This is the final edition of the CHSAA Newsletter, for this year that is. My feelings are mixed about bringing it to an end. I'll be relieved to get away from the typewriter and deadlines for a while, yet I will miss the meets and all the great people I met during the year. That is one of the biggest benefits I have gotten from writing the newsletter- getting the chance to know the athletes and coaches. Of course, that benefit would go for naught if I did not enjoy the writing the way I do.

I guess it would be an understatement to say that the newsletter has come a long way. It started back in September, that rainy Saturday morning at Bear Mountain. I sold seven copies that day.

Now, nine months and 125 subscribers later, the newsletter is well known within the league and serves a real purpose. Needless to say, it makes me feel good to know I am doing something to help out coaches and athletes.

The first edition of the 1974-75 season will be out in early October, and will carry the results of the initial cross-country meets. Pretty much the same format will be employed next year, unless I can scheme up some super plan over the summer.

Next year, I hope to increase my circulation (of my newsletter not of my blood). This can be accomplished if the coaches could mention it to their athletes. I find a lot of athletes aren't aware of my work, even though their coach subscribes. I will probably send subscription blanks to the school in September to remind you.

I am looking forward to next year. Just looking over the performance lists I am amazed at the number of juniors at the top. Next season should be a hot one! I consider myself lucky to be in the position to report about it.

Still needed are the following results: Freshman CHSAA Champs (very important. As soon as possible!!); Novice CHSAA Champs (hurry, quick); Junior Midget CHSAA Champs; CHSAA Coaches Relays. ...I could not attend the AAU Senior Mets, but I will mention some outstanding results I saw in the paper- Al Paris (Loughlin) running for the NYAC, placed fourth in the 880 in 1:53.6. This moves him up to third on the year's listing in that event. Former Xavierian steepler, Steve Keating (St. John Univ), placed 2nd to former Power runner, Joe Barbary, in the steeplechase. Times were 9:21.8 for Joe, 9:29.6 for Steve. Paul Kaftanski running for the New York A.C. placed 4th in 9:49.8. Holy Cross pole vaulter represented the NYAC and did 13' (4th). State recordholder in the javelin while at Molloy, Steve Francks, threw 228-10 for 3rd. Bill Bakewicz, former Xavierian, throwing the discus for the NYAC did 138-11 for 3rd. In 4th place is listed only Wallace 126'06. I'd like to know if that was Dan Wallace from Spellman. John Schilling jumped to victory with 6-6. Tom Picarella got 4th. Any other athlete who competed for a CHSAA school and competed in the Sr. Mets, I will need your performance. Perhaps his coach could get in touch with me....

CHSAA CHAMPS, MAY 31 at RANDALL'S ISLAND, JUNE 1 at MT ST MICHAEL HS-
The league championship meet was highlighted by surprises and upsets.

The most prominent of the surprises was the appearance of some upstate schools on the field of competition. It seems that the ruling committee of the league decided to include some six schools from upstate to compete in a meet that traditionally pitted only the schools from the NYC area and Nassau-Suffolk against each other.

Most notable among the upsets was Xaverian High School's triumph in the team standings, dethroning Archbishop Molloy after a three year reign. The final score of 35 to 32½ was deceptively close. The outcome was known with three events to go.

Xaverian staged an awesome display of talent and depth (particularly in the sprints) in the track events on Saturday, while Molloy suffered a few disappointments on the field the day previous.

Leading Xaverian were their only individual champions, Harry Gaffney and Joe Duncan. Gaffney circled the track to win by a half second over Chaminade's Brian Fitzpatrick in the 440- 49.2. Duncan ripped over the barriers in the 330IH with ease and hit the tape with arms raised in victory. He won over Mike Murphy (St. John) 39.4 to 39.9.

Ever since Loughlin senior Paul Kaftanski turned his interests to steeplechasing, he has run with amazing success. Here he hurdled his way to victory in the 1½ mile event with a time of 7:31.8. Paul took over half way through the race and pounded out a big lead. Down the last stretch, he had enough left to hold off a late charge by Jim Shields of Chaminade who captured second-9:35

Rarely does a sophomore win the honor of being crowned league champ in his event, but then Power's Maurice Weaver is no ordinary soph. The long-legged runner took the pace with teammate Brian Johnston, and the two looked as if they planned to make it a Power sweep. On the last

lap, however, junior Ed Gardner (St. John Baptist) made his move. He passed Weaver on the backstretch, and on the final turn it was these two all alone fighting it out! Weaver's kick proved more potent though, he strided away to victory in the last 30 yards. He was timed in 4:17.5 to Gardner's 4:18.3. Johnston held on for 3rd- 4:19.8.

Right after the mile, a clash of two outstanding athletes took place in the two-mile. From the onset, Gene McCarthy (All Hallows) and Mark Ogden (Molloy) made it clear it would be a two man race to the tape. The two passed the mile in 4:35.8 with Ogden slightly in the lead. On the last lap, McCarthy surged to the lead and opened a gap. Ogden came back though, but Gene was not to be denied in his last chance for a league title. He hit the tape in 9:11.7 to Mark's 9:16.5.

In the early morning, it was raining and overcast, yet, that was when the sprints took place. Willie Sutton successfully defended his indoor title in the 100 by zipping to a 10.4 victory here. In the 220, Chaminade versatile sprinter, Tony Green, blasted a talented field running away in 22.8. Cosmo Santullo (Iona) and Power's Greg Little followed in 23.1.

Two juniors from Holy Trinity triumphed in their respective events. Mike Nieminski boasted a healthy lead over Xaverian's Bruce Gunderson in the 120HH- 15.1 to 15.3. Rich Degnan left a stacked field of half-milers behind with his strong finish. Degnan clocked 1:53.7 followed by John Daly (Farrell) 1:54.3, Ron Safford (Regina) 1:55.0 and John Sierra (DuBois) 1:55.4.

In the 2-MR, Loughlin, led by fine legs by Al Paris (1:55.4) and Chris Scotto DiVetta (1:55.9), won in 7:57.6. Mile relay fell to Msgr Farrell-3:27.1; 880R to Maria Regina (1:33.0) and the 440R was won by St. Anthony's in 45.3.

CHSAA CHAMPS CONTINUED- In the field, Joe Dombrowski(Holy Cross) turned the tables on Molloy jumper John Schilling. The Holy Cross senior cleared 6-6 with no misses at any height. Schilling also cleared 6-6 but with some misses on the way.

Jim Kenny(Holy Cross) was the top league athlete in the pole vault, but J. DeMaria(CBA) was the winner. Both jumpers cleared 13-6. League pole vaulters are showing great improvement this season. On this day, seven bettered 12-6. Jim Weaver(Holy Trinity) placed 3rd at 13-0 and Paul Jirak(Molloy) also did 13'. Over 12-6 were Des McGlade(Iona), Ron DiMicelli(Columbia), Jerry Sullivan(Sacred Heart).

In the triple jump, John Serkes, who also placed 3rd in the long jump, jumped 45-7½ for a meet record. These two efforts earned him the outstanding athlete award of the meet.

Frank Navetta moved further up the all-time discus list with his victory toss of 163-2 here. Xaverian scored their only points in the field through the efforts of Bill Bakewicz. He took second in the discus with a 159-5½ fling.

Junior Alberto Valdespino of LaSalle unleashed a superlative 184'1" throw, to win the javelin. Russ Savage of Cardinal Spellman supplied the excitement in the event. On his last throw, Savage got off a good one that sailed past Valdespino's marker. The great momentum from the throw, however, drew the big thrower over the line for a foul!! Senior from Farrell placed 3rd behind Savage's 178-10.

Bob Young outdistanced the two Molloy shot putters, and in effect also helped Xaverian to a title. The broad-shouldered Spellman junior uncorked a 58-4½ put. The two Molloy men were over 58' also. Frank Navetta threw 58-2 and Rick Staurt laid claim to 3rd with his 58-3¼ heave.

Joel Baskerville(Iona) bounced off the board to the longest jump in the league this season. He won the long jump with a 22-1 3/4. St. Francis Prep junior, James Kandora, placed second with 21-10 3/4.

EASTERN STATE CHAMPS, JUNE 5- RANDALL'S ISLAND-Two CHSAA records fell in this meeting of top athletes from neighboring states.

The first record was claimed by Joe Duncan of Xaverian in the 330IH, fulfilling his hope expressed in last edition. After running 39.2 in the heats, the senior really moved out in the finals. He took every hurdle in stride and just won 3rd place at the tape. Joe won 3rd in 39.6- 3-tenths under the record!

After long jumping 21-6½, John Serkes asserted himself in the Triple Jump with a league record and 2nd place. The Holy Trinity senior extended his long legs 47' into the pit, bettering the record by 5".

John Daly came the closest of all leaguers to a victory. The Farrell runner battled Don Lapp(Coatesville, Pa) right down to the wire in the half-mile, and some thought Daly had won it. The officials thought otherwise and unbelievably gave John a time one-tenth slower-1:54.8 to 1:54.9. Rich Degnan(Trinity) who led for a short while off the last turn, came up with 5th in 1:55.5.

Gene McCarthy(All Hall) once again made Mephram's Mark Belger sweat it out in the mile. Belger took it out too quickly, passing the 440 in 57. and the 880 in 2:02! On the last lap, McCarthy passed Belger but was caught again on the backstretch. Gene came back near the finish, but it was too late. Still, he got 3rd in 4:13.3 to Belger's 4:12.2.

Molloy's Gary Contoy couldn't hold on to Mike Hagon's(Suffern) pace in the 2-Mile, but he did win a convincing 2nd place in 9:20.8.

In the 880 relay, the familiar line-up of Chuck Smith, Dan Boesch, Joel Baskerville and Cosmo Santullo, for Iona Prep, placed 5th in the finals with a league topper-1:30.0. Snyder won the event in 1:28.2.

In the shot put, Bob Young(Spellman) popped a fantastic effort. He pushed the ball 60-6 3/4 away to capture 3rd. This is the 5th best throw ever in the league, and he's only a junior!!!!

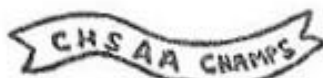
