

## **8 MEET MARKS SET** IN SCHOOL GAMES

lock for second position among the high schools with 11 tallies each, while Mercersburg Academy of Mercersburg, Pa., was the prep runner-up with 20. Drake Prep of Manhattan was third with 18 credits.

The pair of defending individual champions who were defeated were Jerome Keating and Arthur Willis, both of St. John's Prep of Danvers. Keating finished a disappointing fifth in the 880-yard run, an event which found Edward Donovan of St. Benedict's snapping the worsted in the time of 1:59.2 for a meet record. Donovan, who beat his closest rival, Edward Dunham of St. John's Prep of Brooklyn, by six yards, bettered the 1935 mark of 1:59.6 recorded by another St. Benedict's

recorded by another St. Benedict's boy, Al Frey.

The other Massachusetts boy, Willis, lost his crown after a thrilling duel with John Quigley of De La Salle Institute of Manhattan in the 220-yard dash. The victor in this event also came through for a new meet record, slamming around the boards in the excellent clocking of 0:23.7 to beat Willis's 1936 record of 0:23.8.

#### Only Double Winner

Quigley, incidentally, was the only double winner of the day. The De la Salle lad also showed his heels to the field in the 60-yard dash. The watches were stopped at 0:00.6 as Quigley outran John Liuzzi of Christian Brothers Academy of Syracuse. Quigley was one-tenth of a second back of matching the 0:06.5 showing of Jack White of Mercersburg in 1934 and that of

Vincent Healey of St. Benedict's, who made the same time in 1935.

Only one performer repeated his 1936 triumph during the meet. That distinction was gained by Joseph McCort of La Salle Academy of Manhattan, McCort threw into the discard his own record of 5 feet 11% inches for the supplied high jury high inches. inches for the running high jump when he retained his title with a leap of 6 feet 1½ inches.

The high school mile run was easily the stand-out event of the card, and MacMitchell, in racing to victory, defeated his old rival, Bradley Rendell of Falconer High of New York.

Content to stay at Rendell's heels for the greater part of the jaunt, the long striding MacMitchell put the pressure on Rendell with four laps to go. He then proceeded to win as he pleased, the margin being sixty yards.

## National Interscholastics

A pair of national indoor records and victories by both individual defending champions highlighted the 30th annual AAU Interscholastic Track and Field Championships, held on Madison Square Garden's 160-yard board track on Saturday, February 23.

Archbishop Molloy won the team title with 13 points, as defending champion Plainfield (NI) had to settle for a tie for second with New Rochelle (NY).

Molloy's Jim McDermott smashed his own national two miles standard of 9:29.8 which he had set earlier this year by whipping around the 22 laps in a swift 9:23.5. 2d, 3d, and 4th finishers also broke the old mark.

In the 440, defending champion Tim Johnson of Rindge Tech (Cambridge, Mass.) shattered the 24-year-old meet record of 50.1 with a new national indoor mark of 49.6. The old record of 49.7 was set by Don Payne in 1962.

Del Benjamin of La Salle successfully defended his high jump crown by

leaping 6'5", an inch below his winning height of 1962.

In the final, Wilson got only an average start, but he proved superior to his rivals in clearing the four 42" hurdles and won a clear decision from Coleman in 7.5. He later said he had feared Coleman the most, and he had been working on the third hurdle in practice during the preceding week.

HIGH JUMP - Frank Costello, who had upset Benjamin in December. did not compete because of an injury. Benjamin cleared all heights, 5'11" through 6'5" on his first jump. Wilson did not miss until 6'5". Smith missed twice each at 6'2", 6'3", and 6'4", while Platt missed twice at 6'3" and 6'4". Pratt was injured and did not jump after 6'2".

#### A brief history of the National High School Track & Field Championships -

From 1927 to 1965, Madison Square Garden, located on 50<sup>th</sup> Street and 8<sup>th</sup> Ave, was the main site for the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) Men's Track & Field Championships. Beginning in 1934, interscholastic high school races became an integral part of the program. They were often held in the morning and afternoon before the senior championships in the evening. This setup allowed young athletes to compete on the iconic 160-yard wooden banked track known as "The Boards", in front of large crowds, blending emerging talent with established stars. Key features were the tight turns and close proximity to fans which created a unique atmosphere that was integral to the history of indoor track at the Garden.

This prestigious meet is considered the lineage of the current Eastern States Invitational, the country's oldest *high school only* indoor track meet. Referred to as the "National Interscholastic Indoor Track & Field Championships" at the time, it was primarily a prestigious East Coast event drawing top talent, rather than a recognized national championship consistent with a national scope in the modern sense. With that said, in the 32-year history of the meet it was only in that first year, 1934, that it was referred to as the Eastern Interscholastic Indoor Track & Field Championships. From 1935 to 1965 it was billed as the AAU National Indoor Interscholastic Track & Field Championships. The meet remained at the Garden until 1965, after which the AAU moved its national championships to various locations. In 1966, the high school competition was rebranded as The Eastern States Indoor Track & Field Championships and moved to the 168th Street Armory in the Washington Heights section of Manhattan. Additional information about the Eastern States Championships can be found at sitrackblog.com and jacobbrown.com.

The next step towards a national meet was the Pathmark National Scholastic Classic, which took place at Jadwin Gym at Princeton University in 1984. Again, with a few exceptions, competitors were primarily from high schools in the northeast. The meet moved frequently in its early years, including stops at Yale University, the Naval Academy, Syracuse University, and Boston.

In 1999, the event moved to Ohio State and became known as the Nike Indoor Classic. This marked the beginning of a long association with major sponsors like Nike and the National Scholastic Athletics Foundation (NSAF), which helped formalize a national championship structure.

In the early 2000s, multiple national level meets emerged, often due to changes in sponsorship and organization. The National Scholastic Indoor Championships (NSIC), Nike Indoor Nationals (NIN), New Balance Nationals Indoor and Adidas Track Nationals have also become premier high school indoor championship events, leading to several high-level meets in a single season.

The NSAF has been organizing high school indoor nationals since 1984. It's hard to untangle the history of indoor national meets, however, a well-researched attempt is also found on <a href="mailto:sjtrackblog.com">sjtrackblog.com</a>.

Today's structure means high school track and field athletes have multiple opportunities to compete against top talent nationwide at different sponsored events, each offering a claim to a "national" title, but none are part of a unified, officially sanctioned championship under a single national governing body.

*Madison Square Garden legacy* — "The Garden", also known as "The World's Most Famous Arena", was a central venue for high school indoor track and field for decades. While it is not the location of the *modern era* (post-1980s), more formalized national championships, its history is deeply intertwined with the development of high school indoor track in the United States.

- **1934** The Eastern Interscholastic Indoor Track & Field Championships are held the day before the National AAU Championships. More than 1,000 athletes from 45 prep and high schools competed in 13 events. Team title goes to Mercersburg who take home the Governor Lehman Trophy. Manhattan Prep and Haaren tie for 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Attendance: 2,500
- **1935** For the first time the high school games are billed as the National AAU Interscholastic Indoor Track & Field Championships. The high school races take place on the same day as the open races. Schools were divided into high school and prep divisions. The two divisions would unite again in 1955. Future Olympian and sports broadcaster, Marty Glickman of James Madison HS (Brooklyn), wins the 60y Dash. High School Team Champion: Utrecht. Prep School Team Champion: St. Benedicts.
- **1936** Vincent Braun of St. Benedict's (Newark NJ) runs one of the fastest indoor schoolboy miles ever with a winning time of 4:25.7. High School Team Champion: Evander Childs. Prep School Team Champion: St. John's (Danvers Mass.).
- 1937 Five thousand spectators. Highlighted winners were Leslie McMitchell (George Washington) who won the mile in 4:23.6 and the 1000y winner, Phil Liebowitz (James Madison) who clocked 2:22.4, breaking McMitchell's record set the previous year. Johnny Quigley of De La Salle Institute was the only double winner, taking the 60-yard dash in 0:06.6 then taking the 220-yard 0.23.7 High School Team Champion: Evander Childs. Prep School Team Champion: St. John's (Danvers Mass.).
- **1938** Leslie MacMitchell (George Washington) won his third crown in as many years at the fifth annual national AAU high and prep school championships. A crowd of 5000 watched the 17-year-old New Yorker race to a new record in the 880-yard-high school event in the superb time of 1:58 and became the first schoolboy runner to win three national AAU championships, and at different distances. In 1937 he won the mile in a record smashing clocking of 4:23.6 and in 1936 he took the 1000-yard title in the record time of 2:22.9. High School Team Champion: Overbrook (Phil. PA) Prep School Team Champion: De La Salle Institute (Manhattan NY).
- **1939** A gathering of 3,000 thrilled to the superb performances of Johnny Quigley (De La Salle Institute) and Carmen Bova (Seton Hall, NJ). Quigley's time of 50.1 seconds in the quarter-mile run was just five tenths (0.5) off the indoor world record. Bova took the mile run in 4:22.0, the fastest ever run by a schoolboy on a NYC track. High School Team Champion: Evander Childs. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep (So. Orange NJ).
- **1940** CHSAA Indoor City Champion Bishop Loughlin and their coach, George Eastment, won their first national team title, taking home the Mayor Fiorello H. Laguardia Trophy. Seton Hall scored in eight of ten events to win Prep school champion honors and retain the Governor Herbert H. Lehman Trophy. Lou Colado (Seton Hall) was named outstanding individual by writers covering the meet for his prep half mile crown in the record time of 1:58.0. High School Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep.
- **1941** Seton Hall wins their third consecutive prep team title scoring in nine of ten events. Anthony Luciano (Seton Hall) was named outstanding individual performer by the attending sportswriters and given a gold wristwatch. Luciano won the prep half mile in 1:57.6, a new meet record. High School Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep (So. Orange NJ).
- **1942** The fastest mile ever run indoors by a schoolboy was unfolded by Frank Dixon of St. Francis Prep. He was clocked in the superb time of 4:20.7 as he captured the prep mile. Sportswriters voted him winner of the AAU Meritorious Award, a gold watch. High School Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep(So. Orange NJ).

- **1943** The outstanding individual performance of the day was turned in by prep school athlete Charles F. Ash of the Hill School (Pottstown, PA). Ash won three events, the 60-yard-high hurdles in 8.6 seconds, the broad jump with a leap of 20 feet 8 inches and the high jump clearing the bar at 5 feet 8 inches to receive the Millrose AA Award, a gold watch, as the top individual. High School Team Champion: New Utrecht. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep (So. Orange NJ).
- **1944** Maurice Brewton was the meets sole two-time winner, capturing the high jump and long jump, but William F. Porter got the gold watch for the meets outstanding performer by taking first place in the 60-yard dash and finishing second in the 60-yard-high hurdles. High School Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin. Prep School Team Champion: Mercersburg.
- 1945 A crowd of 5,000 spectators watched William Mathis (Cardozo Senior HS, Washington DC) defend his title by defeating heavily favored Perry Samuels (Thomas Jefferson, San Antonio TX) in the 60-yard dash while establishing a meet record of 6.3 seconds. Ed Poreda (La Salle Military Academy, Long Island) won the prep division 880 (2:00.6) and mile (4:42.9) races. Mathis and Poreda received gold watches presented by the Millrose AA for exceptional performances in the HS and Prep divisions. 108 schools and 1280 athletes participated. High School Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin. Prep School Team Champion: The Hill School (Pottstown, PA).
- **1946** –1,300 athletes and 104 schools participated. Phillip Thigpen, a Seton Hall senior, was the only double winner, taking the prep school half-mile mile runs. Thigpen also anchored Seton Hall's mile relay team to a third-place finish. High School Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin. Prep School Team Champion: Mercersburg (PA).
- **1947** –With 19-year-old Charlie Slade capturing four firsts and Philip Thigpen triumphing in two, Seton Hall Prep's trackmen easily carried off top honors in the prep division of the national AAU schoolboy track & field championships. High School Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep (So. Orange NJ).
- 1948 As expected, individual laurels in the meet were taken by 20-year-old, 185-pound Charley Slade of Seton Hall. He was crowned champion in the Running Broad Jump, High Jump and 440-yard dash. High School Team Champion: Boys High. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep (So. Orange NJ).
- 1949 –Officials announced a record 153 schools had sent athletes to the to the interscholastic championships. Olympic Decathlon champion Bob Mathias from Tulare, Calif., but currently attending Kiski Prep (Saltsburg PA), won the prep division 60-yard-high hurdles and runner-up in the long jump and high jump competitions. 20-year-old Carl Joyce, of Seton Hall Prep, won the half mile and mile races in meet record times. In the half mile he clocked 1;56.9 and later covered the mile in 4:22.0. Joyce won the meritorious performance prize awarded by the Millrose Athletic Association. High School Team Champion: Boys High. Prep School Team Champion: Seton Hall Prep (W. Orange NJ).
- **1950** John Meader of the Hill School (Pottstown, PA) was the meets lone twin victor capturing the prep 440- and 880-yard events. High School Team Champion: Boys High. Prep School Champion: Mercersburg (PA).
- 1951 Representatives from 78 high schools and 21 prep schools from as far north as Canada and as far south as Washington turned out for the eighteenth annual national AAU interscholastic track and field championships. Al Schoenig of Manual Training High was time in 2:17.5 over 1000 yards, a new meet record. Bob Rittenburg of Boston Latin was victorious in the 60-yard-high hurdles and tied for first in the high jump. High School Team Champion: Boston Trades (MA). Prep School Team Champion: Mercersburg (PA).

- **1952** Don Philpott of Montclair won the high school mile in 4:23.5. Milton Campbell of Plainfield High accounted for the meets only twin victory when he captured the high hurdles and high jump. Six prep schools from Canada participated at the championships. High School Team Champion: Plainfield (NJ) Prep School Team Champion: Lawrenceville (NJ).
- 1953 Milton Campell from Plainfield High School, who finished second to Bob Mathias in last summer's Olympic Decathlon in Helsinki, provided the programs highlight as he paced his team to victory for the second straight year in the high school division of the national interscholastic track and field championships at Madison Square Garden. High School Team Champion: Plainfield (NJ) Prep School Team Champions: Lawrenceville (NJ).
- 1954 Gerald Knapp led Blair Academy to the prep team title. He won the broad jump and shot-put, tied for second in the high jump and was the leadoff man on a Blair team that was runner-up in the six-lap relay. High school entrants were only allowed to engage in one running and one field event but Mike Caraftis of Port Jefferson won the 1000-yard run in 2:16.3 for a new meet record. Phil Reavis of Somerville High (Mass.) leaped 6 feet and 3% inches to set a new mark in the high jump. High School Team Champion: Boys High. Prep School Tean Champion: Blair Academy (Blairstown NJ).
- **1955** Prep and high school teams are reunited into one division. Lincoln High (Jersey City) sheds 3.6 seconds off the previous meet record for the Mile Relay, uncorking a scintillating 3:24.4. Their performance is considered the best ever for a US public high school. Team Champion: Rindge Technical (Cambridge MA).
- **1956** Montclair (NJ) High School won its first national interscholastic track & field championship. Reggie Sheppard took the high jump; Al Phillips took the 60-yard dash and Ray Spivey was first in the 60-yard-high hurdles. Joe Marchioni (LaSalle MA) set a national interscholastic record heaving a 12lb shot put 59 feet 11<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inches. Team Champion: Montclair (NJ).
- 1957 Fordham Prep's Tommy Carroll wins the 1,000-yard run by twenty yards, clocking 2:15.1. *Carroll set three five records in 1957: Indoor 880 (1:54.9), Indoor 1000 (2:15.1), Outdoor 880 (1:50.6), Outdoor 800m (1:49.2) and Outdoor 1000m (2:25.5). He also had a 4:13.1 mile to his credit.* One of the fastest among the preps is Ray Ratkowski of St. Francis Prep. Last year he was the CHSAA 220y champion and ran on the winning mile and 2-mile relays team at the Penn Relays. This year he won the 600 in the Mayor's meet in 1:14.0, the second fastest time in schoolboy history. In the Nationals he ran one of the fastest 440's by any indoor prep clocking 50.2. In the CHSAA Intersectionals he dropped down to 50y winning that in 5.7. Athletes representing 131 schools competed, including a few from Canada. Team Champion:— St. Francis Prep.
- 1958 Three championship records by Tom Laris of George Washington in the Mile, John Thomas of Rindge Tech, Cambridge Mass., in the high jump a foursome from Roman Catholic High of Philadelphia in the two-mile relay headlined the twenty-fifth annual National Amateur Athletic Union High and Prep Track & Field Championships. Team Champion: St. Francis Prep.
- 1959 Robert Mack of Weequahic High in Newark, John Reilly of Mount St. Michael High in the Bronx, and William Shippen of Lower Merion High (PA), posted standout performances. Mack took the mile in 4:22.6, Reilly won the 1000-yard run in 2:16.1 and Shippen tied the meet record, 6.3 seconds, in the 60-yard dash. There was a three-way tie at 6 feet 1¼ inches between Kevin O'Brien (Belmont, MA), Neil Conover (Great Neck South, LI) and Richard Ross (Montclair, NJ) 129 schools from six states competed. Team Champion: Boys High.

- **1960** Tyrone Pannell of Bishop Loughlin won the final event on the program, the 60-yard-high hurdles, propelling his team to the front of the national scholastic track picture for the first time since 1947. St. Francis Prep of Brooklyn, NY won the two-mile relay with a record time of 8:02.0 The time is believed to be the fastest ever run by a high school team indoors. Team Champion: Bishop Loughlin.
- **1961** Wingate captured the national interscholastic indoor track and field championship on the strength of two first place finishes, giving them ten points, one more than the favorite Franklin D. Lane. Molloy's Tom Farrell, unbeaten during the season, took the 1000 in 2:16.1. (Farrell would represent the United States at two Olympic Games: Tokyo in 1964 where he finished 5<sup>th</sup> in the 800m and Mexico City in 1968 where he came home with Olympic Bronze in the 800m). Paul Anthony, the PSAL champion, won the 60-yard dash, tying the meet record of 6.2 seconds. Dennis Edgehill, Joe Matthews, Willie White, and Cal Evans triumphed in the 1000-yard relay. Team Champion: Wingate.
- 1962 Coach Marshall Brown's Plainfield (NJ) High captured the team title with 11½ points and Gene Tetreault of Hartford High set the only meet record. Del Benjamin leaped 6 feet 75% inches to capture the high jump and tie the national record for sophomores. Team Champion: Plainfield (NJ).
- **1963** Molloy's Jim McDermott smashed his own national two-mile standard record running 9:23.5. Tim Johnson of Rindge Tech (Cambridge MA) set a national indoor record of 49.6 in the 440 and Del Benjamin successfully defended his high jump crown. Team Champion: Archbishop Molloy.
- **1964** Archbishop Molloy successfully defends their national title led by Pete Farrell who establishes a new meet record of 2:14.5 in the 1000-yard run. Charles Messenger (Kenwood MD) takes the two-mile covering the distance in a meet record time of 9:10.6. Bill McClellon (Clinton) and Carl Dawkins (Sommerville MA) tie for first in the high jump, each leaping 6 feet 7 inches. Team Champion: Archbishop Molloy.
- 1965 Bill McClellon (Clinton) cleared 6 feet 10 inches erasing the meet record set in 1958 by his idol John Thomas (Rindge Tech). McClellon is unbeaten in 20 consecutive schoolboy contests. Sixteen-year-old Arthur Dulong (Randolph MA) led from start to finish in the two-mile clocking 9:08.7, almost two seconds faster than the meet record set a year earlier by Charles Messenger of Kenwood MD. Wingate set a new mile relay standard with their 3:23.4. Team Champion: Boys High.
