals Ostolozaga(Loughlin) and Weaver(Power) again tangled on a one-mile anchor leag Burging from behind. tangled on a one-mile anchor leg. Running from behind, Ostolozaga's time was a bit quicker in a photo-finish won by the leaning Weaver. Both teams clocked 10:17.8. ... The <u>hurdles relays</u> were all Brooklyn Tech with the Engineer trio hitting 43.6 in a record-equalling NY Relays 360 win and 1:01.8 with its Queens-lona four-some in the 480's.

TOP TEAMS: Mt.Vernon High of Westchester has been named NY's top outdoor track & field team for the fifth time in the last nine years, and the 1976 squad appears much stronger with many of the '75 group not yet graduated. The Knights beat rival New Rochelle in league and sectional competition. Dave Rider(Head Coach) and Bob Brooke(Asst) had deep strength in the sprints, hurdles, middle distance, jumps and weights, and versatility was the key with several athletes capable in a number of events. The Knights pride and joy was the all-junior, unbeaten mile relay foursome of Kirkland, Johnson, Garrett and Washington.

Runnerup New Rochelle--which had much more than the sensational Reavis--took the big hardware with team victories in the Nanuet, Loucks, Hartford, Easterns and Intersectionals, Well-balanced Power Memorial and Brooklyn Tech, the respective NY City Catholic and Public Schools champs, are third and fourth. Nanuet, which had to tackle Mt. Vernon and New Rochelle in many places, to tackle Mr. vernon and New Mochelle in many places, ranks fifth, Nassau champ Uniondale, with several stars, gains sixth while edging nearby Chaminade of Mineola, victor in the LI Catholics, the toughest "little" league in the state. Suffolk's St.Anthony's, second in that meet and very well-rounded, is eighth followed by Archbishop Molloy, whose general success made up for its weak city-champs showing. Almost the entire Stanners team is back in '76. Sneaky Mepham, which edged Union-dale in the South Shore, completes the top ten.

Nanuet, ranked third in cross-country(to Magnus and Greece-Arcadia) and second indoors(to New Rochelle). is the overall Top Team for the full school year.

Rather, the selections are based on the level of accomplishment; victories, competitive record, consistency, outstanding marks, with emphasis on league championship meets. Generally, dual meets receive little emphasis.



PROCRESS: It didn't take long at all for Girls HS
track to make it in New York State. Once the machinery
got rolling, things fell into place, and the girls

The most significant "first" for the girls last year

Newspaper coverage around the state was quite good, even though the boys Intersectional was being held the same day to Norrisville. in Morrisville.

As with the boys, only member schools can compete, leaving out New York City athletes. But the City got their own version of a sophisticated "champlonship". It was the Colgate program—a comprehensive series of indoor meets leading to finals at Madison Square warden; and then an outdoor relay carnival in the spring, New, high-caliber facilities at Pratt Institute in Brooklyn are expected to be used for the '76 program. The Colgate series was also significant in that it was broken up into age groups, starting with grade school, to encourage pre-teens to enter the sport. Fred Thompson, coach of the Atoms Track Club, was instrumental in getting it off the ground.

#### GIRLS = BOYS?

An attempt to create parity in New York State for boys and girls scholastic track and field perticipa-tion-and thereby head off future claims of descrimination--reached a temporary impasse last spring.
according to the state's leading track officials.
The area of conflict involves the number of events

in a track meet in which an individual can compete. Girls, who follow AAU rules, are allowed to compete in any four events in the same meet. Boys, whose rules are under the State Education Department, can take part in only two events. It is feared that, ultimately, the participatory distinctions could be tested in court by dissident athletes.

Edwin E. Kehe, the NYSPHSAA boys chairman, said last February (1975) that the SE.D. was to consider approval on a recommendation by the Track Committee to enable boys to compete in three events. The move was seen as boys to compete in three events, he move was seen at both expansion of the boys' program and a gesture of compromise in the conflict. However, girls chair-woman Louise Tricard vigorously defended the rules of her division and said a compromise seemed diff-

of her division and said a compromise seemed difficult. In July Kehe said that a settlement was expected for the coming(75-76) year.

"There is more to a participation rule," says Kehe, "than physical capability. It is important that as many kids on a team play as meaningful a role as possible." A move to four events, contends Kehe, "would take a scoring role away from many youngsters."

strongly against liberalizing such regulations. Many of them were reluctant when a two-event "experiment

of them were reluctant when a two-event "experiment was passed two years ago.
"We(the girls coaches) shift the girls around tremendously," said Tricard. She said that "almost 100%" of her fellow coaches, according to a survey taken in 1974, support the girls four-event standard.
Moreover, Tricard offered several reasons for the continuation of that standard consistency with col-lege programs and with high school programs in other states; effective utilization of teams with few mem-

states effective utilization of teams with few members; teaching of unfamiliar events to nitherto uninformed firls; and evidence of physical stamina. The rules conflict surfaced when the S.E.D. required, in deference to the expansion of girls' athletics, that "any rules governing sports--unless there is some justification to the contrary--must be the same for boys and girls."

The S.E.D.'s Division of Physical and Health Education

tion is in the process of establishing guidelines for the implementation of proposals made to it by its various sports committees. The guidelines, according to Kehe, will be broad, authorizing the committees to devise specific regulations.

The New York City public and parochial school leagues also follow rules handed down by the SED.






